



Say "No" to Big Tobacco - Support Prop 29

Tany don't realize, or aren't aware of, the disproportionate impact smoking has on the LGBT community. I might **L** get ousted from the bars this weekend for saying it, but since gay men have almost twice the odds of a cancer diagnosis compared with heterosexual men, we need to put down the cigarettes and support Prop 29.

Over 30 percent the LGBT community smokes - nearly double that of the general population and cancer and heart disease kill more people in California than any other cause. Smoking has been shown to be a strong causal factor in both cases. Sadly, nearly one in two Californian's born today will get cancer in their lifetimes, including 41 percent of bisexual women who will report cervical cancer - that's more than double the prevalence in other women..

Prop 29 – the new \$1 tobacco tax initiative on the June 5 ballot – can help save lives. Prop 29 will raise \$735 million every year for cancer and other tobacco-related disease research as well as give a shot in the arm to tobacco prevention programs.

Additionally, Prop 29 will fund more than \$500 million each year for research into the prevention, detection and treatment of cancer and tobacco-related diseases. This could well lead us to cures for these deadly diseases.

If you take into account that according to the American Heart Association, 30 percent of cardiovascular disease, the leading cause of death in the state, is directly attributable to smoking you can see how high our risk is. Worse still, LGBT youth have the highest smoking rates of any group 18-24, at nearly 44 percent compared to only 18 percent for their peers.

Frankly this isn't much of a surprise. Over the years, tobacco companies have targeted the LGBT community, and their marketing tactics are obviously paying off.

But we can fight back. We must not allow tobacco-related diseases to be the next health crisis of our community. Prop 29 will fund life-changing smoking prevention and cessation programs, and public health experts project that the price increase alone will prevent 228,000 youth from starting this deadly habit and save 104,000 lives.

Unfortunately, Big Tobacco is spending

more than \$23 million to defeat Prop 29.

I have worked the last decade with California's LGBT community, as an operative in progressive politics and now as the executive director of our community center. I have seen how this community has

California Museum to Honor Harvey Milk Day

The Harvey Milk Foundation, The California Legislative LGBT Caucus and Equality California (EQCA) are hosting a celebration of the life and work of Harvey Milk at a special reception and exhibit honoring the slain civil rights leader.

The program will feature a panel discussion with Stuart Milk, the nephew of Harvey Milk, Anne Kronenberg, Milk's campaign manager, Senator Mark Leno, author of SB 48, Office of State Superintendent of Public Instruction Tom Torlakson and Stampp Corbin, publisher of the San Diego based *LGBT Weekly*, who will be the moderator.

The panel will discuss the implementation and benefits of Senate Bill (SB) 48 The Fair, Accurate, Inclusive, and Respectful (FAIR) Education Act, signed into law by Governor Brown in 2011, that requires public schools to teach LGBT history. While the act went into effect January 1, 2012, it's still not implemented.





Equality Action NOW to Host Harvey Milk Day Celebration by Ken Pierce

tate Senator Mark Leno will receive the "Spirit of Harvey Milk" award in recognition of his authoring, and tireless work for the passage of Senate Bill 572, which created Harvey Milk Day in California.

The award will be presented as a part of Equality Action NOW's (EAN) third annual Harvey Milk Day celebration, on Tuesday, May 22, from 6 p.m. to 8 p.m. at Mulvaney's B&L Next Door, 1215 19th St.

Harvey Milk was a leader in the gay rights movement who was elected to the San Francisco Board of Supervisors in 1977, making him the nation's first openly gay man elected to public office in a major U.S. city.

On October 12, 2009, Arnold Schwarzenegger signed the bill (SB 572) establishing "Harvey Milk Day" to take place each May 22, Milk's birthday. The signing came on the heels of President Obama awarding Harvey Milk posthumously, the presidential Medal of Freedom Award, in August 2009.

"It is because of Senator Leno's tireless efforts in the legislature writing laws that help to increase counseling services to at-risk youth; make sure the achievements of LGBT people

are taught to students; and his continued fight for civil rights for all, that he will be presented with the "Spirit of Harvey Milk" award," said EAN Board President Ken Pierce.

Five more members of the community will also be honored and announced during the celebration.



NorCal AIDS Cyclists Ready to Start 330-Mile Trek

ver 130 cyclists have finished grueling months NCAC has raised nearly a million of training and are now ready to take on the challenge of their lives, the NorCal AIDS Cycle (NCAC), a four-day, 330-mile cycling trip through the beautiful hills and valleys of Northern California to raise money for local HIV/AIDS services and agencies.

The NCAC Opening Ceremony and ride-out will be held the morning of Thursday, May 17 at 7 a.m. at Folsom Lake's Beals Point. Friends and family of cyclists and support crewmembers will gather to cheer the ride-out and to participate in a ceremony including a performance of the National Anthem and a non-denominational prayer for the strength and comfort of cyclists and crew during the challenging event.

