

Sacramento Valley Veterans To Celebrate End of DADT

on't Ask, Don't Tell," the law that has prohibited lesbian, gay, and bisexual servicemembers from serving openly will officially end on September 20th. To commemorate the occasion, the Sacramento Valley Veterans (SVV), along with LGBT Veterans groups across the country, are hosting celebrations. Sacramento's celebration will take place at Head Hunters and will include the Kennedy Gallery.

SVV is the home of Sacramento's LGBT veterans, servicemembers, and allies, and has been working closely with American Veterans for Equal Rights (AVER), Servicemembers Legal Defense Network (SLDN), and other DADT repeal advocate organizations in the efforts to repeal the policy enacted in 1993.

"After eighteen years, our brothers and sisters in arms will be able to serve their country without having to compromise the military's core value of integrity," said Ty

Redhouse, **SVV** President and USAF veteran, "This celebration marks the end of an era and the start of a new one. From here, we will have a different set of circumstances to address. Though DADT may be on its way

out, the matter of partner benefits and other issues will have to be addressed. SVV will continue to be there for our brave men and women and their loved ones."

The celebration is scheduled to begin at 6 p.m. and will include a singing of the national anthem, which for many LGBT Veterans will have a truer meaning than ever before, photo displays, and presentations from veterans.

The Kennedy Gallery will open their lobby for a DADT-themed display of photographic works by Alex Calder and SVV's own Anthony Loverde who has been involved in the judicial fight to end DADT. Loverde has channeled his photographic experience to raise awareness of DADT's effects on our nation's servicemembers in his photobook, A Silent Force: Men and Women Serving Under Don't Ask, Don't Tell. The gallery display will also feature a timeline of DADT and how it has affected LGBT servicemembers and the military. SVV members will display photos of themselves and invite all veterans to bring in their own photos to add to the Wall of Honor.

Included in the ceremony will be a moment of silence in recognition of LGBT and all servicemembers who have lost their lives in service to our country and for transgender servicemembers who still will not be able to serve openly despite the

repeal of DADT.

The celebration ceremony will be held on the Head Hunters patio, 1930 K Street, and the adjoining Kennedy Gallery, and will start at 6 p.m. with no-host cocktails, light appetizers, and mingling. At about 6:30 p.m., the Sacramento Gay Men's Chorus will perform the national anthem, followed by short presentations by SVV President Ty Redhouse, Anthony Loverde, and other veterans and servicemembers who wish to speak on DADT and its repeal.

> The event is free and open to the public. Cake and ice cream will be served in addition to the military's infamous "bug juice."

We invite Sacramento community to come out for this celebration.

We have waited, watched, and engaged the opponents of military equality; we've pushed back, fought, and prevailed. This is our time to celebrate before we step on the road to a more equal future for our nation's military," said Redhouse, "You can be a part of this momentous occasion in American history."

Party on the Block Supports HIV/AIDS Service Agencies

his year's Sacramento Valley AIDS Run/Walk is planning to party on down the block to help raise funds for HIV/AIDS service agencies in the greater Sacramento area. Run/Walk day is Sunday, Sept. 18 and welcoming ceremonies begin at 8 a.m. at the State Capitol.

As in past years, the main event of the day will be the Run/Walk, where runners who have worked for months gathering pledges of financial support for completing the course, finally get to tie on their tennies and hit the pavement.

Hosted by the Capital City AIDS Fund, SVARW is one of the largest Northern California fundraisers for HIV/AIDS service providers, and helps to keep many of their services available to clients.

"The organizing committee is trying to bring the excitement and fun back into the SVARW, by creating a party that is moving down the block," said Jake Rowe, Event Planner. "This year's event will feature a party feel from the start to the end, while still raising much needed money."

There will also be a Health Fair,

community booths representing many of the AIDS Service Providers, sponsors' tables and live entertainment including two rock bands coming together as one to provide a party atmosphere to help get all the runners and walkers in the zone.

New this year will be a single start time for both the timed run and walk, although they will take separate courses. Runners will line up at the head of the pack for the 8:30 a.m. start time and speed off on the 5K course that many of them will finish in under 25 minutes, with top notch runners trying to best Mario Guerrero's first place time last year of 17:30 minutes!

Following close behind them will be the walkers, many of them representing teams of walkers such

as Target, Sacramento Frontrunners, Wells Fargo, Team CARES, Badlands, Breaking Barriers, TJX, SMUD, Plumbers & Pipefitters, Mercy Hospital and hundreds of individuals who have lost loved ones or had their lives affected by HIV/AIDS.

Big Surprise! Studies Prove Male Bisexuality Exists

wo new studies have shown what many have long understood, that some human males are aroused by both **L** men and women. Both studies refute previous research on male bisexuality.

