



ouncilmember Steve Hansen, the Sacramento Rainbow Chamber and the Midtown Business Association (MBA) are inviting the community to the unveiling of the Rainbow Crosswalks project at 20th & K Streets in the Lavender Heights neighborhood of Midtown Sacramento.

EQCA Reports Success for Its 2015 Legislative Program

¬ quality California is reporting that 100 percent of their proequality priority bills – eight bills that they sponsored, and legislative session and are headed to the Governor's desk.

"Our success this year means that Equality California has now passed 110 pieces of legislation, and maintains its position as the most effective LGBT advocacy organization in the nation," said EOCA Executive Director Rick Zbur in a released statement. "We thank the pro-equality legislators who authored these bills and Assembly Speaker Toni Atkins and Senate Pro Tem Kevin de León for their strong support."

This year, according to the statement, if signed into law these bills will make students safer, give California teachers better resources to support LGBT students, strengthen the rights of LGBT parents, protect transgender foster youth, and more.

In addition, EQCA helped pass a legislative resolution that calls on the federal government to end the discriminatory blood donation policies that prevent all sexually active gay and bisexual men from donating blood.

Equality California's 2015 Sponsored Bills and Resolutions include:

AB 959: Reduce Health Disparities for LGBT People Through Data Collection; AB 827: Help Teachers Combat Bullying and Support LGBT Youth; AB 329: California Healthy Youth Act; SB 731: Supporting Transgender Foster Youth; SB 703: Require Companies who Contract with California to Provide Insurance Benefits to Transgender Employees; AB 960: Equal Protection for All Families Act; AB 87: End Discrimination Against Transgender Jurors; and AJR 16: Resolution on Blood Donation Policies.

In addition to the sponsored bills, Equality California worked in coalition to strongly support passage of bills sponsored by their coalition partners: SB 4: Expanded Healthcare for Undocumented Immigrants; and AB 15: End of Life.

Governor Brown now has until October 11th to take action on these bills.

Ambitious PEPFAR Targets Set for 2016 and 20

The United States is committing resources to ensure the President's Emergency Plan for AIDS Relief (PEPFAR) will, by the end of 2017 support 12.9 million people on life-saving antiretroviral treatment.

Resources will also provide for 13 million male circumcisions for HIV prevention, and reduce HIV incidence by 40 percent among adolescent girls and young women within the highest burdened areas of 10 sub-Saharan African countries.

"We are at a pivotal moment in the global fight against HIV/AIDS," said National Security Advisor Susan E. Rice in a statement announcing the goals. "Globally, both new HIV infections and AIDS related deaths are down by more than 40 percent since their peak. This Administration has invested nearly \$50 billion through the President's Emergency Plan for AIDS Relief (PEPFAR) to achieve an AIDS-free generation, building on the initiative and \$15 billion provided by President Bush.

Working with partner countries around the globe, we are now supporting life-saving antiretroviral treatment for 7.7 million men, women, and children worldwide; enabled

"We believe if we all – governments, the private sector, civil society, including faithbased organizations - bring our collective will and energy together we can achieve an AIDS-free generation and bring this epidemic to a halt," said Rice.





Oregon Court Upholds Ruling, Affirming Oregon Equality Act

The Oregon Court of Appeals osn Sept. 23 upheld a discrimination ruling against P Club, a North Portland bar that discriminated against transgender customers, when the bar owner alledgedly left voice mail messages for transgender customers telling them to stop visiting the business because he didn't want P Club known as a "tranny bar" or "gay bar."

The owners contended that the discriminatory voicemails represented protected speech. "Freedom of speech like freedom of religion are important fundamental rights that we are proud to defend, however, they cannot be used to deny dignity and respect to Oregonians," said Jeana Frazzini, Basic Rights Oregon's Co-Director. "Oregonians decided long ago that discrimination has no place in our state. Denying goods and services to people because of who they are and whom they love is hurtful and wrong,"

LGBTQ Advocates Condemn Pope Francis' Comments on the Issuance of Marriage Licenses to Same-Sex Couples

The National LGBTQ Task Force is condemning Pope Francis' endorsement of the "right" of government officials to ignore laws if they believe they are wrong, such as in the case of the Kentucky clerk who refused to issue marriage licenses to same-sex couples.

