I Am Up to Here with "Pray for Orlando!"

The can say all we want to about the cause of what happened in Orlando, but the bottom line cause of violence against ALL LGBT people is religion – especially the perverted teachings of the three Abrahamic religions.

I grew up as a Fundamentalist Christian who graduated from a Fundamentalist Baptist Bible College, but I kept studying and eventually learned that the three Abrahamic religions are based on stories we consider myths.

The gods of these myths had a priest or priestess who told their worshipers what to sacrifice or what money to pay to gain their god's favor. movies) a god, just a Viking myth. Yet, all were gods in their time.

Despite the record of the gospels, which were written many years after Jesus supposedly lived, not by the men for whom they are named, Jesus Ben Joseph is not mentioned by any contemporary historian.

49 Reasons for More Action and Less Talk

Torty-nine. The number itself doesn't mean much: one set of 49, seven sets of 7. A random group of multiplication tables – a qualifier is necessary. Forty-nine people. Okay, so - 49 people.

What's the context? Forty-nine people shot and killed in the deadliest mass shooting in U.S history, and the worst act of terrorism in our nation since 9/11. One single event. Two grotesque milestones. On the same day.

Silence. The mind goes blank for a moment. Incomprehensible, just too difficult to believe. Unfathomable. It doesn't make sense. Quickly, at a dizzying pace, the mind whirs into a frenzy. Who? What? Where? When? Why? And most importantly, how? How could this happen! How could this happen, again?!

Speculation. The media goes into overdrive. Twenty-four hour news sources are inescapable. Intrusive - Pervasive -Consuming. Continuous information feeding the infatuation of needing to know to the point it becomes pornographic.

This isn't entertainment. This is life. This is tragedy. This is real!

The loved ones of those who were murdered or injured shed tears while wailing and begging for the madness to end. Mothers, fathers, daughters, sons, brothers,

Supporters of the gunman spew vitriol while glorifying their ignorance. Trying to break away is difficult. This shouldn't hurt so much, I should be used to this.

Déjà vu. Politicians puffing out their chests offering rehearsed sentiment, familiar outwordmagazine.com

catchphrases, and election-style support while offering handshakes and hugs.

Rallies and vigils are hurriedly organized for collective mourning in an attempt to create a sense of belonging in a world where many still do not believe we belong. Religious leaders offering up expressions of hope. Can I get an Amen? But it isn't enough. It never is. What happens next?

Pulse. Do you feel it? It is still beating. It may be faint, it may be weak, but there is a pulse. Eventually, it will get stronger – we will get stronger. Perhaps, that is why we must keep going. The pulse beats within each of us.

It is up to us to decide what's next because 49 people – it is not finite. No, 49 people are the family, friends, colleagues, and neighbors who knew these individuals that were murdered simply because they embodied what the gunman despised in his twisted mind – 49 people are the communities reeling from this act of hatred and violence – 49 people are those standing together (loving together!) demanding less talk, less politicking, and for once - just once, more

It is time to make the few in power listen to the 49 whose voices are no longer with us, but can still be heard.

Forty-nine It is more than just a number. It is you. It is me.

Gay men, we don't care about your kidneys and bones ONLY THE MONEY!

In a cover story in the Los Angeles Times on May 29, 2016* it is documented that Gilead, the maker of HIV drugs that most positive patients as well as those on PrEP take, intentionally held a much less toxic version of their drug off the market in order to extend their patents and make tens of billions of dollars. Gilead stopped research on a less toxic version of its core drug tenofovir (marketed under different names in combination with other drugs) in 2004. Earlier this year AIDS Healthcare Foundation (AHF) sued Gilead to invalidate their patents based on them withholding the updated version of the drug. Gilead's response was they "have no duty to develop, test, seek approval of, or launch the new product on any particular timetable."

Widespread reports of kidney damage and bone loss due to tenofovir have been known since 2003 and federal authorities several times warned Gilead about downplaying the risks. Nevertheless, Gilead with the assistance of the CDC is promoting the older more toxic version of tenofovir to young HIV negative men for PrEP. They never bothered to seek approval of the safer drug because they wanted to wait until the very last moment to get approval of the new less toxic version so that their patents would be extended for another twenty years.

