A Tribute to Doris Matsui *by Dennis Mangers*

Doris Matsui has always been there for the LGBT community, And we still need her In Congress. I've watched plenty of politicians "evolve" on LGBTQ+ rights. They wait until public opinion shifts, until the cultural moment makes it safe, until supporting our community costs them nothing. Then they show up at Pride parades and call themselves allies.

Doris Matsui is not that politician. In 2006, when it wasn't yet politically safe, she voted against enshrining discrimination against same-sex couples into the U.S. Constitution. In 2007, she voted to prohibit job discrimination based on sexual orientation. These weren't easy votes at the time, but she cast them anyway. And the Human Rights Campaign has given her a 100% scorecard throughout her career to prove it. I'm asking my fellow LGBTQ+ Sacramentans, and everyone who stands with us, to re-elect Congresswoman Matsui this June. Because right now, we cannot afford to lose her.

We are living through a moment of coordinated, deliberate assault on our community. Rights we spent decades fighting for are being dismantled. And in the middle of that fight, Matsui has led for us: She is an original cosponsor of the Equality Act, landmark legislation that would explicitly prohibit discrimination based on sex, sexual orientation, and gender identity. Despite it being stalled in the gridlock of Republican obstruction, Matsui has pushed it forward

every single Congress since 2015, and she will keep introducing it until it becomes law. As a proud member of the Equality Caucus in Congress, she sponsors bill after bill that most Americans never hear about but that directly save and improve lives: the Safe Schools Improvement Act, the Transgender Health Care Access Act, the Pride in Mental Health Act, the Fit to Serve Act, and the 988 LGBTQ+ Youth Access Act, among others.

That last one hits close to home. Congresswoman Matsui has been a driving force behind expanding and strengthening the 988 Suicide and Crisis Lifeline. She wrote the 988 Implementation Act to secure federal funding, build out local call center capacity, and expand mobile crisis teams in communities that need them. When the Trump Administration shut down the dedicated LGBTQ+ youth option on the 988 line - a callous, life-threatening decision - Matsui called it exactly what it was: cruel. And she fought to restore it.

This is personal for her. Matsui was born in a Japanese internment camp. She knows what it feels like when your government

decides your family doesn't belong. That history doesn't leave you. I believe it is part of why she has stood with our community, consistently and without apology, for her entire career in Congress.

Bonta to fight the Administration's Attempt to Obtain Medical Records

California Attorney General Rob Bonta has joined a coalition of 21 attorneys general opposing what they describe as another unjustified effort by the Trump Administration to obtain medical records related to gender-affirming care for minors. The coalition filed an amicus brief supporting a motion to block a U.S. Department of Justice subpoena targeting Rhode Island Hospital.

According to the brief, the U.S. DOJ is attempting to use the federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act to justify access to records tied to gender-affirming care. Bonta and the coalition argue that the administration's interpretation of the law is legally flawed and could have consequences far beyond transgender healthcare. Many areas of medicine routinely rely on "off-label" prescribing, a long-established and legal practice in which medications are used for purposes not specifically listed on FDA labels.

"The Trump Administration continues to chase its hateful agenda against transgender Americans," Bonta said in a statement, adding that California remains committed to protecting both patients and healthcare providers from federal overreach.

The dispute began in July 2025 when the DOJ issued a subpoena seeking records from Rhode Island Hospital concerning gender-affirming care for minors. Earlier this month, federal officials sought to enforce the subpoena in court, prompting Rhode Island's Office of the Child Advocate to file a motion to quash it.

Bonta has joined similar legal efforts opposing subpoenas aimed at providers including Boston Children's Hospital, Children's Hospital of Philadelphia, and telemedicine platform QueerDoc. The coalition argues the subpoenas threaten patient privacy and could intimidate providers offering medically recognized care.

The Center also provides access to LGBTQ-affirming healthcare navigation, mental health counseling, and essential services such as HIV, HCV, and STI testing. Seniors can connect with licensed clinicians for one-on-one support or join group counseling spaces tailored to their needs.

