

Illinois Enacts Civil Union Act

overnor Pat Quinn
has signed :-has signed into law the Illinois Religious Freedom and Protection and Civil Union Act, making civil unions available for same-sex couples in Illinois.

The law, drafted by lawyers with the American Civil Liberties Union of Illinois, marks an important step toward fairness for thousands of gay and lesbian couples in Illinois. Illinois now joins a growing list of states across the country that provide legal protections to the unions of same-sex couples.

The new law, signed by the governor on Jan. 31, permits Illinois couples - including those of the same sex - to enter into a legal relationship that provides them all the basic legal protections and responsibilities currently offered only to different-sex couples through marriage.

"Illinois is taking a historic step forward in embracing fairness and



Tebruary is the month of love. Love your partner d − go for walks, read a book or go to a movie together, cook a favorite dinner together, improve the world and volunteer together, worship together!

In a recent worship, we celebrated the 59th wedding anniversary of a special couple in our church community - what a milestone!

Fifty-nine years of love, perseverance, joy, sorrow, trial, challenge, humor and commitment. Anyone who has been married knows that the love and chemistry that brings a couple to wed changes and transforms as the marriage matures.

For most couples, there are times in the marriage where love is a decision – a decision to continue to treat our partner in a loving, caring manner even when we might not feel particularly loving toward him/ her. Marriage vows help us to honor that decision.

Then there are times when we feel so absolutely in love with our partner that we can't imagine life without him/her. Again, because we are committed to honoring our vows, our relationship endures so we can experience those times of

the gathered people their love and commitment for one another, and to promise, with the help of God's Spirit, to be loyal and faithful to each other.



Local Attorney On Mission

acques Whitfield is on a mission. After living most home office and confronted him. The of his life convinced that he could never reveal to the world the person he really was, in 2003, at age 40, he came out as a gay man – changing the lives of his wife and three children forever, but ultimately finding himself.

Now he is on a personal mission to convince his closeted friends that "on the other side of that fence is love, acceptance and completeness."

"Living in the closet was tormenting," he recalls.

Whitfield knew from the time he was seven years old that he was different. Born in New York, he moved as a young child to North Carolina, where his mother's family were pillars of their community with strong roots in the church.

Whitfield's father was from the Caribbean, and Whitfield was raised Roman Catholic; his mother would later become an Evangelical minister. "It took me a while to adopt my Southern heritage," he says. "We were transplants and spent most summers in the east."

He remembers being bullied about being a sissy in junior high PE class. His mother, concerned he was not like his older brother, sent him to stay for a summer with relatives who had a farm, "to toughen me up." "It was a horrible experience."

"My family was not anti-gay," he says. "It was the '70s. My mom was a former model before becoming a minister. I can remember my mom having gay friends. But it was just understood that nobody in my family could be gay. There was an expectation that you would be a God-fearing Catholic, get married, and have kids. Being gay was not an option.

"I knew I was different, whether because of my family, or because I thought I liked boys. I was so overwhelmed by who my family was, the only thing I could do was to retreat into conformity and become an over-achiever."


Whitfield graduated cum laude from Wake Forest University and spent a semester studying at the University de Dijon in France. He graduated with a law degree from the University of North Carolina School of Law in 1988 and joined a corporate law firm in Los Angeles. In L.A. he met someone, and for the first time, tried living as an out gay man. The guy broke his heart. "So I said 'it was just an experiment; I'm not meant to be gay," he says.

He got involved in the church, and a short time later met his future wife, Nikki. "We did everything the right way because we were friends first, then fell in love," he recalls. "When we got married on June 12, 1993, I believed I was getting married for the right reasons." outwordmagazine.com

couple turned to their pastor for help.

For the next four years Whitfield went to reparative therapy, Exodus International at Sunrise Community Church. "I went to individual counseling, therapy, retreats - I tried; Nikki and I both tried," he says.