The first study, entitled Sexual Arousal Patterns of Bisexual Men Revisited was recently published in the journal Biological Psychology.

The study recruited 100 self-professed bisexual, heterosexual and homosexual men. All three groups of the men watched straight and gay sex videos. While watching the videos their genital responses were monitored with sensors. Subjective responses also measured how much the men liked or disliked the videos as they watched them.

The results showed that the bisexual men in the study were physically aroused by videos of men having sex with men and women having sex with women.

The other study, published in Archives of Sexual Behavior last spring, used a slightly different approach to validate the existence of male human bisexuality.

That study of bisexual, heterosexual and homosexual men also monitored the physical and subjective arousal effects from watching adult movies, but it included a movie of men having sex with both a women and another man.

This "bisexual stimuli" as the researchers

rarely behaved bisexually and perhaps identified as bisexual for reasons other than strong arousal to both sexes," the researchers now claim.

The two newer studies used different recruitment criteria to increase the probability of finding men who were bisexually aroused rather than those who identified as being bisexual for other reasons.

These included online recruitment from web sites serving bisexuals. The men in the *Bisexual* Men Revisited study also had to have had sexual relations with two people of each sex as well as have been in a three month relationship with one person of each sex.

The new studies even used the famous 1948 Alfred Kinsey 0-6 scale in their research to help pinpoint and define bisexuality. In that scale, 0 means exclusively heterosexual, 6 exclusively homosexual, with varying degrees of bisexuality in between.

Despite proving that some study participants were in fact bisexual, the researchers believe that there are likely sexual preference variables that

have been populated by men who had never or







called it, depicted a woman and man fondling each other while both fellating another man, vaginal intercourse, and male on male anal intercourse. The movie had a greater arousal effect on the bisexual men than on the heterosexual and homosexual men in the study.

Both of the new studies contradict the findings of similar research which questioned whether some men can be aroused, or turned on, by both sexes. That controversial study, Sexual Arousal Patterns of Bisexual Men was published in 2005.

Michael Bailey, a researcher on that study infamously told the press at the time, "I'm not denying that bisexual behavior exists, but I am saying that in men there's no hint that true bisexual arousal exists."

Many regarded that research as flawed because it may have studied self-professed bisexual male participants who were not actually bisexual. The researchers on that 2005 study, including Michael Bailey, now agree.

"The bisexual samples of previous studies may

go beyond Kinsey's original scale. Yet the new studies still pay homage to Kinsey's landmark research of long ago.

"It appears that some men may identify as bisexual because they are sexually aroused by both sexes, even if they experience considerably more arousal to one sex than the other," the researchers wrote.

The new studies also suggest that bisexual preference variables are within a continuum that may change somewhat depending on time, mood and other circumstances.

"Men with bisexual arousal patterns may experience temporal fluctuations in their attractions and arousal to men and to women," one study concluded. "Thus, a bisexual man may be more aroused by male stimuli at one time point but by female stimuli at another time



LGBT Social Group In Yuba-Sutter Restarting

new group is forming in the Yuba-Sutter area to serve the social and support needs of the Yuba-Sutter LGBT people along with their heterosexual supporters.

Upcoming events will include various socials such as potlucks, dances and movie nights. Support groups for people coming to terms with their sexuality and/or gender identity will be organized as well.

Some events will be open to all ages, some will be open to 18+ and some will be open to 21+. The majority of events will be free to attend.

The effort is being led by community

organizer and YouTube vlogger Jeff Girard. Girard started the first visible and publicly known LGBT group in Yuba-Sutter in 2003 and led it through the end of 2007. That same year, Girard acknowledged for his work by LGBT group Chico I.S.C.C.D. as an "In Honor Of" honoree. Girard then

as a community organizer for the NO on 8 campaign working in Sacramento and San Francisco.

"There is a serious need to start a new LGBT group in Yuba-Sutter," said Girard in a released statement. "As one can verify by an online search, there are presently no visible LGBT groups in the area. What's more, when the major local newspaper publishes news stories or letters to the editor online relevant to the LGBT community, the online comments are overwhelmingly hostile. Additionally, the regions elected officials continue to consistently vote against proequality legislation."

Girard currently lives in his SUV as a

Prop 8 Lead Attorneys Honored by American Bar Association

ttorneys David Boies and Theodore B. Olson, who argued the federal case against Prop 8, have been honored with the most prestigious award in the American legal realm, the American Bar Association Medal.

The American Foundation for Equal Rights' (AFER) brought the two highlyrespected attorneys together in 2009 for the federal case against Proposition 8 (Perry v. Schwarzenegger), which placed a ban on marriage for gay and lesbian Californians.