Gilead has spent hundreds of millions of dollars seeking approval for PrEP, paying doctors to endorse it, funding governments and community groups to promote and advertise it. Yet Gilead says that they stopped the research on the less toxic drug because they needed to shift their research to other medications. However, they had \$11 billion in 2011 to buy Pharmasset, which had the rights to a drug that cured Hepatitis C. They turned around and brought Sovaldi and Harvoni to market and are charging \$84,000 and \$94,000 respectively for them. These ridiculous prices are causing rationing which prevents most Hep C patients from receiving these drugs.

AHF has fought for lower drug prices for decades. When we started treating in Africa in 2002 we paid \$5000 per patient per year for the HIV cocktail, today we pay \$100. We lobbied. We sued. We protested. That's what passionate advocates do. It is high time that the CDC and AIDS organizations cut the cord to big drug companies and return to the roots of AIDS activism which does not include feasting at the table of Pharma greed.




Sacramento Stands with Orlando



109 EQCA-Endorsed Candidates Win Primary Election Victories

quality California has announced that 109 of its 116 endorsed candidates won enough votes in their individual races in the California primary election to advance to the November 8 general election or to win their race outright.

"This election year is of enormous importance to the LGBT community," said Rick Zbur, executive director of Equality California. "With the future of the U.S. Supreme Court in play, an open U.S. Senate seat and the strength of the California LGBT Legislative Caucus at stake, this is not an election year for LGBT people to choose not to vote. We congratulate all of our endorsed candidates on their primary races and will be working to secure the victories of our primary winners in November."

Equality California was the first major LGBT civil rights organization to endorse Hillary Clinton for U.S. president. Clinton won the California presidential primary with 56 percent of the vote.

In addition, California Attorney General Kamala Harris, Equality California's endorsed candidate for U.S. Senate, will now face Congresswoman Loretta Sánchez in the November election.

All four openly LGBT incumbents endorsed in legislative races by Equality California – LGBT Legislative Caucus Chair Assesmblymember Susan Eggman, Senator Ricardo Lara, Senator Cathleen Galgiani and Assemblymember Evan Low – will advance to the November election.

Five additional strong LGBT candidates – former Assembly Speaker Toni Atkins (running for Senate District 39), San Francisco Supervisor Scott Wiener (running for SD 11), San Diego City Councilmember Todd Gloria (running for Assembly District 78), Sabrina Cervantes (running for AD 60) and Greg Rodriguez (running for AD 42) – will also advance to November.

In San Diego County, three Equality California-endorsed, openly LGBT candidates won local contests. Equality Californiaendorsed candidate Dave Roberts will face Encinitas Mayor Kristin Gaspar for his seat on the San Diego County Board of Supervisors and endorsed candidate Georgette Gómez will face Ricardo Flores to represent San Diego City Council District 9.

Endorsed candidate Chris Ward earned more than 50 percent of the vote and was elected to replace Todd Gloria as councilmember for District 3, avoiding a November runoff election.





The Legend of Tarzan, Finding Dory & The Conjuring 2 by Chris Narloch

In troubled times like these, when you can be blown away at your company Christmas party or at church during bible study or while dancing the night away with friends, I look to art for comfort and solace because that's what makes sense to me in a sometimes senseless world.

Read on for details of three current (or upcoming) movies that should provide temporary escape from the trying times we find ourselves living in.

Finding Dory

I don't get a chance to watch the *Ellen* talk show as often as I would like, but when I do have time to catch it I am always impressed with DeGeneres' positivity and lack of mean-spiritedness.

The comedienne's two fun family films (Finding Nemo and now Finding Dory) exude that same sweet spirit and gentle sense of humor, and contain colorful, animated eye candy to boot.

If you saw *Finding Nemo*, you'll recall that Dory (DeGeneres) is a wide-eyed, blue tang fish who suffers from memory loss every 10 seconds or so.

The one thing Dory can remember is that she somehow became separated from her parents as a child.

With help from her friends Nemo (Hayden Rolence) and Marlin (Albert Brooks), Dory embarks on an epic adventure to find her folks.