NCAC cyclist and Sacramento City Councilmember Jay Schenirer will present a Council Resolution in support of the event.

The cyclists will follow a circuitous, often challenging ride through the Sierra foothills and northern Central Valley, ending their first 103-mile day at Gridley, Calif. The group will end its second day at Williams, Calif., and its third day at Woodland, Calif.

The annual event raised nearly a quarter million dollars in 2011 with approximately 90 cyclists. Each NCAC cyclist pledges to raise a minimum of \$1,500, and many raise more. Proceeds of the ride support non-profit HIV/AIDS service organizations in the Greater Sacramento and surrounding

performances of the UC Davis California Aggie Marching Band, Sacramento Sirens Cheer Elite and the Sacramento Gay Men's Chorus. The event also will include exhibits by benefiting organizations.





The Avengers Opens a Can of Whoop-ass!

opcorn movie season has begun with a bang thanks to the early summer release of the ultimate superhero film, The Avengers. I also review several smaller titles trying in vain to compete with that blockbuster at the box office.

The Avengers

There is an abundance of testosterone on screen in this cinematic superhero smackdown not that I'm complaining – but Scarlett Johansson holds her own with the big boys. The actress appears to be having a blast alongside Robert Downey Jr., Jeremy Renner, Mark Ruffálo, and the two hunky Chris's (Hemsworth and Evans).

The Lucky One

Zac Efron has definitely discovered the gym since his High School Musical days, and the newly-hunky actor gives a decent, understated performance in yet another adaptation of a Nicholas Sparks book.

The movie also gets points for touching on the Iraq War's effect on our military's mental health - Efron plays a troubled vet - and Blythe

Work, life and other comedic business keep their characters from tying the knot year after year, and although the outcome is never in doubt, the surprises here are the smart script and the fizzy performances by the entire cast.

The Crest

There are at least three intriguing titles coming to the Crest in May:



The Avengers is probably fifteen or 20 minutes too long for its own good, but that is the only negative thing I can say about this very entertaining adrenaline rush of an action flick.

For once, the 3D and the CGI are supported by funny dialogue, fine performances, and skillful direction by Joss Whedon.

The Raven

I'll see John Cusack in anything, and the actor gives an intense, committed performance in this new thriller inspired by the life of Edgar Allan Poe, master of the macabre.

Unfortunately, the movie settles for a cheesy fictional plot based on Poe's stories when a more realistic bio-pic probably would have been a lot more interesting and just as weird, given the facts of the writer's life.

Danner and Taylor Schilling provide able support. Unfortunately, Sparks can't seem to resist clichéd plot elements such as an evil sheriff and a child in peril.

The Five-Year Engagement

God bless Jason Segel, who isn't afraid to do nude scenes, even though he doesn't exactly look like Brad Pitt or Channing Tatum. That didn't stop the doughy comedic actor from doing a full-frontal scene in Forgetting Sarah Marshall a few years back and now a booty shot in this new rom-com. Segel gives hope to regular guys everywhere that you don't need six-pack abs and buns of steel to score with the ladies.

Emily Blunt doesn't seem to mind that there is a little bit more of him to love, and since she is just as quirky a performer as Segel, I enjoyed their chemistry and the alternately sweet and raunchy style

SFGMC to Premier *Give 'Em Hope* at Capitol by Matthew Bulingame

xciting, humbling and appropriate," says Teddy Witherington, the executive director of the San Francisco Gay Men's Chorus (SFGMC), when asked how it feels to be premiering the new Harvey Milk anthem *Give 'Em Hope* on the steps of the Capitol building on Tues., May 22 at a free concert.

"We took this project on with purpose and also humility," Witherington continues. "The legacy of Harvey Milk belongs to us all and we have assembled a huge number of collaborating organizations and individuals who are helping us with this awesome project. We do not do this alone and have fantastic partners like the Sacramento Gay & Lesbian Center and the Sacramento Gay Men's Chorus."

The event is being presented as part of SFGMC's California Freedom Tour and on their Sacramento visit they will also be performing that evening at 8 p.m. at Trinity Episcopal Cathedral, 2620 Capitol Ave. in Sacramento. Proceeds from the performance will go to the Sacramento Gay & Lesbian Center.

The performance will highlight musical selections from *Godspell*, *Wicked* and *Hairspray* as well as feature a special guest performance by the Sacramento Gay Men's Chorus (SGMC).

"We were asked by the San Francisco Gay Men's Chorus if we would like to make a joint appearance at a show they were hoping to put together in Sacramento," says Mike Tentis, President of the Board of Directors of SGMC. "The concert was specifically planned to occur in Sacramento on Harvey Milk Day as a symbolic reminder of the hard-fought political gains that our community has realized over the past few decades. As the concert will be a fundraiser for the Sacramento Gay and Lesbian Center, we were happy to agree to be a part of this effort."

