This epidemic is not over. How could I not do the ride?

I now believe that the stopping of this epidemic is through prevention education (how not to get it) and HIV testing (to know if you have the virus and learn how not to spread it).

That is what the AIDS ride is all about. That is where the money we raise and you give goes.

So it is back on the bike for me. In May, I'll be cycling 330 miles in four days, and in June I'll be cycling 545 miles in seven days.




SFGMC Records World Premiere Work at Skywalker Ranch

EQCA Hosts Sacramento Equality Awards 2012

quality California (EQCA) hosted their 2012 Sacramento Equality Awards on Monday, March 5, recognizing three Sacramentans for their work on Sacramento's redistricting effort, a pioneer state legislature and a tireless advocate for farmworkers.



Cary Davidson (EQCA Institute Board President) and Clarissa Filgioun (EQCA Board President) flank Dr. Darrick Lawson, Rosanna Herber and Steve Hansen, recipients of the 2012 Sacramento Equality Community Advocate Award presented in recognition of their efforts to have Sacramento's LGBT community recognized as a "community of interest" in Sacramento's recent redistricting

The Sacramento Equality Awards honor the persons who most exemplify the work EQCA does in improving the lives of LGBT Californians, creating a stronger California

and defending LGBT rights and protections. Similar awards ceremonies are planned for Los Angeles, San Francisco Palm Springs and San Diego.

Dr. Darrick Lawson, Steve Hansen and Rosanna Herber worked countless hours on the new plan that they hoped would make it possible for an openly LGBT candidate to be elected to the City Council. The Sacramento County Board of Supervisors. EQCA helped in that effort by providing demographic information, but it was largely through the efforts of Lawson, Hansen and Herber that an LGBT "community of interest" was identified and recognized, literally putting the LGBT community "on the map."

The EQCA Leadership Award, was presented to California State Senator Christine Kehoe. In 2002 Sen. Kehoe was a founding member of the California LGBT Legislative Caucus, and has worked tirelessly during her time in the Assembly and Senate on environmental and LGBT issues.

EQCA's Equality Lifetime Achievement Award went to American labor leader and civil rights activist Dolores Huerta. Along with César Chávez, Huerta co-founded the National Farmworkers Association, which later became the United Farmworkers Union and has been a strong advocate for LGBT civil and marriage rights.

White House Conference Addresses LGBT **Housing and Homelessness Issues**

A aying that no one should be subject to mistreatment or denied access to housing assistance because of their sexual orientation **J** or gender identity, HUD Secretary Shaun Donovan said at a conference in Detroit that HUD's new equal access to housing rule "says clearly and unequivocally that LGBT individuals and couples have the right to live where they choose."

Secretary Donovan addressed the housing problems facing the LGBT community at a conference at Wayne State University in Detroit, on Friday, March 9.

"Each of us here knows that rights most folks take for granted are routinely violated against LGBT people," he said, recounting the story of


WEAVE knows that violence is not isolated to a single community, gender, or sexual identity. WEAVE services are available to any victim of interpersonal or sexual violence.



PFLAG Sacramento Celebrates 30 Years of Showing the Love by Bonnie Osborn

To gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender people, PFLAG (Parents, Families and Friends of Lesbians and Gays) fills a place in the heart like no other organization. No Pride parade contingent evokes louder cheers or more choked-up tears than those folks marching by with the PFLAG banner.

They are our moms and dads, or the moms and dads who were there for us when our own parents were not. They are the LGBT people of all ages who came seeking understanding and support and then kept coming back to support others.

They understand how badly a kid hurts when his parents or friends reject him, and they know how shell-shocked and anguished a parent feels when she first learns her son or daughter is gay. They've been there. They are our heroes.

The Sacramento chapter of PFLAG was established in April 1982 by the Rev. Merrill and Mrs. Muriel Follansbee and their friend, Jean Hansen. Its first meeting was held in the Carmichael Presbyterian Church chapel.

The Follansbees were inspired to start the group by their own journey. When their own gay son and lesbian daughter came out, there were no local support networks in place to help them navigate the challenging process. Little did they know the impact their actions would have.

Thirty years and hundreds of individuals and families helped later, Sacramento PFLAG is setting aside an evening to celebrate its rich history of service to the Sacramento LGBT community and its friends and allies. The PFLAG Sacramento 30th Anniversary Celebration Dinner will be held Thursday, April 26, at the Woodlake Hotel, 500 Leisure Lane in Sacramento. The evening will begin with a no-host cocktail reception at 6:30 p.m., followed by dinner at 7 p.m.

