

## Remembering Willis (Will) Lee Bennett

July 17, 1936 - November 24, 2010

On November 24, 2010, our community lost an important. innovative and involved voice who was fearless in his support and involvement in the LGBT community at a time when most people were still very closeted.

Born in Oakland, Will lived for a while in San Diego working in Rally Racing and automobile time trials, but ultimately, his heart and his work centered around Sacramento.

One of the first **Emergency Medical** Technicians (EMT) in California, he founded and ran Foothill Ambulance Co. for many years.

An expert in mechanics and electronics, when Will met his husband, Robert Bequette, a computer programmer, their synergy, energy and money benefitted the GLBT community as they founded and ran Acropolis, the first online GLBT bulletin board in Sacramento. He also produced the cable television show, Being Gay Today, which ran for 20 vears in Sacramento. providing a voice and a format for GLBT issues which was years ahead of its time.

Will served for several years on the Board of Directors for the Lambda Community Fund and was President of the Board for a term.

Until two years ago when ill health curtailed his activities. Will and Robert were familiar figures at every GLBT event as they shot footage at celebrations, demonstrations, commemorations and any and all events that documented the history of

Will and Robert were among the first to become Domestic Partners when the legislature created the venue. That wasn't enough for Will, though, who was always a fighter for civil rights and social justice for the GLBT community. In September of 2003, Will and Robert, along with Laurie McBride and Donna Yutzy, journeyed to Victoria, British Colombia and both couples were legally married on September 22 of that year.

Will is survived by his husband,



### **FAIR Education Act Introduced in CA Senate**

enator Mark Leno has introduced legislation that helps address the nation's bullying crisis by ensuring that historical contributions of LGBT people are accurately and fairly portrayed in instructional materials in California schools.

Senate Bill 48, known as the FAIR (Fair, Accurate, Inclusive and Respectful) Education Act, adds the LGBT community to the existing list of under-represented cultural and ethnic groups already listed in the state's inclusionary education requirements.

"Most textbooks don't include any historical information about the LGBT movement, which has great significance to both California and U.S. history," said Senator Leno (D-San Francisco). "Our collective silence on this issue perpetuates

negative stereotypes of LGBT people and leads to increased bullying of young people. We can't simultaneously tell youth that it's OK to be yourself and live an honest, open life when we aren't even teaching students about historical LGBT figures or the LGBT equal rights movement."

Research indicates that bullying rates are double in schools where students do not learn about the contributions of LGBT Americans. Students in schools with inclusive education also report that all youth

In addition to including the role and contributions of LGBT Americans in educational materials, SB 48 adds sexual orientation to the state's existing anti-discrimination protections that prohibit bias in school activities, instruction and instructional materials.

The bill is co-sponsored by Equality California and the Gay-Straight Alliance Network and was introduced on Monday, Dec. 13,

The bill would also prohibit the State Board of Education from adopting instructional materials that discriminate on the basis of sexual orientation or gender identity.

Who won? To my hearing (via radio), it's hard to imagine that any judge's inclination on the merits of whether Prop 8 is constitutional was altered by the arguments they heard. The argument may have had a bigger impact on how the court will rule (or defer ruling) on standing than on their view of the merits.

Judges Reinhardt, Hawkins and Smith peppered both sides with sharp questions, and both sides acquitted themselves well.

On the standing point, the plaintiffs' lawyers acknowledged that Judge Walker's injunction would apply to only the two county clerks named as defendants, leaving all other county clerks free to deny marriage licenses to samesex couples.

The judges seemed surprised to hear this and skeptical about the

California Supreme Court to help resolve the standing question. On the merits, the most

important exchanges related to whether the court could determine the constitutionality of only Prop 8, that is, without reaching the question of whether bars to same-sex marriage in other states would be unconstitutional.

Asked that direct question of whether the court could avoid ruling as to other states, Ted Olson said "yes," although he added that the decision he wanted would be on broader grounds. If I had to bet on the merits, my money would be on a decision

## Man Infected With HIV Said to Be Cured with Stem Cell Transplant

octors who carried out a stem cell transplant on an HIV-infected man with leukaemia in 2007 say they now believe the man to have been cured of his HIV infection as a result of the treatment, which introduced stem cells which happened to be resistant to HIV infection.

The man received bone marrow from a donor who had natural resistance to HIV infection; this was due to a genetic profile which led to the CCR5 co-receptor being absent from his cells. The most common variety of HIV uses CCR5 as its 'docking station,' attaching to it in order to enter and infect CD4 cells, and people with this mutation are almost completely protected against infection.

The case was first reported at the 2008 Conference on Retroviruses and Opportunistic Infections in Boston, and Berlin doctors subsequently published a detailed case history in the *New England Journal of Medicine* in February 2009.

The 'Berlin patient' is an HIV-positive man who developed acute myeloid leukemia, received successful treatment and subsequently experienced a relapse in 2007 that required a transplant of stem cells.

