Poll Finds One in Eight CA Voters Identifies as LGBT

quality California has announced that a poll conducted by Tulchin Research in January 2017 has found that 12 percent of California voters identify as being members of the LGBT community.

The online survey of 600 registered voters asked "are you a member of the LGBT community." The answers showed notable divisions by age, with 16 percent of respondents ages 18-29 identifying as LGBT, while 10 percent of those aged 40 and above did so. The survey shows significantly more people identifying as part of the LGBT community across all age categories than has traditionally been the case in previous polls conducted by telephone.

This poll gives us new data indicating that the number of LGBT people who are part of the California electorate is significantly higher than previously estimated," said Rick Zbur, executive director of Equality California. "Because of our decades-long fight for full equality and social justice, it's not surprising that LGBT people are especially engaged in the political process and appear to make up a significant percentage of the voting public."

LGBT organizations have traditionally estimated that LGBT people comprise four to 10 percent of the general population, based in part on surveys that set the number at the

low end of that range. Homophobia and a lack of acceptance make many LGBT people unwilling to disclose their sexual orientation or gender identity publicly or to a stranger over the phone.

"While this is only one survey, it used sound methodology to examine a statistically valid sample of California registered voters and demonstrates that LGBT people make up one of California's largest voting blocs," said Zbur.

"Politicians take note: with 12 percent of the electorate, LGBT people make up one of the largest voting blocs in California and our issues must not be ignored," said Assemblymember Evan Low (D-Silicon Valley), chair of the California Legislative LGBT Caucus. "With strength in numbers, LGBT voters stand ready to hold their elected representatives accountable."

Tulchin Research pollsters believe that the wording of the question and the anonymity of completing a survey online, rather than disclosing personal information to a stranger over the phone, contributed to higher numbers identifying as LGBT.

Hate Groups Increase for Second Consecutive Year

he number of hate groups in the United States rose for a second year in a row in 2016 as the radical right was energized by the candidacy of Donald Trump, according to the Southern Poverty Law Center's (SPLC) annual census of hate groups and other extremist organizations.

The most dramatic growth was the near-tripling of anti-Muslim hate groups from 34 in 2015 to 101 last year.

The SPLC also released an in-depth profile of the Alliance Defending Freedom (ADF), an anti-LGBT hate group. Leaders of the legal advocacy organization and its affiliated lawyers have regularly demonized LGBT people, falsely linking them to pedophilia, calling them "evil" and a threat to children and society, and blaming them for the "persecution of devout Christians." The group also has supported the criminalization of homosexuality in several countries.

The growth has been accompanied by a rash of crimes targeting Muslims, including an arson that destroyed a mosque in Victoria, Texas, just hours after the Trump administration announced an executive order suspending travel from some predominantly Muslim countries.

The latest FBI statistics show that hate crimes against Muslims grew by 67 percent in 2015, the year in which Trump launched his campaign.



Sac Equality Awards to Honor Three LGBT Champions

Director Alice Kessler for their years of extraordinary service to the LGBT community at its 2017 Sacramento Equality Awards.

This year's Sacramento Equality Awards will take place Monday, March 27, 2017 at the Sacramento Public Library Galleria, at 828 I St. in Sacramento.

Assembly Speaker Anthony Rendon (D-Paramount), recipient of this year's Vanguard Leadership Award, is one of the LGBT community's staunchest allies in the California Legislature.

"Speaker Rendon has been instrumental since becoming speaker in supporting passage of legislation vital to improving the lives of LGBT people," said Rick Zbur, executive director of Equality California. "During his time in the Assembly, Speaker Rendon has been a powerful advocate not only for LGBT people, but for children, education, a clean environment and for all marginalized communities. Since the November presidential election, he has helped lead the charge against the regressive policies of the Trump Administration and has been a constant voice in support of California values of inclusion and tolerance." Asm. Evan Low (D-Campbell) will receive this year's Equality Leadership Award.

"Assemblymember Low authored cutting edge legislation that aims to address the wave of anti-LGBT laws sweeping the country by helping to keep California taxpayer dollars out of the coffers of states that discriminate," said Zbur. "Even before becoming its chair, he helped maintain and increase the size and strength of the LGBT Caucus and mentored LGBT candidates at the local level to build a bench of candidates for state senate and assembly. His work will help maintain an invaluable 'seat at the table' for LGBT people in the state legislature for years to come."

