Historic Appointment Of Karine Jean-Pierre As White House Press Secretary

7 arine Jean-Pierre will make history by becoming the first Black woman, and first openly LGBTQ person, to hold the job of White House press secretary, President Biden announced recently.

"Jill and I have known and respected Karine a long time and she will be a strong voice speaking for me and this Administration," the president said in a statement

Jean-Pierre will replace Jen Psaki, who was originally expected to serve for only the first year of Biden's term. New coronavirus variants and the war in Ukraine kept her in the job for several months beyond that self-imposed limit.

"She is passionate. She is smart and she has a moral core that makes her not just a great colleague, but an amazing Mom and human. Plus, she has a great sense of humor," Psaki said in a tweet of Pierre, now her top deputy in the White House press shop.

"Representation matters. She will give a voice to so many, and show so many what is truly possible when you work hard and dream big. And that matters. And we should celebrate that," Psaki said at the White House briefing on Thursday, while also touting Jean-Pierre's resume. "But I also want to make clear what all of her qualifications are. ... She comes to this job with decades of experience."

Psaki's last day on the job will be next Friday, May 13. She is expected to join MSNBC as an on-air commentator. Jean-Pierre will take over the podium at a crucial phase in the Biden presidency,

with the congressional midterms nearing and a presidential reelection campaign looming. During the 2020 presidential primary,

Jean-Pierre worked for the campaign of

then-Sen. Kamala Harris. She has been at the White House since the start of the Biden administration.

The 44-year-old daughter of Haitian immigrants will inherit a position that attracted intense scrutiny during the Trump administration. Psaki has tried to keep the White House briefings free of the kinds of dramatics that, during the Trump years, turned some journalists into celebrities.



Sacramento County Project Celebrates 10-Year Anniversary Promoting Mental Health/Wellness

Tt has been 10 years since the launch of the Sacramento County Department of Health Services/Division of Behavioral Health Services "Mental Illness: It's not always what you think" project. In that time, the project has worked to reduce stigma and discrimination surrounding mental health conditions, promote mental health and wellness and inspire hope for people and families living with mental health conditions.

In Sacramento County, it's estimated that over 300,000 residents are living with a mental health condition. Nationally, approximately one in five adults will experience a diagnosable mental health condition during their lifetime.

While education, support and treatment are available, two-thirds of these individuals do not seek support or treatment because they worry they will lose their jobs, friends or family, or be isolated because of the stigma and discrimination associated with having a mental health condition.

Mental health conditions, just like physical health conditions, are treatable, and recovery is possible when education and treatment is available, along with family, peer and community support.

"As a gay Asian man living with depression, I struggled for many years trying to find out who I am and where I belong," said Patrick Ma, a member of the Stop Stigma Sacramento Speakers Bureau. "If you are struggling, it's ok to reach out and ask for help. There are plenty of resources available to you, and there are people who love and care for you."

It is just as important as ever to support mental health and well-being by reaching out and maintaining connections with those who may be struggling - not only to support them, but also for your own mental health. Sending a thoughtful text, grabbing coffee, making a phone call, or setting up a video chat could make all the difference.



Compassion Is Key To Breaking Pandemic Cycles Like HIV, COVID by Wendy Weitzel

IV and COVID-19 have a lot in common. Both are viruses that led to pandemics. And in each case, as the infections L spread, so did the misinformation and hate.

A UC Davis virologist says we can learn from these experiences. "Even though the biology of the (COVID) virus is very different (than HIV), so much depends on how we respond to it," said Koen Van Rompay, core scientist at the California National Primate Research Center.

The veterinarian's research led to development of the top HIV treatment in the world: tenofovir. Recently, he studied COVID vaccines in infant monkeys - part of groundwork for Moderna's preliminary COVID vaccine for human infants 6 months to 5 years old.

Van Rompay said these pandemics exposed weaknesses in our society, where some people put politics before facts. "We have to trust the research and the way it has developed."

For International LGBTQ+ Month, local scientists and community activists see the celebration as a chance to strengthen community bonds, and acknowledge lessons learned.


Davis Mayor Gloria Partida said there are uncanny parallels between the two health emergencies, notably in their social impacts. "Both pandemics have caused marginalized groups to be targeted," she said, referring to

hate directed at Asians and immigrants as COVID-19 emerged, and at gay men for HIV. She said supporting – not stigmatizing - the victims, and discouraging misinformation are social ways to contain today's pandemic.

She retired in 2019 from UC Davis, where she was a lab manager in the department of neurobiology, physiology and behavior. She founded the Davis Phoenix Coalition in 2013 after her oldest son, who is gay, was badly beaten in an incident classified as a hate crime. Two of her three adult children identify as LGBTQ.

For the eighth year, the Davis Phoenix Coalition is coordinating Davis Pride events. Partida said events like International LGBTQ+ Month in June, and the Davis Pride Festival (June 11-12), support community conversations and celebrations of diversity.

Van Rompay agreed. "We have to show compassion for others. It's our power if we work together toward our future." In 1999, he founded nonprofit Sahaya International, which aids education, social, medical and environmental projects in developing countries. In Sanskrit, "sahaya" translates to "help."

He said Princess Diana was an example of such empathy when, in 1989, she was photographed in a New York hospital picking up and hugging a 7-year-old boy who had AIDS.

Though there was lots of misinformation when HIV emerged in the 1980s, there was no internet to strengthen its reach. With COVID, "there is so much false information about vaccines and masking," he said.

People need to be aware that their actions can hurt others. "Don't believe everything you read on social media. Trust the scientists," he said. "When my car breaks down, I don't try to fix it. I take it to a specialist who has the knowledge and experience to deal with it."