Doctors chose stem cells from an

individual who had an unusual genetic profile: a mutation inherited from both parents that resulted in CD4 cells that lacked the CCR5 receptor. This mutation, called CCR5 delta 32 homozygosity, is present in less than one percent of Caucasians in northern and western Europe, and is associated

with a reduced risk of becoming

infected with HIV.

Antiretroviral therapy was halted on the day of the transplant, and the patient had to receive a second stem cell transplant 13 days after the first one, due to a further relapse of leukemia. The patient continued to receive immunosuppressive treatment to prevent rejection for 38 months, and at 5, 24 and 29 months post-transplant colon biopsies were taken to investigate possible graft-versus-host disease in the intestine.

At each investigation additional samples were taken to check for signs of HIV infection in the

abundant immune cells of the gut wall.

During the 38 month follow-up period the donor CD4 cells repopulated the mucosal immune system of the gut, to such an extent that the frequency of CD4 cells was almost twice as high as in HIV-negative healthy controls, and this phenomenon was also seen in a control group of ten HIV-negative individuals who received stem cell transfers.

The repopulation of CD4 cells was accompanied by the complete disappearance of host CD4 cells, and after two years, the patient had the CD4 count of a healthy adult of the same age.

The patient did not resume antiretroviral therapy after the transplant. Nevertheless, HIV remained undetectable by both viral load testing (RNA) and tests for viral DNA within cells, and HIV antibody levels declined to the point that the patient has no antibody reactivity to HIV core antibodies, and only very low levels of antibodies to the HIV envelope proteins.

### U.S. and South Africa Sign HIV/AIDS Agreement

South Africa's International Relations and Cooperation Minister Maite Nkoana Mashabane have signed a Partnership Framework that will guide future efforts to combat HIV/AIDS in South Africa.

The Partnership Framework under the U.S. President's Emergency Plan for AIDS Relief (PEPFAR) provides a five-year joint strategic plan of cooperation among the Government of South Africa, the U.S. Government and other stakeholders and was signed on Dec. 14.

The Framework supports the goals of South Africa's national strategy to fight HIV/AIDS, while also contributing to PEPFAR's global goals for prevention, care and treatment.

The Framework emphasizes sustainability, local expertise, coordination and accountability in the fight against AIDS.

The PEPFAR Framework will build on existing U.S. support for South Africa's efforts to provide HIV prevention, treatment and care for millions of people in the country.

In 2010 alone, PEPFAR funds have supported treatment for nearly 920,000 adults and children in South Africa, while more than five million South Africans have been tested for HIV and received HIV counseling with U.S. support.

President Barack Obama has made the fight against AIDS a cornerstone of his Global Health Initiative. A key principle of the Initiative is support for country ownership, and through the Partnership Framework, the United States will support South Africa in building the capacity to sustain its progress on HIV/AIDS for the long term.

## *I Am Equal: The Picture Of Equality, Launches in Sacramento*

International fashion photographer Matt Spencer is coming to Sacramento and he wants to take your picture – for the *I Am Equal* project, a recordbreaking photo campaign for human rights and equality in the nation's most diverse city.

At 11:00 a.m. on Thursday, January 6, The Citizen Hotel will open the doors to a free public photo event, where people from all walks of life will step up for human rights and join the global movement for equality.

"It's important that everyone have an opportunity to get a photo and dedicate it to the cause that means the most to them," said Spencer. "Each person has a story to tell and a reason for joining the project; we'll do whatever we can to help them tell that story and inspire change in the world."



## **Lambda Players Premiere a Gay** Man's Trip in *Recovery Mode*

ive years ago, Matthew Crehan Higgins was bored – and horny. He logged into gay.com and within minutes made a date for a late night rendezvous with a hot, closeted bisexual man.



Recovery Mode author and performance artist Matthew Crehan Higgins says that having someone else write about your life is freeing, but also

What should have been a 45-minute hookup (if the guy could last that long) turned into a tumultuous four year relationship, a one man show and now a full-length stage production.

The Lambda Players' Resident Playwright Matthew Burlingame had heard Higgins' one man show on an episode of Cocktails & Creampuffs, an internet podcast he co-hosts from Buffalo, NY. Knowing a good thing when he hears it, Burlingame contacted Higgins to discuss turning the solo show into a full production. Two weeks later, rehearsals began on the newly adapted six-person play Recovery Mode.

"I first heard it last summer and fell in love with it," says Burlingame. "It had everything: comedy, tragedy, diva moments and breakdowns - and Higgins performing it just made it even better."


When Burlingame contacted him about the adaptation, Higgins was thrilled. "It was very unexpected," he explains. "I did Recovery Mode as a spoken word event and made up most of it on the spot, for the purpose of finding out whether I had the material necessary to create a play. After I did it, and then outwordmagazine.com

again after I heard the recording, I felt like the material was there and that it felt good to get it out of my system. ... When the adaptation came up, I felt like I was getting my chance to see Recovery Mode come to life, but in a way that wouldn't take so much out of me."