AFER, Olson and Boies achieved an unprecedented victory for marriage equality

on August 4, 2010, when a U.S. District Court concluded that, "Proposition 8 prevents California from fulfilling its constitutional obligation to provide marriages on an equal basis."

In accepting the honor, David Boies reflected on his role in Perry v Schwarzenegger and noted, "What we've been able to accomplish is based on the

under much more difficult circumstances," and accepted the award on behalf of them.

Boies is the founder and chairman of Boies, Schiller & Flexner LLP. One of the nation's preeminent trial lawyers, he was recently named "Lawyer of the Year" by the National Law Journal and "Commercial

Litigator of the Year" by Who's Who.

Olson is a partner in Gibson, Dunn & Crutcher's D.C. office and is one of the nation's premier appellate and U.S. Supreme Court advocates. The National Law Journal has repeatedly listed him as one of America's Most Influential Lawyers. Last vear, TIME selected both Boies and Olson as



KOLT Run Productions Embraces Its "Fringe" Element

re you ready for some testifyin'? Are you ready for some sermonizin', some evangelizin'? You better get ready, because the Church of the Gay Agenda is comin' to town!

Kelley Ogden and Lisa Thew of the highly acclaimed Sacramento theater company KOLT Run Productions took a week-long vacation recently, returning to their theatrical "home" of Chicago, reconnecting with the theatrical environment where both had studied and trained, and where they met, at The Theatre School at DePaul University.

The two had ʻgrown up" theatrically in Chicago, where Ogden studied commedia dell'arte for two years, performed in the first Chicago Clown Theatre Festival, and worked at Steppenwolf Theatre Company, Royal George Theater and the Illinois Theatre Centre, and where Thew helped found the Chicago Sable Ensemble and played one of her favorite roles, Joyce in *Possible* Worlds, with SlimTack Theatre Company.

"We became sponges – we saw every show we

could see," says Thew, who serves as KOLT Run's artistic director and leading director, of the recent visit. "We reconnected with friends who are now artists in their own rights. It changed us. By the time we left, we knew what we wanted to do."

The two returned to Sacramento with a clear vision for the future of KOLT Run, which has garnered numerous Elly nominations and two Elly awards since its 2007 launch. "We have decided to define ourselves by our commitment to telling stories on the fringe," Thew says, "by telling highly layered stories about people that are in the fringes of society, stories that are not usually told."

Each play in the three-show season – one coming-of-age drama, which opens in February; one dark comedy about horrific parenting and one feminist classic "play with music" – will be risky.

"They are also beautiful in their unusualness; they're provocative," says Ogden, the company's executive director and leading actor. "They push the boundaries of

what you find acceptable and take you out of your comfort zone, hopefully to a place of revolution. It's about exploring some beautiful and ugly truths about who we are in the world."

"We are terrified but excited,"
Thew says. "Which we think means
we are on the right track," Ogden
says. "We have never come from a
place of surety with anything we
have ever done."

In addition to the three plays, the company will also engage in an original, guerrilla theater production that will evolve throughout the year in non-theatrical venues.

Inspiration to create *The Church*

of the Gay Agenda came from the red-state, conservative environments in which both women were born and raised – Houston, Texas, for Ogden; Lincoln, Nebraska, for Thew.

Both grew up around mega churches, in evangelical environments peopled by fire-andbrimstone Pentecostal preachers – "wonderful character studies," Ogden says. "For people who have grown up in churches, churches are inherently theatrical."

The Church of the Gay Agenda also has a mission to "reclaim

religion." During the Proposition 8 campaign, Ogden says, "I kept looking at news stories quoting people saying, 'I am not against gays; this is just what the Bible tells me. I am following my faith.' We got frustrated with this argument because it's been used time and again to keep the 'other' down. What if we reclaim this argument?

"[Openly gay Episcopal Bishop] Gene Robinson says, 'Jesus is the homosexual agenda," Ogden says. "It's not about we don't like heterosexuals; they are the reason we have gay people. We are anti-homophobe. Shame is the Anti-Christ. We hope to have a choir. There will be testifying, exorcism, baptisms. It's just taking a different vocabulary to empower the gay community.

"We have never set out to be gay theater," she continues.

"There are shows in our season that do not touch on gay themes at all. But we think the messages there about people who have been ostracized by society will naturally engage gay audience members as well as straight ones."

uthor Dan Saniski was sitting at his local gay bar several years ago when he noticed a man **L**pacing back and forth past the entrance. The man kept looking inside the bar but would stop just short of entering.

Finally, Saniski called out to him, inviting him in for a drink. With drink in hand, the man explained that he had decided only that morning to finally come out and entering the bar had been his first

Congratulations Mary, you're gay! OK. vou're out. So now what? While there is book after book explaining, analyzing and processing the coming out experience, books that actually provide practical – and easily consumable - information about the gay male culture are far and few between.