The pontiff made his comments in a media interview on his plane journey back to Rome. "As a Catholic, it's very disappointing that Pope Francis doesn't seem to understand that politicians and government officials using religion as an excuse to impose their prejudices on the public is profoundly wrong," said Russell Roybal, Deputy Executive Director, National LGBTQ Task Force. "Our faith should liberate – not discriminate. Religious liberty is a cherished right but government officials should not be allowed to cherry pick the laws they want to follow and the ones they want to ignore."

Solano Pride Center Opens at New Location in Fairfield

The Solano Pride Center, serving the lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, questioning, and intersex communities in Solano County has relocated to 1234 Empire St. in Fairfield.

The new center was made possible through donations from Solano Pride supporters, and from the Solano County Mental Health Department for the purpose of developing a community-based social support program to increase the well-being of LGBTQI people in Solano County.

Federation of Gay Games Receives \$23K Donation

The Federation of Gay Games (FGG) board of directors have announced a \$23,000 bequest from Michael Clarke via the Michael Ancil Clarke Living Trust. Clarke passed away in 2010 and his legacy of support of the LGBT community continues to this day.

Along with being one of the founding members and Honorary Life Members of the FGG, Clarke has an esteemed history with many other LGBT organizations including the Lesbian/Gay Chorus of San Francisco, Gay Men's Chorus Los Angeles and the San Francisco Gay Men's Chorus

"On behalf of the Federation of Gay Games, member organizations, volunteers and Honorary Life Members, we are honored by this bequest and will continue honoring Michael's legacy through promoting equality in sport and culture to foster and augment the self-respect of the LGBT community," said Joanie Evans, FGG Co-President.

Clinton Campaign Appoints LGBT Liaison

Democratic presidential candidate Hillary Clinton has appointed Dominic Lowell as director of LGBT outreach. Lowell joins the campaign after serving as director of strategic partnerships for Rock the Vote where he coordinated progressive movement outreach.

Lowell, who is gay, is one of several members of the Clinton campaign who identify as LGBT. Others are Campaign Manager Robby Mook, Deputy Political Director Brynne Craig and National Finance Director Dennis Cheng.

HRC To Launch Global Corporate Coalition To Advance LGBT Equality in Workplaces Worldwide

The Human Rights Campaign (HRC) has announce the creation of a global coalition committed to advancing LGBT workplace equality around the world.

The inaugural members of HRC's global corporate coalition collectively employ nearly 1.4 million people across more than 190 countries and have a combined annual revenue of nearly \$550 billion. Together, they have committed to safeguarding workplace fairness and equality for LGBT employees across their global operations.

IGLHRC Adopts New Name

t its annual gala in New York City, the International Gay and Lesbian Human Rights Commission, marking its 25th anniversary on Monday, Sept. 28, announced a new name:

OutRight Action International.

"We chose a new name that speaks to the heart of our mission. We have been 'out' for rights for 25 years, and at a time when civil society and LGBTI rights are under attack in many parts of the world, we believe our new name speaks to our commitment to LGBTIQ activism and resilience internationally," said Iessica Stern, the executive director.

Moisés Kaufman, the playwright and founder of Tectonic Theater Project best known for The Laramie Project, hosted the event during which OutRight honored Gays and Lesbians of Zimbabwe, also celebrating its 25th anniversary.

Instead of adopting an acronym, the organization said it prefers the simpler "OutRight" as shorthand.

Along with a new tagline - Human Rights for LGBTIQ People Everywhere - OutRight reflects the organization's commitment to inclusiveness for everyone in the LGBTIQ global community.

"For 25 years, we've worked hand-in-hand with activists around the world to challenge discriminatory laws and abusive practices. Now we are taking a step to explicitly devote ourselves to dignity and acceptance for all in the LGBTIQ community: lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, intersex and queer," Stern said.



Dante Club Answers the Need for Entertainment Venues by Bonnie Osborn

t seems Dante Club General Manager Joy Reinhardt was destined for a career feeding and entertaining guests. Her father served as personal chef for a Saudi prince in Riyadh for 20 vears; her mother was a waitress, and her stepfather owned a beer and wine bar. The Dante Club just seemed like a natural fit.

Founded in 1926 as a traditional Italian social club, Dante Club served for years as a venue for fundraisers, festivals, and the weddings, anniversary celebrations and family reunions of some of Sacramento's most prominent citizens.