In contrast to the many community organizations that hold annual dinners, the April 26 dinner celebration will be PFLAG Sacramento's first.

The most important thing Sacramento PFLAG does is give support to families, says chapter President Howard Papworth. "We have new parents almost every month," he says. "Just think, over 30 years, how many people have come to PFLAG for support."

PFLAG was originally founded to support parents of gay and lesbian children, to offer friendship, guidance and advice, and to let them know they are not alone. "It's become so much more, though," Papworth says.

Over the years, many transgender, gay and lesbian people also sought out PFLAG for friendship and support, sometimes accompanied by spouses or family members, sometimes alone, knowing that, at PFLAG, someone would understand.

Sacramento PFLAG also awards one or

Do Just One Thing

U JUSL UNG THING by Tom Moon, MFT, The Examined Life 've said before in this column that most psychological self-help books aren't worth the paper they're printed on. But once in a

books aren't worth the paper they're printed on. But once in a while a book comes along that really has the power to change our lives for the better.

One such book is *Just One Thing*, by Rick Hanson. Rick is both a neuropsychologist and a meditation teacher, and he uses the new findings of neuroscience to show how very simple mind-training techniques, practiced for just a few minutes daily, can

radically improve our well-being.

The science behind the practices involves a simple principle: every time you use your mind you alter the structure of your brain. Everything you pay attention to, everything you think, feel and want, every time you react to what happens to you – all of these things sculpt your brain.

Busy regions of the brain get more blood flow, and little-used neural connections wither away. "Neurons that fire together wire together" – every time you repeat any mental activity, you strengthen it and make it easier to become a habit.

What this means is that if your mind







SVGLS Set to Open 2012 Spring Season with a Record 18 Teams

The Sacramento Valley Gay & Lesbian Softball League has been very busy this spring, hosting an information night, a meet & greet, three skills clinics and a player draft. All that hard work has paid off though, and close to 250 players have turned out to participate in this year's league, on a record 18 teams.

Thanks to the efforts of board members Jon Green and David Heitstuman, the league has also launched a new web site (SVGLS. org), which provides a wealth of information to new players and sponsors, serves as a resource for coaches and managers, and will allow online registration and event posting.

Additionally, the league plans to host the Gold Rush Classic Softball Tournament during the Labor Day Weekend and hopes to draw up to 32 teams from throughout the Western region. This year, the Board of Directors chose the Sacramento Gay & Lesbian Center as its charitable beneficiary for tournament funds and other league activities.

"We are extremely proud of the advancements the softball league has made

and the increasing popularity of LGBT sports leagues in Sacramento generally," said Commissioner Patrick Marsengill. "It really demonstrates a strong sense of community that allows us to enjoy active recreation and fellowship. We have had so much interest by new players this season, even after drafting to existing teams, that we were able to create two new teams and are currently looking for additional sponsors for them."

The league was created just 18 months ago with only seven teams and recently received approval to join NAGAAA (North American Gay Amateur Athletic Alliance).

Your average Sacramento street festival fills a few city blocks with families and a crowd spanning generations, lifestyles, cultures and colors. But the annual celebration taking place this June 2 at Capitol Mall will be exceptional for that same reason, as a new energy, larger attendance and greater prominence mark Sacramento Pride Festival 2012.

More than ever, this year's event reflects the nation's sixth largest LGBT community at a crossroads. The Sacramento Gay and Lesbian Center, which hosts the event, has undergone a complete change in leadership that includes a new, heterosexual, executive director. Shara Perkins Murphy brings a career in political and organizational experience earned at the California State Capitol. Also as an African-American, she has strongly and publicly declared that the struggle for gay and lesbian rights is identical to that fought by African-Americans during the Civil Rights Movement.

Just as the event has steadily attracted a more diverse crowd beyond the LGBT community that it celebrates, Sacramento Pride's list of sponsors has grown its corporate membership. Wells Fargo, Hewlett-Packard, Comcast and Barefoot Wines recently joined a sponsor list of well over a dozen well-recognized names.




Einhorn is sharing its public relations capabilities on a pro-bono basis.

Yet, Sacramento Pride relies heavily on its bedrock list of longtime supporters and organizers, such as Fred Palmer, publisher of Outword magazine and co-founder of the Sacramento Rainbow Chamber of Commerce. Brandon McElhanev has helped lead organization of Sacramento Pride events since 2005, and this June's event will be his fourth as festival manager.