Alice Kessler, recipient of this year's Community Leadership Award, serves as Equality California's outside legislative director, heading the organization's legislative work in Sacramento.

Former Elk Grove Police Trainee Files Discrimination Lawsuit

former officer with the Elk Grove Police Department, who is openly gay, has filed a discrimination lawsuit against that organization claiming he was terminated based on his

sexual orientation.

The plaintiff, Jeremy Lemire, was a probationary police officer who was hired by the Elk Grove Police Department in June 2014, and was terminated on February 25, 2016.

Before being hired by the EGPD, Lemire, age 34, served in the United States Army and as a civilian contractor between 2003 and 2014, including two terms in combat, and was honorably discharged in 2014. He currently lives in Yuba City, CA.

Attorneys representing Lemire are Lawrance A. Bohm of the California-wide BOHM Law Group (Sacramento, Los Angeles, San Diego,) and Robert Boucher, of counsel to the BOHM Law Group and founder of Sacramento-based Boucher Law. Bohm is a well-known trial lawyer renowned for winning what are believed to be the two largest single-plaintiff employment verdicts in U.S. history, each in excess of \$ 100-million.

According to the Verified Complaint [34-2017-00206276] recently filed in the Superior Court of the State of California/ County of Sacramento, Lemire alleges that he was fired because of his sexual orientation – he describes the working conditions and co-workers he was exposed to at the department as hostile.

"Living through the discrimination I experienced at Elk Grove Police Department

made me feel like a second-class citizen," Lemire said in a released statement. "I felt degraded by my superior officers, and was thrust into an environment of fear, anxiety and constant stress. An overwhelming weight, like a mountain, crushed every aspect of my life, both professionally and personally. I was made to feel like a degenerate, unworthy to be accepted and treated like an equal. I lived in constant fear that if those around me found out about my sexual orientation, that the leadership would also find out, and I would lose my job."

He adds, "I observed continuous degrading jokes, slurs and comments – all of which reaffirmed my fears. The leadership minimized my complaint and refused to conduct a proper self-evaluation of the pervasive environment and atmosphere condoned within their department. I was targeted by the leadership, and unable to function without intense scrutiny. Without reprieve from department leadership, I felt crippled, unable to comprehend why this behavior, environment and atmosphere would be tolerated and overlooked in today's society. By filing this lawsuit, I want to ensure that what happened to me with the EGPD does not happen to anyone else in the future. I want to ensure that our law enforcement agencies truly reflect the diversity of the people they serve."

Lemire began his field training in September 2014, following graduation from the police academy. Over the course of this training period, the lawsuit describes several instances where Lemire allegedly endured homophobic behavior from fellow officers. In one case, the lawsuit implies two officers did not seriously respond to a service call made by Lemire during an alleged sexual assault involving three gay men.

In another incident, the lawsuit claims Mr. Lemire's supervising sergeant began a rant about the TV show "Modern Family" while in a break room at the police station. In that series, two of the main characters are a married Gay couple. Mr. Lemire claims that the sergeant said, "I can't believe they are allowed to air this shit on TV. I just can't support a show that displays such despicable



Briefs Filed in Supreme Court Supporting Gavin Grimm and Transgender Rights

Individuals and institutions from across the country representing a diverse and extraordinary cross-section of interests, perspectives, and concerns filed friend-of-court briefs in support of Gavin Grimm, a 17-year-old high school student from Virginia whose case against his school board over their refusal to allow him access to the boys' restroom at school because he is transgender will be heard by the Supreme Court on March 28.

"The overwhelming level of support demonstrated for Gavin from fellow transgender youth, business leaders, educators, faith leaders, medical professionals, political leaders, and more underscores the urgency of stopping these attempts at expelling trans people from public life," said James Esseks, director of the ACLU's LGBT Project.

California Attorney General Xavier Becerra joined 18 other state attorneys general in filing a friend-of-the-court brief in the case, *Gloucester County School Board v. G.G.*

Washington DC Named Finalist to Host Gay Games XI

Washington, DC's bid to host Gay Games XI has been named one of three finalists for the games to be held in July of 2022. Washington was chosen from among eight bidding cities and will join Guadalajara (MX) and Hong Kong (CN) in the final round to determine which city will be chosen.