Young adults tend to have less fear of COVID, but they are not immortal, Van Rompay said. A caring community looks out for everyone, like those who are immunocompromised or too young to

receive a vaccine.

And we still don't know the consequences. "Coming from a research point of view, there is more and more data coming out that people with mild symptoms still have the risk of entering long COVID - where it enters the brain," he said.

Davis is fortunate to have the university, and the Healthy Davis Together free testing and vaccination program, Van Rompay said, calling it an example for the country.

"We've done a really amazing job but nothing is perfect." Though hospitalizations have dropped significantly, we still don't know the long-term effects.

Meanwhile, he's masking in public indoor spaces, and hoping compassion is the biggest contagion.





Clue: The Musical



"Playing With Myself" by Randy Rainbow

It takes two to tango. And foxtrot, and waltz, and polka, for that matter. You might dance in a circle with other couples but those are couples, remember, not lines of people boot-scootin'. No, it takes two to tango and spaghetti kiss and to sing a duet but, as in the new book "Playing with Myself" by Randy Rainbow, it just takes one to podcast.

People ask Randy Rainbow all the time if his last name is real. Yes, it is, he writes with glee, and it's one of the best things his father ever gave him. Because, seriously, could there be a more fitting name for a gay "topical comedian"?

Being in the limelight has always been in Rainbow's blood: he recalls staging a Disney play for neighborhood parents when he was very young. He was the lead actor, the director, the stage manager, and the costumer. His playmates were rather less-than-enthusiastic but the parents applauded, and Rainbow

was hooked. It probably helped that his mother was a big

Broadway fan and so Rainbow grew up with show tunes. As an adolescent, he collected soundtrack CDs and, after he was introduced to "a form of religion that was... Barbra Streisand."



he collected videos of certain performances he grew to love best.

Also as an adolescent, he grew awkward. His other religion was crunchy snacks and he spent a lot of time in his room; his parents had moved the family from New York to Florida; their marriage was in shreds, and it took awhile for Rainbow to get his confidence back. Still, it wasn't until he was in high school that he found that old rhythm, his scathing sense of humor, and a cadre of like-minded theater-and-drama friends.

After graduation, Rainbow returned to New York, where he ultimately found his community and sharpened his talent.

"Enter," says Rainbow, "the 2016 presidential candidates."

You didn't really think "Playing with Myself" would be as hilarious as author Randy Rainbow's videos, did you? Yes, this book's funny but alas, not quite as LOL as his parodies.

You probably won't mind, though: Rainbow's biography is still plenty entertaining, nonetheless. From his first pair of Ruby shoes to the shoo-off he jokingly gives readers at the end, we get a peek at how he gained what he admits is "an encyclopedic knowledge of Broadway musicals," how his sense of humor was honed, and how that all led to a library of YouTube bits that roast those in the news. Politicians seem to be special targets for Rainbow – not surprisingly, as you'll see here – but anyone's fair game for the needling.

"Playing with Myself" is slightly bruised by an overdose of name-dropping, the presence of which may surprise nobody. Still, if you don't hate on that and you love a little faux-pearlclutching, this book is two good to pass up.

A Trio of New Titles at The Tower by Chris Narloch

Superhero cinema is alive and well, and Marvel fans will no doubt be flocking to see "Doctor Strange in the Multiverse of Madness" which is currently playing on a gazillion screens worldwide, including Sacramento's Esquire IMAX Theatre on K Street, where it will reside until at least May 26th.

I was unable to see that movie before our deadline for this issue, but I have reviews of three other films, and all of them were still playing at Sacramento's Tower Theatre as I wrote this article.



Firebird

"Firebird" has been called the Russian "Brokeback Mountain," and that is a pretty accurate description of this true tale of a passionate queer love story set during the Cold War of the 1970s, against the backdrop of a Soviet Air Force base in Estonia.

Sergey (Tom Prior), a soulful, young soldier who dreams of becoming an actor in Moscow, is counting the days until his military service ends. Then his life is turned upside down when he locks eyes with Roman (Oleg Zagorodnii), a sexy, enigmatic ace fighter pilot newly assigned to his base.

Driven by their undeniable attraction, Sergey and Roman navigate the precarious line between love and friendship at a time when Soviet men in uniform caught having a sexual affair was met with the severest punishment. As their friendship grows into love, the men risk their freedom and their lives to be together while living under a cruel Soviet regime.

A beautiful-looking movie with two handsome lead actors, "Firebird" is especially timely now, considering the recent return of the Cold War between Russia and the United States.



The Duke

"The Duke" is the late director Roger Michell's ("Notting Hill," "Another Year") swan song, and it stars two of our finest living British actors, Academy Award-winners Jim Broadbent and Helen Mirren, who are both perfection in the movie.

The film recounts the true story of a 60-year-old taxi driver who stole Goya's portrait of the Duke of Wellington from the National Gallery in London in 1961 and then sent ransom notes saying that he would return it if the government agreed to provide television for free to the elderly.

A strange-but-true crime caper about the first (and only) theft in the Gallery's history, "The Duke" is moving, funny, and very entertaining.

Petite Maman

The much-anticipated new film from Céline Sciamma ("Portrait of a Lady on Fire," "Girlhood"), "Petite Maman" is a sublime modern fairytale about the quiet wonder of mother-daughter relationships.

After the death of her beloved grandmother, eight-year-old Nelly meets a mysterious friend in the woods. Together they embark on a fantastical journey of discovery which helps Nelly come to terms with this newfound loss.

A favorite of the 2021 Berlin Film Festival, Sciamma's latest winner examines childhood, memory, and loss with a typically delicate touch, elegantly weaving together an enchanting and moving depiction of love and acceptance.