The venue has changed and grown right along with Sacramento Pride's own expansion. It's outgrown a series of sites, having originally started at East Sacramento's McKinley Park, then later moving to Southside Park near the W and X Freeway, before relocating to the current site on Capitol Mall between 3rd and 7th Streets.

"Sacramento Pride reflects a new direction, and some of that originates from changes at the Sacramento Gay and Lesbian Center, but much more of it speaks to society's greater acceptance of the LGBT community, especially here in Sacramento," Perkins said. "At the same time, we're regaining longtime Center membership and LGBT community support that has always defined our identity."

Entertainment **Game of Thrones Finally on DVD** reviewed by Hunt Drouin

S et during a medieval period in a fictitious world, *Game of Thrones* is a masterpiece of taught writing and strong acting. It is filled with courtly intrigue, violence and of course, as an HBO series, a healthy amount of sex.



Emilia Clarke plays Daenerys Targaryen who is forced to marry the powerful Dothraki horse lord Khal Drogo in return for promises of an army.

These are only the backdrops for the maneuverings of the characters, though. In the DVD set for Season One, now available, we are introduced to four noble families who rule (or have ruled) the Seven Kingdoms.

The ruling House Baratheon includes a weak, indulgent King Robert and his wife, Queen Cersei who married for political purposes only. The queen is part of House Lannister and has two brothers, the too handsome and somewhat secretive Jaime and the drunken, whoring, intelligent dwarf Tyrion. Tyrion is by far one of the best characters on the show and he is expertly played by Peter Dinklage, who won an Emmy for his portrail.

House Stark is headed by Eddard (played by Sean Bean), the noble forthright soldier who becomes Hand of the King. He has a commanding presence in his family, which includes his yummy bastard son Jon, and they are the true characters to root for.

The final House Targaryen is in exile across the Narrow Sea as they were in power before and defeated by House Baratheon. Only two members of this house survive, Viserys, a

wanna be future king who you enjoy hating, and his sister Danaerys, whose character grows the most during the show and it is a delight to witness her evolution from downtrodden, meek outcast to queen of a barbarian horde.

Surprising, there is a wealth of children characters throughout the storytelling, all magnificently played. A personal favorite is Arya, the young tomboy daughter of Eddard Stark who wants to be a swordsman.

Not unexpectedly, the Blu-ray picture quality is spectacular giving great clarity to both the lush and stark (no pun intended) settings. The boxed series includes a ton of extras including insider's guides to characters, games, and behind-the-scenes looks.

Here's the hint, the show is intelligently written so if you're slightly confused by the goings on during the first couple episodes, hang in there. By episode four, you'll be hooked on this newest guilty pleasure from HBO. I know I was.

Entertainment **Bettye LaVette at the Mondavi**







"That's just wrong," said Donovan. "No one should be subject to that kind of treatment or denied access to housing assistance because of their sexual orientation or gender identity."

Just over a month ago, Donovan announced a new Equal Access to Housing Rule that says clearly and unequivocally that LGBT individuals and couples have the right to live where they choose, prohibiting owners and operators of HUD-funded housing, or housing whose financing HUD insures, from inquiring about an applicant's sexual orientation or gender identity or denying housing on that basis.

"That's what equal access means – and that's what this rule is going to do," said Donovan.





regularly focuses on worries, anger, or self-criticism, then your brain develops neural structures supporting anxiety, low self-esteem and impatience with others. But if you regularly focus your attention on noticing that you're all right now, not taking life personally, cultivating gratitude, or letting go – then gradually your brain re-shapes itself to support calm strength, selfconfidence and inner peace.

So, for instance, regularly taking the time for mindfulness pauses activates the part of the brain that



puts the brakes on negative feelings, and thus lifts mood. Other practices, such as taking in the good, feeling safer, relaxing anxiety about imperfection, or filling the hole in your heart, support and increase your sense of security and worth, resilience, effectiveness, and well-being.

This book is very user-friendly. Each chapter title names a specific practice, and the rest of the chapter, which is never more than a few pages, tells you why to do it, and then how to do it.

The practices themselves usually involve actions you take in your mind, such as reflecting, concentrating, or focusing your attention, and they only take a few minutes to do per day. But doing them regularly gradually re-shapes the brain to reduce stress and unhappiness, and to develop positive qualities.

They're exactly like physical exercise; any single time you work out, not much changes, but over time your health and strength improve.

We all understand that we have to make effort regularly over time to do things like learning how to drive a car or play basketball, but we typically think the mind should just work fine on its own, without any effort or discipline. Rick Hanson shows us how some very down-toearth actions can turn an unruly mind into one that is focused, strong and happy. I recommend this book highly.