Every generation has at least one - in the 1960s/70s it was *The* Homosexual Handbook, the 80s had the *Butch Manual* and the 90s gave us The Unofficial Gay Manual. But where is the modern gay guide to teach the newly out the critical gay social skills as well as help them find their place in the gay social spectrum?

Well, thanks to Saniski, that book will be available in print and eBook formats in September. Titled Ruling With A Sequined Fist, it is Saniski's first book and is a down and dirty reference guide to gay culture, sub and counter cultures, terms, events, groups and icons.


A Trio of Queer DVD's




L.A. Zombie




Leading Ladies

Attack the Block invades the Crest Plus The Help and One Day Reviewed by Chris Narloch

The fall films will be upon us soon enough. Read on for reviews of several late-summer releases and a heads up about a critically acclaimed monster movie from England that will probably be on DVD before too long.

Attack the Block

One never knows how long movies are going to play at the Crest or the Tower. Some titles disappear after a week, and others catch on and play for a month or two. So I know that this movie was scheduled to open at the Crest on September 2, but I have no idea if it will still be playing as you read this.

From the producers of Shaun of the Dead and Hot Fuzz, *Attack the Block* follows a gang of tough inner-city kids who have to defend their turf against an invasion of savage alien creatures, turning a South London apartment complex into an extraterrestrial war zone. Visit www.thecrest.com.

The Help

I tried to fight it, but after about 20 minutes you just have to give up and give in to this undeniably entertaining and moving screen adaptation of the runaway bestseller by Kathryn Stockett.

I have not read the novel, but the movie appears to be very faithful to its source (the author hired a friend to direct), and the casting couldn't be any better.

The great Viola Davis (Doubt) anchors the film with an incredibly poignant portrayal of a domestic servant who tells her story to a young writer (a terrific Emma Stone). The result is a book that lays bare the prejudice in a Southern town in the early 1960s.

Octavia Spencer is as funny as Viola Davis is soulful, playing the other main maid in the movie, and Sissy Spacek and Jessica Chastain are also excellent as the only two white women in the film, besides Stone's character, who aren't racist.

And what about that by-now infamous scene with the chocolate pie? Well, I didn't buy it for a second from a plausibility standpoint, and it takes the story down to a crass level, but it sure does get a reaction from the audience. Talk about a shit-eating grin.

Crazy, Stupid, Love

Emma Stone gives another fine performance in this modest comedy, which has a great cast and some nice twists but ultimately fails because the central love story between the characters played by Steve Carell and Julianne Moore is far less interesting than the "secondary" relationships in the script.

The red-hot Ryan Gosling co-stars as a 'player' who falls for Stone's character, and their scenes together have a comic and sexual chemistry that the movie is otherwise lacking. On the plus side, one can't complain about getting to see a whole lot of Gosling (in the locker room and in the bedroom).

One Day

I'm a sucker for an old-fashioned tearjerker, and I fell for this one, too, despite Anne Hathaway's hit-and-mostly-miss British accent and the film's unsatisfying structure. Jim Sturgess fares better as the best friend with (partial) benefits of Hathaway's character.

The central gimmick that has the pair meet once a year for two decades gets old fast, and the movie is nowhere near as good as director Lone Scherfig's last film (*An Education*). Still,

Sturgess and Hathaway are beautiful to look at, and locations like Scotland, England and France always make great co-stars.

couples share financial responsibilities.

- 2/3 of lesbians reside outside big cities, with over 1/3 of that group living in small towns or rural areas.
- 58 percent of gay men reside outside cities, with a quarter of that group living in small towns or rural areas.
- 2/3 of gays and lesbians report discrimination and stereotyping for being
- Over 3/4 of gays and lesbians report feeling safer in gay neighborhoods.
- The average age of realizing one's gay identity is 15.
- Over 70 percent agree with the statement, "Being gay is an important part of who I am."

The study also highlights lifestyles, habits and attitudes relating to marriage and co-habiting, the likelihood of having children, entertainment and many other in-depth factors influencing purchasing decisions.

pat fresh queens on the back and say: it's OK presented with a fresh new perspective, to to be gay; we're normal people too; we're not all hairdressers and drag queens, has passed," says Saniski. "We live in the twentyfirst century with gay cultural idioms that reflect, build upon, and move beyond the needs of prior gays."

There is little in gay male culture and social structures that aren't included in Saniski's book. It comes complete with a guide to each subculture in an easily broken down reference guide Saniski refers to as "The Four Gay Humors" - Glamour, Filth, Camp and Divinity.

While written with the newly out in mind, there is also a plethora of information,

interest even the most seasoned of gay

"I regularly meet new gays who have never heard of The Sisters of Perpetual Indulgence or The Folsom Street Fair or gay campgrounds. 