DeGeneres, Brooks, and Ed O'Neill (as Hank, a shape-shifting, scene-stealing octopus) were born to do voice work, and the eye-popping 3D animation is Pixar at its finest.

The Conjuring 2

Scary movies don't work without good actors who buy into the absurd situations around them, and compel the audience to buy in also. Horror movie acting doesn't get much better than the chemistry between Vera Farmiga and Patrick Wilson in *The Conjuring* films.

As real-life ghost busters Lorraine and Ed Warren, a married couple of paranormal investigators who helped put the Amityville case and other famous 'hauntings' on the map, Farmiga and Wilson give these movies class

In 1977, the pair comes out of a selfimposed sabbatical and travels to Enfield, a borough in north London. There, they meet Peggy Hodgson, an overwhelmed single mother of four who tells the couple that something evil is in her home.

Ed and Lorraine believe her story when the youngest daughter starts to show signs of demonic possession. As the Warrens try to help the besieged girl, they become the next target of the malicious spirits.

The Legend of Tarzan

You can't ask for better cheap thrills than the sight of a shirtless, pumped-up Alexander Skarsgard running through the jungle in the trailer for this new action flick.

I wasn't able to see *The Legend of Tarzan* before our deadline, but I am anxiously looking forward to another version of Edgar Rice Burroughs' timeless tale of adventure and jungle love.

Skarsgard, the hunky former star of HBO's *True Blood*, should make a great Tarzan. The film also stars Oscar nominees Samuel L. Jackson and Djimon Hounsou, Oscar winners Jim Broadbent and Christoph Waltz and Margot Robbie.

It has been years since the man once known as Tarzan (Skarsgård) left the jungles of Africa behind for a gentrified life as John Clayton, Lord Greystoke, with his beloved wife, Jane (Robbie) at his side.

Now, he has been invited back to the Congo to serve as a trade emissary of Parliament, unaware that he is a pawn in a deadly convergence of greed and revenge, masterminded by the Belgian, Leon Rom (Waltz). But those behind the murderous plot have no idea what they are about to unleash in Tarzan.

screenplay by Adam Cozad and Craig Brewer, based on the *Tarzan* stories created by Burroughs.





Freddy Niblack: Checkered Dreams

Preddy Niblack is the first openly gay driver in the Indy Car Series, but that's not all that defines him. As is the case for so many athletes, homosexual or not, he is also a person looking to accomplish a dream.

A dream he's had since his childhood days spent carving a race track through neighbors' yards on his go-kart as the sound of the nearby Indianapolis 500 engulfed the air surrounding his family's Speedway, IN home.

"I literally grew up two blocks from the track, and I was born in May, which happens to be the month that all the festivities for the 500 go on," Niblack says. "My mom said I would scream and cry until she'd sit me on the porch and let me hear the Indy cars. They were like a lullaby. As long as there were racecars and motors, I was good."

Niblack, 44, is still longing to be part of the roar that hummed as his childhood's theme. He came out as a teenager and has traveled down a bumpy road filled with discrimination in his professional career. While he was racing in the mini Indy series in 1992 he was subject of hatred remarks that led to his departure. "Someone put a poster on my race trailer that said 'Aids cures fags," he says, "and so that team owner didn't want me anymore."

Niblack then went to Europe, hoping for a better opportunity, but more of the same transpired. "People over there were even less accepting," he says. "It didn't matter if you had a podium finish, a first-place finish or a top-five, you were still the gay driver."

"With some teams gay men are viewed as the weak link, which is funny because some of my times and finishes were a lot better than my counterparts, or my teammates," he adds. "Instead of being happy for me it became a source of a pang."

That's not the case anymore, however.

Niblack is back home after signing on to race for Indianapolis-based Top Kart USA, which didn't even know he was gay when he was signed. He will be competing in the Freedom 100 on May 27 at the Indianapolis Motor Speedway, and for the first time, his presence in the driver's seat isn't because of his sexual orientation or the sponsors and revenue that would coincide. It's about his talent.