As a finalist, DC will receive a visit from the Federation of Gay Games (FGG) for a site visit in early May. The delegation will visit and inspect all proposed sites for Games events, evaluate the logistics for the Games, and appraise the level of community support for the bid.

"We will host a large community rally to show the FGG how deep the support for this bid is in DC," said Minor. "It's vital to the bid's success to show how much DC wants to host these Games. We want everyone in DC, not just the LGBT community, to join us to support this event."

South Florida Is an LGBT Playground at the Beach by Ed Walsh

GBTs were a big part of the revitalization of South Florida beginning in Key West in the 1970s, Miami Beach in the 1980s, and Fort Lauderdale in the 1990s. The gay influence is woven into the political and cultural tapestry that continues to keep those cities hot tourist destinations.

If you want to combine all three cities, you could easily start by flying into the Fort Lauderdale-Hollywood International Airport. Connecting flights from Sacramento, Los Angeles or San Francisco can get you there in about seven hours or less.

After spending a few nights in Fort Lauderdale, you could drive 45-minutes south to Miami, spend time there and continue on the 3.5 hour drive to Key West. With a one-way car rental, you could fly back home on a connecting flight from Key West. **Fort Lauderdale**

Miami

Miami Beach's South Beach has an official gay beach known as the 12th Street Beach, you will know it by the rainbow flags planted in the sand in front of the beach.

The boutique hotel, Gaythering (www. gaythering.com), as it's name implies is marketed toward the LGBT community, but it is straight friendly and is located at the west end of Lincoln Road.

One of the best ways to see the Greater Miami area is on the "hop on and hop off" tourist buses. A couple of companies offer

The Greater Fort Lauderdale area includes Wilton Manors (pop 12,000) that is second only to Provincetown, Mass as the nation's gayest city per capita. Wilton Manors also has the largest number of bars, restaurants and shops of any place in Florida. Most of the gay resorts are closer to the ocean, in Fort Lauderdale city limits, about five miles from Wilton Manors' nightlife.

Of course, Fort Lauderdale is best known for its beach, lined by its signature white rolling wave wall. People often refer to the section of the beach by the street that intersects with it. The two sections of the beach that are most popular with gays are at Sebastian Street and on the far northern end of the wave wall at 18th street. The latter is more popular with locals.

Fort Lauderdale, like Palm Springs, is known for its wonderful gay resorts. The city's largest, Worthington Resorts (www. theworthington.com), is three resorts combined into one with a total of 63 rooms, three swimming pools, two hot tubs and a small but well equipped fitness room.

The upscale 33-room Grand Hotel and Spa (www.grandresort.net) is next door to the Worthington and includes a fabulous spa on the property that is open to guests and non-guests alike.

Key West

Key West was LGBT friendly long before it was fashionable. Beginning in the 1970s, gays helped revitalize businesses along Duval Street, the city's main drag, and a bounty of gay resorts sprung up in place of run-down smaller hotels in the city's historic Old Town.

While many of the formerly gay resorts have since gone mainstream, Key West still has a handful of gay hotels that deservedly have a loyal repeat clientele. The gay men's 34-room hotel, Island House Key West (www. islandhousekeywest.com/), deservedly ranks at the top or near the top of lists of the best gay resorts in the US. It has a 24-hour cafe and is open for day passes, making it popular with locals.

Key West has an active LGBT business association, the Key West Business Guild, that maintains the great Web site, www. gaykeywestfl.com, which lists information on LGBT nightlife, special events, and tours.

Hot Stops in Santa Barbara for Some Great Wine by Diana Kienle

Www.ineries of the middle and southern Central Coast of California are mostly casual visits and offer a very down to earth experience, and many are small family operations with simple tasting rooms.

This may well be attributable to the late development of wineries in the area. It was not until the 1980s that viticulture took off here and in 1970, there were only 171 acres of grapes in Santa Barbara County. By 1998, there were 16,500 acres generating great revenue.

During a day of wine tasting with friends, we visited Stolpman Vineyards and Beckmen Vineyards. Both are great examples of family wineries making a mark in the Santa Barbara area.

Stolpman was a very pleasant surprise! Knowing the climate and the varietals that do best in that area, they have a great line of Sangiovese. The line-up included three different bottles that vary in price and complexity.