So why, other than being from the city Milk represented during his short time in office, is SFGMC the perfect group to take on this momentous challenge?

"SFGMC made its first public appearance at the impromptu candlelight memorial on the steps of San Francisco's City Hall the night that Harvey Milk and George Moscone were assassinated," explains Witherington. "I would often wonder how that connection might be given new meaning. In 2010 SFGMC was formulating a strategic vision for the next three years; a performance-based project to honor the 35th anniversary of Harvey Milk's 11 months in office and the 35th anniversary of the night the Chorus began to take shape."

The group commissioned Pamela Stewart to write the anthem, now entitled *Give 'em Hope* based on one of Milk's most famous quotes "You gotta give 'em hope." The song

was set to music by composer Joseph Martin. For the group, the decision to premiere the work on the steps of the state capitol in honor of Harvey Milk Day was the obvious choice.

"The message of LGBT freedom and acceptance isn't limited to a proposition, a percentage or a state line" says Witherington. "This year, we also take our Freedom Tour to Denver and Laramie, working there in close harmony with the Matthew Shepard Foundation. At every concert we have raised funds for local organizations – so far approximately \$30,000 – so that they too can 'Give 'em Hope' in places where it matters."






Tony Fever Takes Over Broadway Outword Reviews Five NYC Plays by Chris Narloch

66 ony Fever" is in full force this May, as Broadway performers, producers and other professionals wait to learn if their productions can turn Tony nominations in to Tony Awards. Fortunately, I've just recently returned from my annual pre-Tonys trip to New York City and can give you a rundown on several of the nominated shows.

Next issue, I'll have reviews of the Broadway musicals I saw, including a new production of Evita, co-starring Ricky Martin; of this 1960 political play by Gore Vidal as a the screen-to-stage adaptations of Priscilla Queen of the Desert, Once and Newsies; the bawdy blockbuster The Book of Mormon and a red-hot revival of Porgy and Bess.

This issue I cover the plays I caught while in the Big Apple.

Venus in Fur

If Nina Arianda fails to win this year's award for Best Performance by an Actress in a Leading Role in a Play, I will be throwing things at my television screen on Tony night. Her performance in this play is so razorsharp and funny that she keeps you on the edge of your seat from her entrance until the final scene.

Co-starring the equally talented and sexy Hugh Dancy, Venus in Fur is David Ives' fascinating play about a writer/director and an actress who engage in an intensely dramatic "pas de deux" during her audition.

The Best Man

Describing the current Broadway revival star-vehicle would be putting it mildly celebrity pile-up is more like it. It's not everyday one gets to see the likes of James Earl Jones, Angela Lansbury, Candice Bergen, John Larroquette and Eric McCormack on the same stage, unless of course you are returning to the Gerald Schoenfeld Theatre night after night during this show's limited run.

That might not be a bad idea, since this production of Vidal's still relevant and thought-provoking work amounts to a master class in stage acting by its uniformly excellent, star-studded cast.

Peter and the Starcatcher

Although the competition is unusually stiff in 2012, I am rooting for this charming little sleeper to win the Tony for Best Play. A prequel to *Peter Pan* based on a 2004 children's novel by Dave Barry, *Peter and the* months, when the singer attempted to make

Starcatcher is an amazing blast of theatrical creativity that eschews big-budget special effects and elaborate sets in favor of more suggestive staging that allows audiencemembers to use their imaginations.

That's not a problem given the poignant beauty of both the script and the performances, which add up to an enchanting, one-of-a-kind work of art.

Tribes

A dysfunctional family drama with a twist, *Tribes* is the best play on the subject of deafness that I have seen since 1980's Children of a Lesser God.

A deaf actor named Russell Harvard movingly plays the deaf son in a hearing family who rebels after he begins dating a young woman who is losing her own hearing. She helps him connect with other deaf people and learn sign language, which upsets his professor father, who had made the decision when his son was young not to teach him to sign for fear of stigmatizing the

A powerful off-Broadway play about the damage families can do.

End of the Rainbow

The one dud play I saw this trip was an exercise in grave-robbing purporting to reveal the truth about Judy Garland's last

a comeback with a series of concerts in London while addicted to drugs, drink and her last husband, the controversial Mickey

As Garland, Tracie Bennett gives the kind of all-stops-out, bravura performance that wins awards, but she didn't remind me much of Judy, unless you believe that Garland had lost every shred of decency and vulnerability by this point in her life.


Are gay audiences really this hard up for entertainment that we need to spend two hours watching one of our icons get literally and figuratively trashed?