"Not having an actual script to work from, I spent three days transcribing the audio before I could begin the adaptation," said Burlingame. "But in the end, it helped me get to know the piece, and Matt, even

better."

In *Recovery Mode*, the character of Matt (Michael Hedges), an upwardly-mobile, out gay man, leads zany therapist Susan (Bethany Hidden-Cauley) through his continuous breakups and makeups with his deeply closeted blue-collar, bisexual boyfriend Tom (Steve Thompson.)



The two have nothing in common but each other - and sometimes not even that. Filling out the cast is Matt's college BFF Marc; Sean a one night stand who made him believe in love again; and country bumpkin Adam, whose talent is best left to the imagination. Based on true-life experiences, Recovery Mode is a comedy about getting over Mr. Wrong.

"Recovery Mode is largely about a relationship going bad and the aftermath - it's very much about therapy," said Higgins. "To me, therapy at its best is when that other person puts a mirror up that makes one see not just what happened to them but also how they contributed. Answering those questions, this time to a fellow writer, gave me a chance to see that mirror from a different angle."

Recovery Mode runs Thurs., Fri. and Sat. at 8 p.m., Jan. 6 - Feb. 5, at the Lambda Players Theatre, 1127 21st St. Tickets are \$15, and Thursday nights are "pay-whatyou-can." Reservations can be made at 916-444-8229 or online at lambdaplayers.com






# Cirque Dreams Holidaze Set to Open at Community Center

## The Tourist & How Do You Know

s critics compile their ten-best lists and sing the praises of the award-worthy movies currently in theaters, it's helpful for purposes of contrast to look at the films that had movie fans shaking their heads this holiday season.

Read on for my reviews of two of wonder if the Hollywood Foreign the worst offenders.

### The Tourist

As I write this, the Golden Globe nominations are just out, and Johnny Depp and Angelina Jolie are both nominated for their parts in *The Tourist*, one of the lamest of the big-budget, year-end holiday

**T**f you find yourself in New York City this holiday season, I hope you have time to attend the theater. Read on for my reviews of several fine Broadway shows and one not-so-fine off-Broadway play.

### The Pee-wee Herman Show

Yes, it's true. Pee-wee Herman is back, and he's on Broadway. At 58. you might think that Paul Reubens would be too old to play Pee-wee, but you would be wrong. The ever-young actor can still squeeze himself into that skinny suit, and he still looks boyish enough to get away with lines like, "I know you are, but what am I?'

For his Broadway debut, Pee-wee brought back most of the characters (and many of the original actors) from his classic. Emmy Award-winning, late '80s children's television show. The word of the day is definitely "fun" as Pee-wee and company perform what amounts to an extended episode of *Pee-wee's Playhouse* before an adoring Broadway audience.

The playhouse set is brought to life in stunning day-glo detail on

### Women on the Verge of a **Nervous Breakdown**

This brand new musical is a remake of a classic Spanish film from 1988 that was directed by the great Pedro Almodovar. Reviews for the show have been mixed, but I loved every minute of the movie, and I enjoyed the stage version too.

The movie was not a musical, but it was so colorful and over-thetop that it might as well have been. A tale filled with love, lust and gazpacho, Women on the Verge is about a young woman who is determined to reclaim her

philandering boyfriend, despite the pesky interference of his wife, who is fresh out of a mental hospital and bent on revenge.

Comic chaos is the order of the day, and the musical is a must-see both for its intricate, ambitious, and expensive set design and for its once in a lifetime cast, which includes the great Patti LuPone, Brian Stokes Mitchell, Justin Guarini, Laura Benanti and the excellent Sherie Rene Scott. ### **Bloody, Bloody Andrew Jackson**

I am sorry to report that this sexy, stunning new musical about American politics will close on January 2, 2011, despite the best efforts of its incredibly talented cast and creative team, and despite a galvanizing lead performance by the unbelievably hot young actor, Benjamin Walker.

Walker looks nothing like even a young Andrew Jackson, the seventh president of the United States, but

The creators of Bloody, Bloody Andrew lackson use witty. irreverent lyrics and dialogue, and 'emo' rock-based music, to satirize the political process and history of the U.S., and the dynamite young cast sells the show with a sexy swagger. 

### The Ride

Although not strictly theater, this new bus tour of the Broadway area is so much more inventive than any other bus tour I have been on. that it qualifies as a show. The 75-minute, 4.2 mile "Ride" around the heart of Manhattan – mainly the theater district - is a new and hopefully permanent fixture around Times Square, and it is not to be missed.

To start with, the bus is like nothing you've ever seen, tricked out as it is with a sound system that rivals the power of a nightclub. creators of "The Ride" have also

(There are actually three buses currently running, each at a cost of \$1.3 million.)

The vehicles are the tallest allowed by law, and riders face one side of the bus, which is almost totally transparent, allowing people on the street to see inside, where 40 video screens and 3.000 LED lights illuminate the three rows of stadium seats.

The view of crowded New York City streets from inside this amazing bus would alone be worth the price of admission, but the