Inspired, we bought all three for different occasions. They also produce some deep and rich Syrahs, which I also purchased. Chris, whose business card title is "Passionista," orchestrated our visit and stated that this title best describes his work at Stolpman, because he loves the wine and enjoys talking to folks about it every day.

Beckmen Vineyards was a bigger property with a very extensive line of wines, yet they are also family owned. The winemaker is Steve Beckmen whose original training was in archaeology. The tasting room was big, bright and airy with an outside patio area that I wanted to visit since I had previously enjoyed their Grenache.

On this day, we were greeted and served by the Tasting Room Manager and he walked us through their line of wines from the estate. The wines showed depth and richness with excellent fruit. I was impressed with the Syrahs and walked away with several wines to add to my collection.

While the Santa Barbara area is young, it shows great promise for the future and many talented wine makers are calling this area home. It is worth your time to visit this beautiful area.

If you're looking to really treat yourself, you could stay at the Bacara Resort for a peaceful time to relax and enjoy the area, which includes quaint towns like Solvang and Los Olivos. While we were there, we had a chance to explore Los Olivos and enjoyed lunch at Sides Hardware and Shoes, where I had the best hamburger I've ever had! But, I digress... Enjoy!

Inn of the Dove, Bensalem, PA

Victorian Mansion Bed and Breakfast, Santa Barbara, California

Indulge your deepest, darkest fantasies at the Victorian Mansion Bed and Breakfast – which National Geographic calls one of the "quirkiest hotels around" – smack in the heart of Santa Barbara Wine Country. Quench your already thirsty loins with tastings in the area then return to this oasis of intimate imagination (pack costumes for an even more satisfying experience) and your suite decked out to the nines in 1950s, Egyptian, Roman, pirate, gypsy and French themes. Refuel at sunrise with a hot gourmet breakfast delivered bedside via private butler – which, coincidentally, is the perfect time to put your pants back on. thevick.com




Hôtel Gaythering, Miami Beach

B ast of Eden, Summer of '42, Same Time, Next Year, Cujo, and The Russian Are Coming! The Russians Are Coming! are just a few of the great movies that were filmed in and around the beautiful city of Mendocino, on the coast of Northern California.

Today, Mendocino isn't just a great place to shoot a movie. It's also the perfect place to enjoy watching some of the finest cinema from around the globe, at a world-class yet cozy film festival.

2017 will mark a dozen years for this gem

This celebration of the community explores the future of food and the history of wine, featuring films from around the world paired with special events that highlight the best of the Anderson Valley.

Last year's 11th Annual Mendocino Film Festival featured 66 films total, including two Academy Award winners, three Academy Award nominees, three California premieres, and one U.S. premiere.

Five cities hosted events last year, including Mendocino, Fort Bragg, Willits, and Point Arena, at eight different venues, including an enormous white tent that housed one of the most memorable

of a film festival, and you can join the fun this June 1-4 for one of the most unique and scenic film events anywhere.

The uniqueness of the Mendocino area allows the festival to celebrate not only film but also food and wine, with exciting programs such as the popular Cinema in the Vineyards, which showcase agrarian and country living, sustainable farming, and the screenings I attended.

Equally memorable was the beautiful North Cliff Hotel, on South Main Street in Fort Bragg, where I enjoyed breathtaking ocean views from my very comfortable room, which was a short drive from all of the Festival venues.

Over the years, the Mendocino Film Festival has established a reputation for presenting award-winning international and independent films and has become renowned on the festival circuit, drawing filmmakers and attendees from around the world while maintaining its commitment to the local community.

Featuring special events, filmmaker Q & A's, and panels, the festival offers the unique opportunity to meet filmmakers and film aficionados in an intimate setting while enjoying the striking natural beauty of Mendocino, which has inspired generations of artists.

Eating was amazing, not sure why Amsterdam doesn't get that reputation as we ate deliciously every single meal and definitely more affordable than San Francisco and NYC. There are so many bars to choose from, great Dutch beer including the famous Heineken. And the shopping was another great surprise as it has very unique styles and prices attractive.

Lastly, of course you have to check out their coffee shops, which are not really coffee shops but legal cannabis shops where you can taste dozens of types and give you the fix that you need to keep experiencing the city. When in Rome ...

Where to stay.

