# **Army COS Contradicts Report on Transgender Troops**

rmy Chief of Staff General Mark Milley on April 12th called after a DoD report, ostensibly based on into question a key claim of the Defense Department's recent report on transgender military service: that allowing transgender service risks undermining cohesion, privacy, fairness and safety.

Asked by Senator Kirsten Gillibrand during congressional testimony if he had heard of any problems with unit cohesion arising from open transgender service, Gen. Milley responded, "I have received precisely zero reports of issues of cohesion, discipline, morale and all those sorts of things."

Palm Center Director Aaron Belkin called Gen. Milley's remarks significant. "It is telling for the Army Chief of Staff to acknowledge there have been 'zero' problems with cohesion, discipline or morale just weeks

months of research, insisted that transgender troops pose a risk to cohesion, discipline and morale."

The Defense Department report called into question the medical fitness of transgender troops, but the American Medical Association, American Psychological Association, American Psychiatric Association and retired U.S. Surgeons General have stated that the Pentagon's medical data and reasoning are misleading and unpersuasive.

#### "Conversion Therapy **CA Assembly Passes Bill to Ban**

egislation to ban efforts to change a person's sexual orientation or gender identity, sometimes called "conversion therapy" or "reparative therapy," passed in the California Assembly on April 19th, with a bipartisan vote of 50-14

Assemblymember Evan Low's AB 2943, cosponsored by Equality California and the Trevor Project, would make California the first state in the nation to ban these widely discredited practices from being performed on both children and adults.


"So-called conversion therapy is a dangerous, ineffective solution in search of a nonexistent problem, and there's no place for it in the State of California," said Equality California Executive Director Rick Zbur. "Once again, California legislators sent a clear, bipartisan message to the LGBTQ community across our state and around the world: 'You belong.' We look forward to the day when all LGBTQ Californians are protected from these dangerous, fraudulent practices."

AB 2943 would make clear in California law that claiming to be able to change a person's sexual orientation or gender identity is a fraudulent business

practice that misleads consumers and exposes LGBTQ people to damaging psychological abuse. The bill previously passed the Assembly Privacy Committee 8-2 and the Assembly Iudiciary Committee 8-1, each time with bipartisan support.

The pain and fear suffered by those who have been subjected to conversion therapy is something that I can personally identify with," said Assemblymember Evan Low (D-San Jose), author of AB 2943. "This legislation finally created accountability for those who claim to provide therapy but are in fact peddling an unfounded and destructive practice."

AB 2943 now heads to the Senate..

new campaign aims to raise awareness about the prevalence of discrimination against LGBT people in the United States, despite the widespread misconception they have basic protections.

In reality, 31 states lack comprehensive protections and allow these acts of discrimination against LGBT Americans.4


"Everyone should have the ability to live in

These limitations diminish the LGBTQ Tijuana community's ability to live full, healthy lives and to engage in the full spectrum of the civic, cultural, and economic vibrancy of the region.

"Being born with talent, brilliance, or being born LGBTQ is as equally spread throughout the world as human life. What is not equally distributed is opportunity." said Fernando Z. López, Executive Director, San Diego Pride. # *Laugh Your Head Off* With Kathy Griffin

an exclusive interview by Chris Narloch

nybody else might have disappeared until the coast was clear – and the Democrats were back in power – but Kathy Griffin isn't that kind of gal.

Her diehard fans knew better than to count the controversial comic out. Griffin is nothing if not a survivor, and she's one smart cookie.

When an ill-advised photo Griffin released of her holding President Trump's bloody, severed head went viral last year and nearly derailed her career, she brilliantly bounced back by announcing a world tour of the countries where our current President is despised – just about all of them, as it turns out.

Before the laughter returned, however, Griffin endured a bizarre odyssey that included desertion by celebrity friends, a two-month investigation by the feds, having her U.S. shows cancelled, and being put on the no-fly list.

Griffin is still on the Interpol list, which means that she is detained at every overseas airport during her appropriately titled *Laugh Your Head Off World Tour*.

In addition to receiving her own death threats after the photo incident, Griffin's famous, 97-year-old mother, Maggie, got death threats, as did her late sister, Joyce,

who was dying

at the time.

The comic initially apologized – in a tearful video, sans makeup – but later retracted her apology, and Griffin is defiant now in her belief that she is an edgy comic whose speech (including that infamous photo) is protected under the First Amendment.

Now that venues in the U.S. are starting to book her again, she has even lined up dates at Carnegie Hall and the Kennedy Center.

I had the opportunity to speak with Griffin by phone recently, as she prepared for the North American leg of her tour. As always, the comic had much to say, and she didn't pull any punches.

Hi, Kathy. I am so excited that you are doing standup again, after everything you've been through. How is the tour going?

Great. One of my goals with this tour was to clear up one thing, that whether you liked that picture or hated it, it wasn't illegal. So when the far-right started their "lock her up" and shit ... look, I don't want some teenager – if they had done the same picture – to be under a fucking two-month investigation from the Justice Department, led by Mr. Jefferson Beauregard Sessions. Oh my lord, somebody give him a mint julep and fan him on a porch.

You are in good company if you've felt the wrath of Donald Trump, right? Robert Mueller, James Comey, the list is long...