Accessible Yoga, Sacramento

A trauma-informed, body-positive yoga group open to all abilities, offering movement as a pathway to healing and grounding.

Advocacy and Navigation

From housing to healthcare to legal resources, the Center's advocates help seniors navigate systems that can feel overwhelming or unwelcoming. The goal is simple: ensure every LGBTQ+ elder has access to the support they need to age with dignity.

Davis Pride Is Ready To Bring The Rainbows And Glitter Back To The Community

The 12th annual Davis Pride will bring a month of events to celebrate and support the local LGBTQ+ community, with Davis PrideFest, a fun run, trivia, and the annual comedy night.

The month-long celebration will start with PrideFest, taking place at Civic Center Park, at 6th and B streets behind Davis City Hall, from 4:00 to 9:00 p.m. on Saturday, June 6. This family-friendly event features a music festival, community vendors, food trucks, drinks, and a drag revue.

“At a time when nationwide we’re seeing attacks on LGBTQ+ rights and organizations turning their back on Pride events, we are proud to offer a community-driven event supported by local artists, businesses, and volunteers,” said Sandré Henriquez Nelson, Director of Pride Events for the Davis Phoenix Coalition.

Total Recall, the Sacramento-based ‘90s and 2000s rock cover band, will co-headline the music festival, bringing their passion for alternative, pop punk and rock to the stage. Joining them as a co-headliner will be local favorite Bamba Fried Rice, a nine member band that plays music based in Latin genres ranging from salsa to ska.

Returning musical performers include the Sacramento Gay Men’s Chorus, Davis-based community band Noise Violation, and positive and uplifting rap group Matthew Balling and friends. Closing out the night are the crowd favorite local queens and kings of the drag revue. For the full performance schedule, visit www.davispride.org/entertainment-2/.

PrideFest will include activity zones for children, teens, and seniors. Local artisans and non-profits will have booths with merchandise and resources available. The event is free, though donations are always accepted.

Attendees can get a jump start on PrideFest on the morning of Saturday, June 6, with the cornerstone event that started Davis Pride, the 12th annual Davis Pride Run/Walk for Equality, beginning at 8:00 a.m. at 500 1st St. This event includes a 5K and a 1-mile run/walk along the greenbelts of Davis, beginning at the shovel arch near the entrance of the UC Davis Arboretum.



Registration for the run, which helps fund the Davis Phoenix Coalition activities, is \$40 before May 24, \$45 from May 25 to June 5, and \$50 on race day. For more information, visit www.davispride.org/run.

There will be a community gathering rally from 2:45-3:45 on Saturday, June 6, prior to Davis PrideFest. This event, called Pride Is a Protest!, will be held at the Solidarity Stage in Central Park at Fourth and C streets, and will culminate in a march to Civic Center Park to officially begin PrideFest.

“Pride is a Protest is a community gathering event to offer all positive and supportive members a space in solidarity for the rights of all our LGBTQ+ community,” Henriquez Nelson said.

Later in the month, the third annual Davis Pride Comedy Night will take place from 6:00-9:00 p.m. on Friday, June 26, at the Stonegate Country Club, 919 Lake Blvd. Presented by Comedians on the Go, the evening will be hosted by Sacramento and San Francisco-based drag performer and stand-up comedian Suzette Veneti, with headliner Scott Capurro and featured comics Shannon Murphy and Marcus Williams.

DJ Wet Weather will perform at 6:00 p.m. during a happy hour reception before the 7:00 show begins. Please be advised that this event is for ages 18+ due to mature content. Tickets are \$50 through June 7, \$60 June 8-25, and \$70 on June 26. For more details and to purchase tickets, visit www.davispride.org/comedy.

Keeping elders socially engaged, providing resource options that are safe and affordable, as well as supporting and understanding the journey of aging on one's own terms, is our Vision.