"My first vision for Dante Club was to add some sparkle here and there - to give it a woman's touch but not overly feminine," Reinhardt says of joining the facility. Among recent upgrades to the club's interior, she oversaw the improvement of an outside venue for weddings or summer parties, complete with a photogenic modern gazebo.

She has also tapped into her culinary heritage. "I heard from people who got married here 40 years ago who said the food was fabulous. I wanted to preserve Dante Club's reputation for great family-friendly food but change the cuisine to be more seasonal and fresh. We don't have an olive tree, but pretty much every vegetable you get here is going to be fresh and beautiful."

In keeping with its locavore focus, the Dante

Club bar also sports an impressive variety of local craft beers, such as Hoppy Brewing Company, a major donor supporter of local LGBT events. "People would be surprised to know how many local breweries we have on tap," she says.

In the era when Dante Club was founded, Italian-Americans often faced prejudice and discrimination, Reinhardt notes. "There are some parallels to the LGBT community," she says. Under her management Dante Club has hosted a successful candidate brunch for RainbowPAC, the political action committee of the Rainbow Chamber of Commerce, as well as the Chamber's annual gala last September. In 2015 the club will host a cabaret event for the Sacramento Gay Men's Chorus.

Ironically, her success at Dante Club was not her chosen career path. "I swore I would never go into hospitality," Reinhardt recalls. "My parents were both militant about teaching me how to cook, testing me on different flavors. I couldn't help myself: I grew up in the business."

But her early career path took her far afield. Born in San Francisco and raised in Redding, Reinhardt joined the U.S. Army as soon as she was old enough. She initially was stationed in Stuttgart, Germany, where she worked as a document specialist handling classified materials. She later transferred to Mons, Belgium, serving 5-1/2 years as a NATO news analyst. Her military service, which took place during the controversial "Don't Ask, Don't Tell" era, made her stronger, self-reliant, and team-oriented, she says today.

After the military, as a result of her highlevel security clearance, Reinhardt landed in Washington, DC, and worked her way into the hospitality industry, serving as manager of the local Hard Rock Café for five years. After a year, she persuaded her twin brother to join her, and together the two launched a finedining restaurant, in honor of their chef father; a casual-dining "tap and vine" restaurant, in honor of their step-father; and a wine store, where pretentiousness was forbidden. By 2008 she and her brother had grown their enterprise from an initial \$2,000 investment into a multi-million-dollar revenue operation.

"I have a business degree, but the best education is starting a business," Reinhardt says. "You learn what works, what doesn't, what loopholes you have to jump through. I think you are born an entrepreneur or you're

not, and I definitely was."

After several years in business. Reinhardt returned to her Northern California roots, moving to Sacramento in 2010. She joined the staff of Dante Club in 2014.

"We operate from the mentality that it doesn't matter size of your pocketbook, your skin color or the language you speak," she says. "And because I'm gay, I'm going to make their event fabulous. I know all the extra touches that I think some people might miss."

USA Rugby and IGR Agree to Eliminate Homophobia in Rugby

SA Rugby has signed a memorandum of understanding with International Gay Rugby (IGR), setting forth a partnership that will promote a diverse and inclusive environment in all levels of rugby, working to end homophobia in all areas of the game.

In March 2015, IGR recently signed an agreement with World Rugby to collaborate on the promotion of equality and inclusivity in rugby around the world, actively seeking to globally remove homophobia from the game.

The agreement with USA Rugby focuses mainly on the domestic side of the game in the United States to ensure registered members of USA Rugby are provided with the tools and education necessary to combat discrimination, be it based on sexual orientation, perceived sexual orientation, or identification.

England rugby star James Haskell, 30, said he decided to back the statement because he was alarmed by the extent of discrimination discovered in the UK and other countries. "I feel bad for anyone who struggles to be true to who they are and feels the need to live a lie because they are worried about being rejected. I think homophobic language is still too common in sport. Even if the jokes and banter you sometimes hear are not meant to be harmful I think it creates an environment where gay people don't feel very welcome."

USA Rugby recognizes the right of any player, official, coach, and spectator to be involved in rugby without bullying,

discrimination, or exclusion of any kind, and celebrates the differences that make its members unique.

"USA Rugby is thrilled to be joining IGR in the advancement of diversity and inclusion throughout the sport of rugby, as well to eliminate homophobia from the game," said Nigel Melville, CEO of USA Rugby. "Following in World Rugby's footsteps, we are steadfast in ensuring that rugby remains and continues to grow as a sport for individuals from all walks of life."