"Those were the worst periods for

By mid-1996 things had started unraveling, though. He had a son by then, and his daughter was born in 1997. He had moved his young family to Sacramento. "But there was this increasingly overwhelming desire to have a relationship with a man," he says. "I couldn't reconcile the two. That was the part that was absolutely tormenting. I'm not proud to say I had an extra-marital relationship. I went to therapy to deal with it. The therapist said, 'Have you considered the possibility that you are gay?'

"I could not accept that because of my family. I thought the minute I become gay I become a failure. My parents had divorced. When Nikki and I got married we promised we were going to be together."

Then, in November 1999, Nikki found a journal he had left out in his my life and for our marriage, but the best thing that happened to me, because it brought me to the decision point that I am gay, and God made me

One day in 2003 he found the courage to say it out loud for the first time and told Nikki, "I am gay." "She said, 'Thank you'. We cried and laughed. We didn't know what to do because our path is a different one. I think that really saved our friendship, the full disclosure. We realized that we loved our kids. She probably believed more than me that being gay was not bad, just unfortunate that her husband was gay.

guidance. What now? We couldn't find that person, so we did it on our own. We love the kids, love one another, but it's best that we divorce because I love you and you should be with someone who can love you completely. Our lawyer said she had never seen a more amicable divorce. The term we use is 'positive parent partners'. We have good days and bad days, but our children come first."

He speaks with immense pride of his children. His daughter, who is straight, is vice president of the McClatchy High School Gay Straight Alliance. His sons, ages 13 and 10, are both athletes and popular with classmates. "One of the things I like the most is that they defend the rights of others. They don't tolerate others saying disparaging things about other kids; they are very protective. I think that's a credit to how both me and Nikki have raised them."

When he finally came out to his family – the family in which it was understood one could not be gay – it was anticlimatic. "They said, 'We knew; we have always known, and we love you anyway.' I was mad there wasn't more drama. I said why didn't I do this year ago? My whole family was very loving."

And so Whitfield is on a mission. He feels his experiences qualify him to be an ambassador and a bridge to other communities as well. "If I can come out, anyone can come out," he says. "I don't want somebody to have to wait 'til age 40 to come out.

"I have encountered some of my colleagues who are not out, who are African-American, who have high religious and traditional thresholds to overcome. Even though I grew up in church and have been active in church, I was always troubled by how they treated other people. I think God is a God of love and loves everybody. I think that should be the message we give school people, total acceptance and unconditional love.

"I think I can use my voice effectively to encourage others to be involved in the community. It's appalling when you're going to events, and you can count the number of people of color on one hand. We know they are there and have lots to contribute.

"The gay community in Sacramento is absolutely wonderful. They welcomed me with open arms. That's why I am one of its biggest fans. Other communities – New York, Washington, D.C., Atlanta – are different.

Sacramento is so welcoming. I think that we are a unified community. For me as a black, openly gay man, I feel very loved and accepted."

Today, Whitfield is a successful attorney and serves as managing director of Sacramento business consulting firm The Sterling Group Ltd. He served as General Counsel of the Grant Joint Union High School District from 1997 to 2008. He currently serves on the boards of Equality California and CARES and participates in the "Positively Speaking" program, which targets students from kindergarten through university with HIV/AIDS prevention and awareness messages. He is a former president of the Sacramento Gay & Lesbian Center board.

"I think all of us who are active and out have an obligation to do outreach and help people who don't know what's on the other side and to build bridges and start where we are in honesty. Don't be afraid. I don't want somebody to have to wait 'til age 40 to come out.

"My whole life quest was to be authentic. I have found that when people are true to themselves there is a generous response from others; there has to be acceptance."

Transgendered Pianist to Perform with Sacramento Philharmonic

Then Maestro Michael Morgan picks up his baton to lead the Sacramento Philharmonic's next concert, Basically Beethoven, he will also be breaking new ground for the orchestra, welcoming transgendered pianist Sara Davis Buechner as the featured guest artist in a performance of Mozart's Piano Concerto No. 24.