"Here, it was all about what I brought to the table," Niblack says. "There wasn't this Indy car mentality. And what I mean by that is a lot of Indy car people, they forget to be human, and they forget what this sport is about. It's to have fun. It becomes a money situation, and yes, here, it takes money to do what we do, but it's also really fun. We can laugh and have a good time and be ourselves. For the first time in a long time I feel welcome. The gay thing isn't really brought up unless I bring it up."

That's not to say his sexual orientation and its impact on the racing community doesn't matter to Niblack. It means plenty. In his 22 years on the track, no one from the LGBT community has ever come to see him in his element. That changed on March 22, when Indianapolis's JJ Gufreda, the president of GEI, Inc. – the first transgender-owned company certified as LGBTBE by the National Gay and Lesbian Chamber of Commerce – attended a testing at Lucas Oil Raceway.

"I was on the track, going about 160, 170 [miles per hour], and when I saw JJ, when I was in my racecar on the track I waved to her," Niblack says. "To see JJ walk up was

such a milestone, such a sense of pride, such a sense of finally. JJ wasn't there to flip her hair or challenge the bathroom rules; she was solely there to support me. And in my entire career I cannot think of a more defining moment than seeing JJ walk up."

Niblack wants this to be the start of a pattern, to make the LGBT community feel as welcome at the racetrack as Top Kart USA and Gufreda have made him feel.

"To see someone come in who is different, who is out of the ordinary – and guess what, they are today's ordinary," he says. "They are today's human beings. The gay community, take your place. Be supportive. Be proud of your own people. Not everybody dresses up like Tina Turner and lip-syncs for their life. Not all gay men are strippers or escorts or wear eyeliner. Embrace diversity. Embrace our differences."

Niblack says he simply races better when he's happy, and after he saw Gufreda he increased his lap speed by 1.5 seconds. "I had this feeling of self worth, this feeling of strength in numbers, and this feeling of love," he says. "That's huge for me. An honor, and I'm very grateful. I can't imagine if I had 100 people from the community there, what I would do."

Including the Freedom 100, Niblack is scheduled to race 13 times this summer – and while the Indianapolis 500 isn't one of them he plans on inhabiting one of those cars his childhood self lived to hear one day soon

The 500 may be the ultimate goal for Niblack and Top Kart USA, but this year is about honing their craft as a team. Top Kart USA is predominately self-funded, and just this past March was the first time his number-22 car spent time on the ground, let alone a track.

"We're not focused on Indy Car this year," he says. "We're focused on the cars that we have, and making them well. We're not begrudging about what we have and angry about what we don't have. We're happy about what we have and focused on what we

have. We want a winning car. We want a winning team."

Niblack brings his individual sponsors to Top Kart USA, but unlike other stops on his road that's not the reason behind his presence. "We don't need that sponsor money to create something," says Blake Deister, the team's co-owner. "It's already created."

"From the front of the house to the back of the house it is every single person that works on that team to get that driver into that car to win races or be competitive," adds Niblack. "The owners of a lot of the larger teams, without those drivers and those drivers' sponsors they wouldn't be where they are. It's not just about one person's brand here. It's about the team as a whole. Yes, I do drive for this team, and, yes, I did bring sponsors, but these people own the shop, the semis, the cars, the mechanics, the tools."

With all of the pieces but the driver upon his arrival, the immediate acceptance of Deister and the Top Kart USA team was a weight off Niblack's shoulders. Here, he can just race, without distaste for his sexuality in the undercurrent, waiting to rear its discriminatory head.

"It is such a small part of my life, but it is who I am," he says, regarding his homosexuality. "It's just not a factor here. Now, at other places, it was 'we don't want you going here, we don't want you going there, we don't want you dealing with this publication, we don't want you dealing with this gay event. Well, I am a gay man. My community, I want their support and their love, and I'm not going to be something that I'm not,

and that's the most important thing."

That community would have much reason to cheer. Not just because of what he represents, but because of his talent, and that of his team.

"I have the same big visions and the same big dreams, but I'm intelligent enough to know that you have to start here before you can get here," Niblack says. "With this team, we have the facility to grow. We have the technology, the equipment, the manpower. These guys will be here until midnight if that's what it takes."

And so will Niblack, with his childhood's lullaby forever in his head, striving to accomplish just one his many goals, hoping to influence a community along the way.