Well, when the Trump family comes after you, it's not exactly like a scene from *The Crown*. I mean I know they think that they're royalty but holy shit-balls.

I want to ask how your mom is doing with all that's happened. I imagine that many boxes of wine have been consumed?

God bless her, Maggie will be

98 this June, and I don't know if

you saw my Instagram, but she

hit the BevMo! this weekend.
She watches Fox News with the sound off, while drinking boxed wine, and then blames me for everything. She is so vain that she won't wear her hearing aids because she thinks she's in show business and needs to look good. They rerun the Trump photo like everyday on Fox, and then she calls me and asks me if I've rejoined ISIS.

Yes, last week I finally got my first comedy TV gig. I got to play Kellyanne Conway on *The President Show* on Comedy Central. It was so much fun. The only thing is, to prepare for the role they wouldn't give me any meth. They were really strict about it, but I don't mean to imply that Kellyanne does meth, at all.

Did you wear that scary bicentennial getup that she had at the Inauguration, Kathy, that hideous red, white and blue Gucci outfit that cost \$3,600.00?

I love you! I demanded it. It was so nice after a year of being called a terrorist and shit, to go to a work environment where people were actually nice. They asked me what I wanted to wear, and with Kellyanne there are so many looks to choose from. But yeah, if I was her I wouldn't really have gone for the whole double-breasted Civil War look at the Inauguration, with all the racial tensions we have in the country currently.

So you feel like you've turned the corner it sounds like, with regards to getting your career back on track?

So what can people expect on this tour, Kathy? I imagine your act is a lot more political now?

I don't know if you already knew this, but my actual neighbors through all this were Kim Kardashian West and Kanye Kardashian West ... I'm really proud of this show because every word of it is true, and parts of it are jaw dropping. Did you know that I'm invited to the White House Correspondents' Dinner on April 28, as a guest of *The Washington Blade*?

You're kidding! Is Trump going to be there?



And, beginning Wednesday, June 6, 2018, the new head chef Dane Blom of Grange Restaurant & Bar will resume the

restaurant's popular "Follow the Chef" tours at the Cesar Chavez Plaza Market. Followed by a seasonally-inspired lunch, tickets will be available soon at http://www.grangesacramento.com.

Midtown's popular Farmer's Market, presented by Sutter Health, continues on 20th Street as usual but will extend from J Street to Kayak Alley this summer. Open year-round on Saturdays from 8 a.m. to 1 p.m., the Market fluctuates in size by a half-block depending on the seasons and time of year.

On April 28, Midtown's always-popular pop-up mobile dog park will be adjacent to the market plus live music in the market sponsored by SMUD.



# **Broadway Sac Announces Exciting 2018-19 Season**

isney's newest musical juggernaut Aladdin will anchor Broadway Sacramento's next series of shows, and that's only the beginning of the theatrical riches in store for musical theater lovers who attend the 2018-19 Season.



That tuneful, entertaining Disney blockbuster is one of two musicals coming to Sacramento next season that are still playing on Broadway. (The other one is the delightful feminist musical comedy Waitress.)

Waitress, which opened in early 2016, became the first Broadway musical in history with an all-female creative team, including director Diane Paulus, songwriter Sara Bareilles, book writer Jessie Nelson, and choreographer Lorin Latarro.

Based on the 2007 movie of the same name, which was also written and directed by a woman, Waitress is my favorite among next season's shows. (I have seen it twice on Broadway and will catch it again when it plays Sacramento.)

On Your Feet, another feel-good musical that was a surprising success on Broadway, is also coming to town. Chock-full of her radio hits from back in the day, and featuring dazzling choreography, the show charts the ups and downs of singer Gloria Estefan's life and career.

For many LGBTQ theater fans, the most-anticipated show next season will be Falsettos, which premiered on Broadway in 1992 and was revived, to great acclaim, in

Falsettos, which hasn't been seen in the Community Center since its second national tour in 1994, centers on a gay male couple

during the early days of the AIDS crisis. The work also included the first openly lesbian couple to appear as featured characters in a major Broadway musical.

Rounding out the 2018-19 Broadway Sacramento Season are two returning audience favorites that should pull in the crowds: those singing, dancing Cats and an optional show, Stomp.

(The 2018-19 season will also include another optional title, the family show The Lightning Thief: The Percy Jackson Musical, which will play a brief run here next April.)

2018-19 will be the final season in the Community Center before the \$84 million renovation is begun that will provide Broadway Sacramento and the other tenants of the Center with a more spacious lobby, better acoustics and improved restroom

The Memorial Auditorium will host the 2019-20 series, and then the renovation of the Community Center is currently scheduled to be complete in time for the 2020-21 Broadway Sac season, which fingers crossed, and you didn't hear it here - will (hopefully) include *Hamilton*, the biggest phenomenon in Broadway history.

"We believe these names better articulate what we do as a company, which is to bring top Broadway talent to Sacramento - at Music Circus during the summer, at the Community Center Theater during the fall, winter and spring, and with our arts education programs throughout the year," Lewis says.

"We found that, despite its 67-year history, there are many people in the Sacramento region who are unfamiliar with Music Circus, likely because they're confused by the word 'circus,' mistakenly believing it has something to do with a circus in the traditional sense," Lewis adds. "And the former company name didn't properly convey the esteemed status Music Circus