Studies show that human connections increase and improve the physical and mental health of all age groups including seniors, especially within peer groups. It is a societal mistake to assume that older folks lack any significant contribution to our cultural's structure and that 'aging' is just another 'profit-making industry'. There is even a technology smart home being developed to keep elders independent, where a home is wired with cameras to monitor us like specimens in a cage, count the number of flushes for urinary irregularities and make sure we don't sleep too much! A device for everything! What's missing is the human connection! What every person yearns for is human contact, kindness, compassionate human care, respectful treatment and living out their days with dignity and purpose.

The Wisdom Project has served the older LGBTQ+ community in the Sacramento Region for 13 years with programs and referrals to safe, welcoming resources. Establishing quality partnerships has been key to our longevity as a small organization, established in 2004, with an all-volunteer staff and no public office. All donations to Servant Hearts go into serving the Mission/Vision of our programs; Wisdom Project = LGBT Elders, Rhythms of Empowerment and Respect Awareness Project.

Programming for the Wisdom Project continues to evolve to meet the needs, interests, and capabilities of our members. As with every season in life, our abilities, desires, and hopes fluctuate. We are all ever-changing beings who seek to enrich ourselves and our minds through what feels comfortable, activities that are engaging, that offer hope and purpose while connecting us with people we enjoy spending our journey with ~

In today's busy world where a tweet constitutes 'talking', where an AI assistant tangles us up in automated phone links that lead 'nowhere', where a driverless car might arrive to 'transport' you to your requested destination, or even more frightening might be your surgeon on call! The current generation of 'Boomers' often faces unfamiliarity with technology ... leaving us feeling 'aged out' of life. Wisdom Project gatherings can make you feel 'included', not so extinct, with peer conversations that awaken your mind and spark new possibilities.

At Wisdom Project = LGBT Elders' gatherings/meetings/activities we attempt to help make some sense out of today's more complex ideas and way of living! We invite resource speakers once a month to join us for roundtable discussions. Recent discussions have been about managed care, advantage plans, pros/cons of senior living communities, low-income SMUD utility programs, law enforcement, protecting yourself from fraud and scams, mental health support, etc. Our second monthly Conversations & Coffee meeting is an open forum to share with others, topics of interest; changes in pharmacy delivery systems, vacation and travel ideas, EV experiences, book clubs, volunteer opportunities, family interactions, challenges of living alone... topics are endless.