Known for her multifaceted playing power and artistic dexterity, Buechner is the winner of numerous international piano competitions, and her somewhat controversial personal story, as well as its connection to the classical music community at large, has been featured in publications around the world.

Born David Buechner, the pianist knew at an early age that she was different. "On the playground, boys velled 'David's a girl' and I'd think, You got that right," she told the *New* York Times.

In 1998, at the age of 39, Buechner came out as transgendered, causing a mild ripple in the world of classical music, and severely affecting her

As David she was performing upwards of 50 concerts a year, including concerts in New York, Philadelphia, Cleveland and San Francisco. But as Sara, she was unable to get any major bookings. "Apart from local gigs, from 1998 to 2003. I did three to five concerts a year," she told the Times.

A chance encounter with a former Juilliard classmate, Carrie Feiner, helped change that, though. Feiner offered to help her get more bookings, and slowly helped her recapture her former career. With her confidence building, Buechner applied for a professor position with the University of British Columbia, where she was accepted and is now tenured and much sought after by music students.

The position also helped re-launch her career, and today, she is a successful recording artist as well as a soloist and performer with symphonies across North America, including performances with the Buffalo, Oakland and Seattle philharmonics and in Canada with the Calgary, Edmonton, Hamilton, Vancouver, Victoria symphonies and the CBC Radio orchestra. She now is performing in more than 60 concerts a year, more than she did as David.

She was also fortunate, as a Canadian transplant from her home in New York, to be able to marry in 2005 the Japanese woman who had been her translator when she was touring as David in Japan.

Today, her reviews seldom

mention David. "If I changed as a person, I didn't lose my good parts ... my devilish sense of humor, my rakish good looks. I don't think I look 50," she told the Times, with just a bit of a sardonic smile.

Buechner will be performing with The Sacramento Philharmonic Orchestra in their annual tribute to Beethoven. The repertoire, conducted by Maestro Michael Morgan, includes Beethoven's Symphony No. 7, Milhaud's The Creation of the World as well as Mozart's Piano Concerto No. 24.

As part of the Beethoven tribute weekend. Beethoven & Bevond. a family-friendly Target Family Concert matinee will be held on Sunday afternoon, featuring musical and themed activities in the lobby. A performance by the Sacramento Philharmonic Orchestra and B Street Theatre will follow shortly thereafter. Beethoven & Beyond will be free for all children under 12 years old.

The weekend concludes with the Philharmonic's debut performance at




opens its doors for the first time in February.






Oscar Preview Party Sets the Stage for Main Event

extending basic dignity to all couples in our state. We commend Governor Quinn for signing this bill," said John Knight, director of the Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender Project of the ACLU of Illinois.

The measure was first introduced in February of 2007 by then-newly elected Representative Greg Harris.

On December 1 of last year, the Illinois Senate approved the bill 32-24, sending the measure to Governor Quinn. That move came one day after the bill passed in the House by one vote.

This new law reflects the triumph of hope and fairness over distortion and division," said Jill Metz. President of the ACLU of Illinois Board of Directors.

The new law counts Illinois among 17 states, plus the District of Columbia, that recognize some form of protection for committed same-sex couples - from limited

partnership rights through civil unions to marriage.

"Today marks yet another victory in the clear trend line of achieving fairness for families across the country," said James Esseks, Director of the ACLU Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual and Transgender Project.

Although the passage of civil union legislation represents an important step forward on the road toward full equality for LGBT individuals in Illinois, the ACLU continues to work to achieve the freedom to marry for all couples.

"We look forward to the day when Illinois joins other states across the nation by making marriage available for all Illinois citizens," said Colleen Connell, executive director of the ACLU of Illinois. "This new law suggests that the day of complete fairness for lesbian and gay couples is not far away in the Land of Lincoln."

The law takes effect June 1.


Mafia, with a scene from the show featured at the event.