Canal House. Definitely an elaborate small boutique hotel, and part of the SLH collection, and our home away from home in Amsterdam. Located right on Keizersgracht street, one of the main and most luxurious canals with the typical architecture from the Dutch Golden Age, with narrow and tall intricate buildings with the most picturesque windows lined up the walls.

What to see.

Vincent Van Gogh Museum was my favorite museum. Book tickets in advance and skip the lines. The most impressive collection that I've seen, so colorful and so deep. Rijksmuseum is another impressive museum that was recently renovated and just re-opened a couple of years ago.

Anne Frank House-Museum is a time capsule that takes you back to World War II in Amsterdam and the way Anne and her family lived in the attic of that place. Humbling experience. Best to buy ticket in advance for a specific time and skip the lines.

Flower Market is open year long and the best time to see it is Spring and Summer seasons. You can still experience the market in Winter with all the different tulip bulbs, souvenirs, and Dutch memorabilia. All laid out alongside the canal as Gay Amsterdam.

Did anyone doubt Amsterdam is gay friendly? This was even impressive for me as one of the friendliest cities with tons of things to do for gays and lesbians. I'm not usually about narrowing options to gay alternatives, but there's no difference here and you can find the spots all over the city. The city has an openness to lifestyles, no judgment and embracing diversity that is really hard to compare to other cities in the world.

Prik is a small gay club with cool European pop music, good cocktails and the crowd is very friendly.

The Eagle and The Cuckoo's Nest are a little more alternative as they are more leather and S&M bars, still friendly and cool to have a beer and it's up to you to explore beyond that. Totally safe, friendly and fun.

Gay Pride is probably the best holiday to spend in Amsterdam, which is usually the first or second week of August, right in the middle of the summer and the entire town is a celebrationparade for a week. Check out the specific dates and book in advance as the place is party central for everyone. I can only imagine with warm weather and celebrations all over. Fun!

Lastly.

The Heineken Experience is something that everyone should try. Touring the oldest brewery in town, learning about its history and why it's considered a landmark was fascinating. Not to mention the brewing process, tasting and all fun experiences that they have throughout the tour. Special tip: go there on your birthday, get in the contest of jugging a beer and get your own Dutch birthday beer mug. Priceless.

There is o much to see, do, experience in this amazing city, so make sure you spend a few days there.

id you ever go somewhere with someone who seems to know everybody? That's what it's like to read The Art of the Affair. It's all about who you know. had "a short affair" with writer

The guy who bags your groceries might have stock tips for you. A co-worker introduces you to your next best friend. You find a great restaurant from your stylist, a new job from a former classmate, and your neighbor gives you gardening advice.

It's all about who you know or, as in the new book The Art of the Affair by Catherine Lacy and Forsyth Harmon, it's who you've dallied with.

Somehow, in some way, the people you meet leave fingerprints on your life. A laugh you'll never forget, a bon mot you'll quote, or even an attitude can be a memorable springboard for an idea.


That goes doubly for creative types, for whom romantic (or platonic) relationships, their 'carnage of affairs" could lead to 'countless works of art." These unions, whether legal or otherwise, also left a tangle of threads between many artists and writers.

Essayist and editor Edmund Wilson, for instance, helped launch the career of Anaïs Nin, who later wrote erotica. Monroe, of course, had her share of affairs, too, as well as a friendship with Truman Capote, who was repeatedly insulted by none other than Tennessee Williams.

Williams was no fan of Tallulah Bankhead, and the two publicly snarked at one another for years. Bankhead was an exhibitionist and

which, presumably, included her lover, Billie Holiday.

Oh, and playwright Williams ..? He was a friend of Gore Vidal, who also knew Truman Capote and Anaïs Nin ...

Author Catherine Lacey and illustrator Forsyth Harmon play a sort of Six Degrees of Kevin Bacon in their book - except, not surprisingly, Bacon isn't here. Instead, readers are taken back many decades to look at the dalliances and relationships of artists and stars of the early Twentieth century, and because very few contemporary artists grace these pages, there may be many times when you won't recognize the people among the threads. That can be remedied through inference, but a better explanation (at least for some artists) might have been nice, as would an index.

Still, I liked the tidbits in this book. the mini-factlets between ties, and the obvious delight that author and artist lend to the love affairs they so diligently discovered. Light, gossipy, and a little scandalous, The Art of the Affair shows that it's who you know that's important - and I know you'll like it.