Join us ~ 2nd & 4th Wednesdays from 1:00pm - 2:30pm at Eskaton Land Park for LGBTQ+ Conversations & Coffee, or our 3rd Saturday Lunch Out & Conversation at one of many local restaurants. 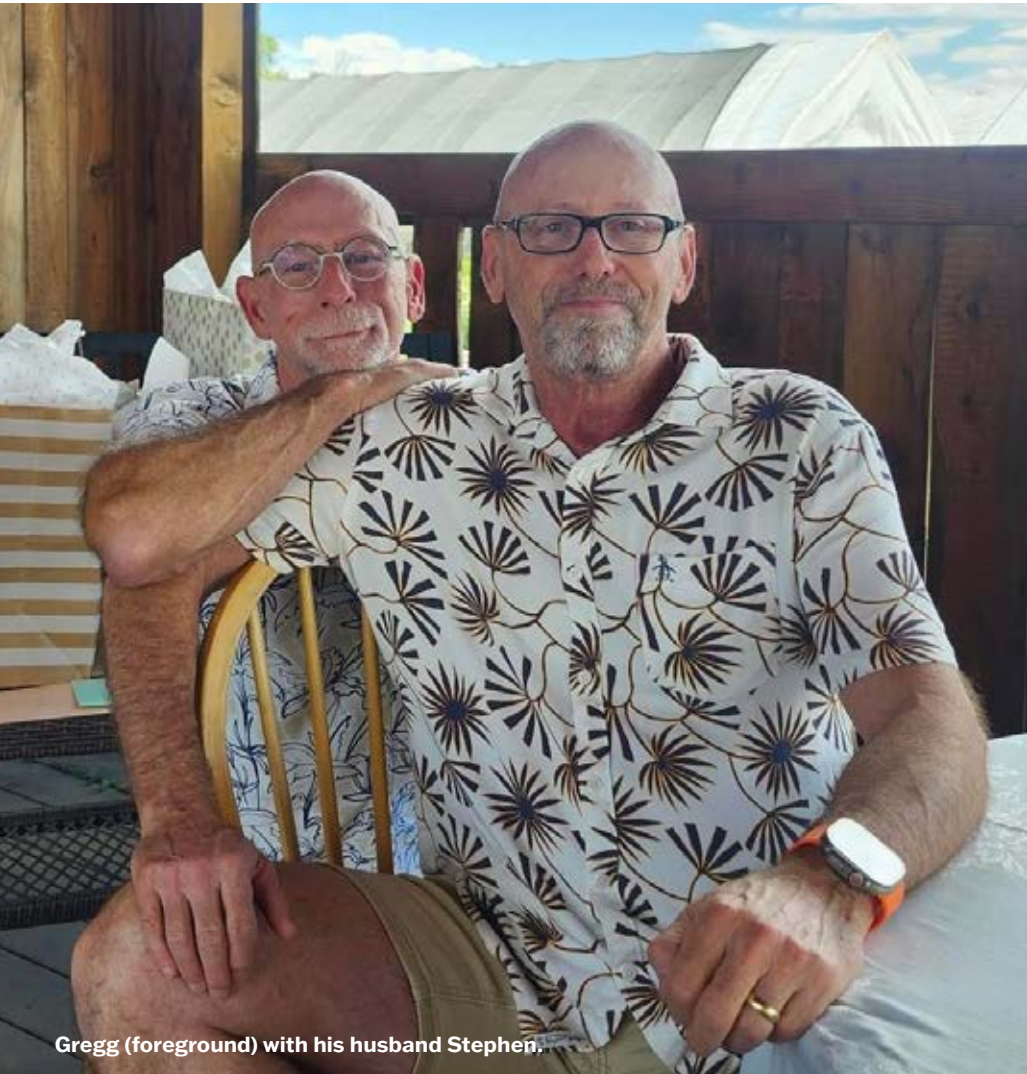

I've Been Thinking...

I've been thinking a lot lately about what it means to get older. When I was younger, so much of my sense of value came from things you could see.

How I looked.
How I performed.
What I achieved.
What title was next to my name.
There's a certain electricity in that phase of life. You're building. You're proving. You're moving. And if we're honest, especially as gay men, physical beauty and career momentum can feel like real currency. Youth has a spotlight. Success has applause.
I listened recently to a conversation between Ezra Klein and George Saunders that really stayed with me. Saunders talked about how much of our suffering comes from defending this idea of "who we are." We create a self and then spend years protecting it, promoting it, polishing it.
But life slowly interrupts that illusion.
Your body changes.
Your role changes.
Sometimes your relevance shifts.
And at first it can feel like something is being taken from you.
But I'm starting to wonder if something else is happening.
What if aging is not subtraction, but refinement?
What if the loosening of outer markers makes space for something deeper?
I notice that I care less about being impressive. Less about being the smartest or the most accomplished in the room. And more about being kind. Being steady. Being someone who listens well. Someone who makes others feel safe.
There is something profoundly freeing about not needing to win anymore.
There's a tenderness that comes with realizing you were never your job. You were never your abs. You were never the applause. Those things were costumes we wore for a while.
What remains underneath is quieter.
Curiosity.
Humility.
Love.
A desire to show up honestly.
In a community that often celebrates youth, I think growing older can feel confronting. But it can also be grounding. There's a depth that comes from lived experience. A softness that comes from having been humbled a few times.
I'm not done growing. I'm just growing differently now.
And maybe the real beauty isn't in holding on to who we were, but in gently becoming who we are meant to be next.