USA Rugby will work with its own member associations, clubs, and unions to improve acceptance of LGBT members, provide educational tools to support in the elimination of perceived and institutionalized homophobia in the game, and help support IGR events.

The Mark Kendall Bingham Memorial Tournament is the flagship global event for IGR Member Clubs. Named after the gay American rugby player who died a hero on United Flight 93 on September 11, 2001, the Bingham Cup is IGR's World Cup of gay and inclusive rugby and will be hosted by the Nashville Grizzlies RFC in the "Music City" of Nashville May 22 through May 29.


















Red Dress Required — Attitude Optional

solidarity with people living with HIV/AIDS, raises awareness for HIV prevention, and more broadly draws attention to the health disparities experienced by LGBT people.

"Young gay and bisexual men account for 72 percent of new HIV infections. Every month, 1,000 youth ages 13 to 24 are infected and 60 percent of them do not know they have acquired the virus," said David Heitstuman, event organizer and LGBT Center Board President. "A hugely disproportionate number of those new infections are among homeless and marginalized LGBT youth who feel forced into situations where they are putting themselves at grave risk just to get by on the

Forty percent of homeless youth identify as LGBTQ while 20 percent of older LGBT adults report they have no one to call for support, a rate 10 times higher than their heterosexual peers. Additionally, transgender people are much more likely to be bullied, attempt suicide, experience sexual violence, and face employment, housing, and healthcare discrimination than the LGB parts of the population or their non-LGBT peers.

"These are just some of the health disparities experienced by the LGBT population that the Sacramento LGBT community Center seeks to address," said Heitstuman.

The Sacramento Red Dress Party brings a large group of diverse community members together for a night of pure fun in support of a good cause. Wearing a red dress is required, but this isn't a drag party per se: you don't have to wear a wig, makeup, heels, or nails, but you can't wear street clothes, T-shirts, pants (or anything with legs), just underwear or non-dress outfits.

of gender, age, or sexual orientation. We just want people to have fun and raise a little money at the same time," said Heitstuman.

Additionally, 250 homeless and at-risk LGBTQ youth are supported through the Q-Spot drop-in center with showers, food, laundry, mentorship, peer support, educational programs and annual events.



he Los Angeles LGBT Center is has announced that two-time Academy Award winner Jane Fonda and Academy Award nominated screenwriter Ron Nyswaner will be honored at the Center's 46th Anniversary Gala Vanguard Awards on November 7.

Fonda will receive the award from Lily Tomlin, her co-star in the hit show Grace and Frankie. Nyswaner's award will be presented by Frances McDormand.

"This honor means a lot to me. The work that the Center does for the LGBT community, its children, and extended families is profound and essential," said Fonda, who will soon appear in director Paolo Sorrentino's Youth.

She campaigned with Harvey Milk against California's anti-LGBT Briggs Initiative, fought Anita Bryant - the notorious activist who demonized LGBT with a campaign to repeal an antidiscrimination ordinance in Florida - and has been a lifelong supporter of the LGBT community and champion for human rights.

"Since long before I worked with Jane, I was in awe of her energy, activism, and generosity," said Tomlin. "Three decades later, I am still in awe of her and feel truly privileged to bestow this welldeserved honor. She has earned this over and over and over in her

lifetime."

Nyswaner is an openly gay writer, producer, documentary filmmaker, activist and pioneer in LGBT-related films. He's the Academy Award-nominated screenwriter of Philadelphia, the first major studio film to address




Sharon Jones Brings the Dap-Kings to Mondavi

PrEP

(Pre Exposure Prophylaxis)

Pre-exposure prophylaxis, or PrEP, is a prevention option for people who are at high risk of getting HIV.

It's meant to be used consistently, as a pill taken every day, and to be used with other prevention options such as condoms.

PEP

(Post Exposure Prophylaxis)

PEP is the use of antiretroviral drugs after a single high-risk event to stop HIV from making copies of itself and spreading through your body.

PEP must be started as soon as possible to be effective—and always within 3 days of a possible exposure.

If you think you may have been exposed to HIV very recently, see a doctor as soon as possible to find out if PEP is right for you.

Test & Treat

HIV testing is the foundation for both prevention and care efforts.

Early identification of infection empowers individuals to take action that benefits both their own health and the public health.

Early treatment of infected persons substantially reduces their risk of transmitting HIV to others.
