

# Is This the Beginning of an LGBT Backlash?

here's a word you need to know: Backlash. Recently, we have seen an uptick in antigay hate crimes, but you might notice a pattern. They seem to be coming from places where there is success in nondiscrimination and marriage equality – namely this week in New York City, with what looks like three occurrences.

The first was just blocks away from the iconic Stonewall Inn, another in the East Village and then another in the Bronx.

This could be a pattern, could be just a series of copycat incidents, isolated but similar, or they can be the start of a backlash.

For the most part, the struggle for LGBT equality has been a peaceful one. There are, of course, the images of Matthew Shepard and Harvey Milk, and one cannot underestimate the suffering of our endangered youth who have been bullied, in some cases to death. But all of them were isolated to their region.

A backlash happens when those who most

oppose your rights begin to realize that you've won, and then strike back with anger. That anger is usually in the form of violence. New York had a highly competitive fight for marriage equality and, following its victory, came many more around the country. Those haters, who cannot come to terms with this sea change, sometimes act out.

We need to be prepared for such actions, and like most issues preparation can come by looking at your history. And this coming month is a perfect example of our history.

month is a perfect example of our history.

The first gay Pride march in 1970 in New York City was called the Christopher Street Day Liberation March. In 1970, we didn't

know how many would show up or how we

would be treated as we marched out of the village all the way to Central Park. In order to safeguard our community, those of us who were marshals were to take martial arts and self-defense courses at Alternate U.


That first march changed the world. It gave us gay Pride and we who were marshals were the most surprised, since we never expected that thousands would show up to march with us. And although we were prepared, there were no violent issues. Haters just stood on the sidelines thinking, These people will get nowhere.

Well, we have, and it's time to take a cue from our history and begin to safeguard our community with basic self defense.

Creating community means providing what the community needs, and that includes safeguarding ourselves.

66 Tf I'd known I was going to live this long, I would have taken better care of myself," Eubie Blake famously said when he was in his late 90s, still active as a musician, composer and performer. That sentiment certainly strikes a chord with an aging gay population.

With only a handfull of men, the 70th Prime Timers chapter was formed in Sacramento, in May of 2009. In just four short years, Prime Timers Sacramento's membership has grown to over 100 active members. Not only do they host a well attended monthly meeting and catered

#### **PA School Won't Change Transgender Student Policies**

The Red Lion Area School District (RLASD) has refused to change its policy regarding transgender candidates for prom court, nor will it agree to allow transgender students to use a name at graduation to match their gender identity, according to a letter from the school district's solicitor.

"I am really disappointed that the school district doesn't want to do anything to protect transgender students," said Wolfe, a senior at Red Lion Area High School. "I want to make sure that future transgender students are not humiliated and disrespected the way I was."

#### **Assembly Passes Bill to Protect Transgender Students**

The California Assembly passed AB 1266 on May 9, a bill that ensures that transgender students in California have equal and full access to programs and facilities on the basis of their gender identity.

The bill clarifies existing law, which already prohibits discrimination against transgender students. While some large districts – Los Angeles and San Francisco – are already successfully working with these students on the basis of their gender identities, many school districts are not presently in compliance with these requirements. "Gender identity" is a person's internal, deeply-rooted identification as male or female.

"Because somebody is uncomfortable is not a reason to discriminate," Ammiano said, responding to opponents of the bill, who argued that inclusion of transgender students would cause discomfort to others.

#### Same-Sex Partner Gets Spousal ID By U.S. House

Openly gay U.S. Rep. Mark Pocan's husband has received an ID issued only to the spouses of federal lawmakers. It is the first time the House has recognized the same-sex husband of a member with the House Spouse ID.

"We're very happy that my husband Phil (Frank) was able to get a House Spouse ID," said Pocan, a Democrat from Madison, WI. "It's significant. It's the first time."

The congressman said the ID is largely symbolic and its issuance doesn't mean Frank has access to the spousal benefits that other congressional husbands or wives receive.

#### **Brazil National Council of Justice Paves Way for the Freedom to Marry**

Brazil's National Council of Justice on May 14, ruled that government offices have no standing to refuse marriage licenses to same-sex couples, moving the freedom to marry forward for gay and lesbian people nationwide.

The ruling follows decisions by 14 of Brazil's states and the national capital region that same-sex couples could marry without a court petition, as well as lower court rulings in favor of the freedom to marry. The High Court could still modify the ruling, but advocates feel that is unlikely, and Brazil is now likely to become the latest country to embrace the freedom to marry nationwide.

Freedom to marry legislation passed earlier this year in Uruguay, France and New Zealand. After it takes effect in those countries, same-sex couples will have the freedom to marry, regionally or nationwide, in 17 countries around the world.

#### **Minnesota Governor Signs Same-Sex Marriage Law**

Minnesota Gov. Mark Dayton signed on May 14, a bill legalizing marriage for same-sex couples shortly after its passage by the state legislature.

"It has been 40 years since the American Civil Liberties Union of Minnesota filed Baker v. Nelson, the first marriage equality case in the country," said Charles Samuelson, executive director of the ACLU of Minnesota. "We are pleased that after 40 years of fighting for the freedom to marry, equality has finally been realized for all Minnesotans. We are glad to join the 11 other states and the District of Columbia in recognizing marriage for all loving committed couples."





apital City AIDS Fund (CCAF) invites young people living with HIV/AIDS to apply for scholarships through the Helen ✓ Veress-Mitchell Scholarship Fund of up to \$1,500 each per year to attend college or technical school.