Basically, we had to go back to the original 1907 novel that the movie was based on which is in the public domain, and anything that was only in the movie had to be removed from our show. Ultimately, that actually made it stronger and better and funnier. **Tell me about Eliot Rose and her Sacramento connection.**


We went through an agency based in Portland, Oregon, and they did the match for us. Then we had a Skype session with the potential surrogate who happened to live in the Sacramento area. We liked her very much, and she liked us. It's not a traditional surrogacy in that we used an egg donor, but we had a wonderful experience, and now we have an incredibly healthy, happy baby.

How has your life changed, both personally and professionally, since becoming a father?

Well, it's the cliche of all time that having a child changes your life on every level, but that has certainly been my experience. And there is no preparing yourself for that. So, that said, at the ripe age of five months plus a couple of days into fatherhood, I will say that everything has new meaning. There is someone else for who I'm responsible, and my feelings about my work, and how that fits into my life, have changed, deeply, and irrevocably. I am part of a family, which is very, very new to me. And she's pretty cute, too!



needed about 20,000 miles on a combination of Star Alliance carriers to maintain my all-important status when flying "the friendly skies." The internet search took a lot of patience.

A travel website is designed to get a person from A to B as quickly and economically as possible – not to plan mileage runs. I persevered. My options slowly began to download. Dubai? Too hot. Calcutta? Isn't that where Mother Teresa did her thing? Dhaka? I don't even know where or what that is! Johannesburg – I liked the sound of that!

I'd heard South Africa was nice. Beautiful beaches. Lush wine country. Rich history with the likes of Mandela and Tutu leading the way. Friendly ties with our country (and no rogue mosquitoes) meant no visas or shots were required – just a valid Passport and I could be on my way.

I booked my airline ticket – Sacramento to San Francisco to Los Angeles to Frankfort to Johannesburg – 57 hours in the air or in airports. But this routing contained the needed miles. OK – now what?

I Googled "things to do in South Africa" and SAFARI was first on the list. Kruger National Park, larger in size than most New England states, would have required another flight. After 57 hours, I thought a nice drive would be more my speed.

After a few more internet searches I stumbled upon Entabeni Safari Conservancy.

The images were stunning. It looked not at all unlike Sedona – red rocks, steep cliffs, other-worldly formations that seemed more like the set from a si-fi movie than real life. And animals!

The Big 5 is what you want to see when visiting Africa: Elephant, lion, leopard, cape buffalo and rhinoceros. Entabeni guaranteed to have all five in residence on 22,000 thousand acres of unspoiled savannas. They also boasted cabins for visitors. (With all those lions wondering around I decided early on I did not want to sleep in a tent, though I would learn hippos kill more people every year than lions and elephants combined!)

I booked five days there which included the cabin; daily breakfast, lunch and dinner; two safaris daily at dawn and dusk; and transport to and from the airport. All this for less than the price of the plane ticket. It sounded too good to be true. And it was ...

Shortly after my arrival I met Jimmy Cricket, resident ranger and safari guide extraordinaire. His instincts were as welltuned as those of the animals. He could just sense where they would be. In total I would do eight safaris and we'd see the Big 5 along with zebra, giraffe, cheetah, impala, warthog, kudu, hippopotamus, gnu, monkey and



baboon - just to name a few.

The awesomeness of Africa is difficult to put into words. Imagine being deep in the bush, half a planet from home, completely surrounded by a pack of pachyderms. Or coming upon a pride of lions relaxing nonchalantly after a kill. Finding yourself in the middle of a herd of impalas so large you can't see where they begin or end. Witnessing a female cheetah making her choice from two interested suitors, and eventually finding neither quite to her liking. Lying in bed and listening to the resident hippo rooting outside your cabin under a full moon.

Every sensation in Africa is so immediate, so honest, so close. Some creatures are predators; some are prey. No judgment. No PETA protesters. No tears. That's just the way it is. It's the "circle of life" we learned about in *The Lion King*, only this was REAL. The human (me!) was simply allowed as an observer – as long as I didn't get too close.

When I was pitching it to people years ago, I described it as a cross between *Little Shop of Horrors* and *My Fair Lady* (laughs). You will laugh your tush off, it has a very fun score, and there are two or three twists in a row at the end that you will not see coming.