One of CCAF's primary goals is to raise money to distribute to local HIV+ youth to help them with school. To date, the scholarship fund has awarded approximately \$150,000 to dozens of students.

CCAF prides itself on having two MA graduates and many BA and technical school grads. "What we have found is that many of our students, once they graduate, get jobs in the community helping others living with HIV/ AIDS," said Stuart Eldridge, CCAF scholarship committee chair. "We believe this is one of the best investments we could ever make."

"I am one of those people that must never for a moment take for granted the time they have right now," said 18-year-old Christina when she applied for her CCAF scholarship. "I was born with the HIV disease and I have had to live the 18 years of my life as if any day I will get sick."

Unfortunately, Christina died from

complications related to AIDS but not before receiving a \$1,500 scholarship from the Helen Veress-Mitchell Scholarship Fund. She did enroll in college and said she had never been

With organizations like the Capital City AIDS Fund, it makes my dream of being an interior designer easier to obtain," Christina said. "Hopefully, I will not leave this world knowing that there was something I never did get to do."

Eldridge said that CCAF was honored to help Christina. "She is one of the many faces we remember and who remind us that we must not abandon this journey of helping people living with HIV/AIDS.







# **Wendy Williams Headlines Great America's Pride Night**

66 T'm tall. I'm dramatic. My breasts ..." shares Wendy Williams, "With the wigs, the wiggle and all the kiki stuff, it just seems like I'm a good caricature or something."

These are some of the many reasons LGBT fans love her, admits the talk show titan, who headlines Pride Night 2013 at California's Great America on Fri., May 24.

"There are certain girls in the history of culture that gay people just gravitate to," acknowledges Williams, placing iconic figures such as Diana Ross and Anna Nicole Smith in a similar category. "Gay people love women who come from the outside somehow," she notes. "It's the highest compliment."

The straight-talking diva - known 'round the world for her "How you doin'?" catchphrase - kicks off Memorial Day weekend with the LGBT community at the Santa Clara theme park. Joining Williams on the star-studded Pride Night 2013 line-up is Alex Newell, who will sing a live 30-minute set of favorites performed by his male-to-female transgender character "Unique" on the popular FOX TV series GLEE.

For her part, Williams will answer previously-submitted questions from the audience, offering the same brand of hard-hitting, often blunt responses loval "Wendy Watchers" seek on-air.

Indeed, the New Jersey native's advice has become so sought-after, she recently published a book of it. Ask Wendy hit retail earlier this month. "People ask me everything," says the 48-year-old star, who in June makes her Broadway debut playing Matron "Mama" Morton in Chicago. "Some of the questions are rather shocking, but I answer them all with a straight face."

Williams promises to be equally candidbut-composed responding to fan questions at Pride Night 2013. "Nothing is off-limits," she says. "But I take my advice seriously, so they will not be laughed at - at least not by me."

After Williams and Newell wrap, and Great America's rides close and the main stage area transforms into "Dancing After Dark." Sponsored by Splash San Jose night club, this high-energy dance stage includes performances by Billboard chart-topping singer Luciana, who will perform global dance hits including "I'm Still Hot" and "We Own the Night," and DJ/producers The Perry Twins.

Produced by San Francisco-based drag star Pollo Del Mar, Pride Night 2013 runs from 5 p.m. to 2 a.m. and is an all-ages event.



# Rebel Country Queens Reviewed — Pistol Annies' New CD and More by Chris Narloch

am not ashamed to say I love country music, although my tastes run more towards classic country and alternative country performers (such as The Civil Wars) than towards the sometimes watered-down, pop-influenced music prevalent on country radio nowadays.



Here are reviews of new CDs by three country acts that are branching out and keeping it real. I like to think of them as rebel country queens.

#### Pistol Annies – Annie Up

The hottest blond in country music isn't Carrie Underwood or Taylor Swift. It's Miranda Lambert, who in addition to a thriving solo career, has this side job as one-third of a sexy super group who sing songs with titles such as "I Feel A Sin Comin" On."

Pistol Annies is Lambert, Ashley Monroe and Angaleena Presley, a terrifically talented trio of country singer-songwriters whose tongues are firmly in cheek on 12 tasty tracks whose titles speak for themselves: "Unhappily Married," "Dear Sobriety" and "Blues, You're A Buzzkill," just to name a few

This is real country music at its very best, and you also need to purchase the Annies' first CD, *Hell On Heels*, which is just as good if not better than "Annie Up."

#### Natalie Maines – *Mother*

I can think of no sadder plight in the recent history of popular music than the fall from grace suffered by Natalie Maines, the lead singer of the country trio Dixie Chicks.

Maines' public comments disparaging George Bush during the early days of the Iraq War resulted in record burning and threats on her life, and she is still more or less a pariah in country music circles.

Her dark new CD *Mother*, which was produced by rocker Ben Harper, doesn't have a country bone in its body and sounds nothing like Dixie Chicks. It's a sobering set of songs that no doubt reflects the singer's state of mind after her ordeal with the downside of fame.

Her country fans – the loyal ones – may not love the CD's rock edge, but the record successfully shows a different side of Maines. The title track, which is a cover of a Pink