Howard's Passion Comes to Life on Broadway

Wish of a Lifetime from AARP sparks hope and joy in the hearts of older adults by fulfilling their dreams through personalized experiences that promote healthy and purposeful aging. We share these stories to inspire those of all ages.

"I now feel I have the rest of my life to be me."

At age 74, Howard feels he can fully express who he is—but that was not always the case throughout his life.

Howard is a member of the LGBTQ+ community and has struggled with expressing his identity in the past. He and his three siblings grew up in the Bronx of New York City. When their father passed away when Howard was only eight years old, their mother became the family's sole provider.

Caring for four children was challenging, and his mother made just enough to make ends meet. Howard found little time to dream about the possibilities of the future. "All we knew was to go to school, get a job, and that's it," he explained.

When he went to college, Howard realized that he was gay, and he came out to a few close friends. "I didn't hide it, but I didn't discuss it," he said. "I knew who I was, but there was never any reason to talk about it."

Howard moved to California but lacked the self-confidence to explore his personal life, build new interests, or pursue a career in the arts. He found a "normal" job, worked hard, and kept his head down for 30 years.

"All my life, I was scared," he said. "And I have never built a real life for myself."

But like the protagonist of any good production, this introvert had a Second Act worth waiting for.

In his 50s, Howard discovered his passion for theater and began to push past his inhibitions and shyness. After retiring, he moved to Las Vegas, where he joined the Center Las Vegas, a group for older LGBTQ+ adults with a mission to empower all people to live authentic lives.

Here, Howard found the community he had been searching for all along. And with the support of new friends, his confidence continued to grow. He felt more comfortable in his own shoes—enough to begin acting, singing, and dancing on stage.

"When I got into the theater, I felt more comfortable with things... this is when I came out of my shell and could express myself fully for the first time," he said.

Howard acted in his first play with a local theater troupe in 2014. And with a new passion to motivate him, he continued to grow as a person and an actor, finally getting cast in a leading role in 2018. Since then, his list of leading roles has grown, as has Howard's confidence. And a dream to someday perform on Broadway also grew within him.

Howard's story exemplifies how finding new passions and connections can help us flourish later in life. And Wish of a Lifetime knew just what to do to celebrate his journey and recognize Howard as the remarkable individual he is today.

In collaboration with the New York City Department of Education's Arts Office and the Shubert Foundation, we helped make Howard's dream of performing on Broadway a reality! Full of anticipation, Howard traveled to New York City to perform in the 9th annual Shubert High School Theatre Festival.

Howard bravely took the microphone in front of a packed house at the historic Broadhurst Theatre. He told his story of overcoming obstacles and persevering as an older adult and member of the LGBTQ+ community.

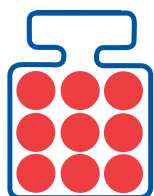
"I am honored to perform alongside such talented young people and to share my story with future generations," he said.

And then, it was time for the main performance! Accompanied by a live band, Howard sang the song "To Life" from the iconic musical Fiddler on the Roof while dancing alongside 26 talented teen artists. Together, they brought the audience to its feet.

Reflecting on the experience, Howard shared that "No matter what happens in my life, I will only grow, and Wish of a Lifetime has added to that ability."

"But after Broadway, I don't know what else there can be..."

In cool spring conditions, the Sacramento State Aquatic Center at Lake Natoma hosted the Western Intercollegiate Rowing Association Championships on April 25–26. Thirty-five schools competed across 65 heats in the regatta, with one of the more curious sights in collegiate rowing on full display: female coxswains commanding all-male boats. The coxswain doesn't row; they steer and direct race strategy, and the role strongly favors lighter athletes. With a 125 lb target weight, there are simply far more college-aged women who fit the claustrophobic confines of the stern seat, and roughly 10 schools at WIRA this year listed female coxswains on their men's roster pages.

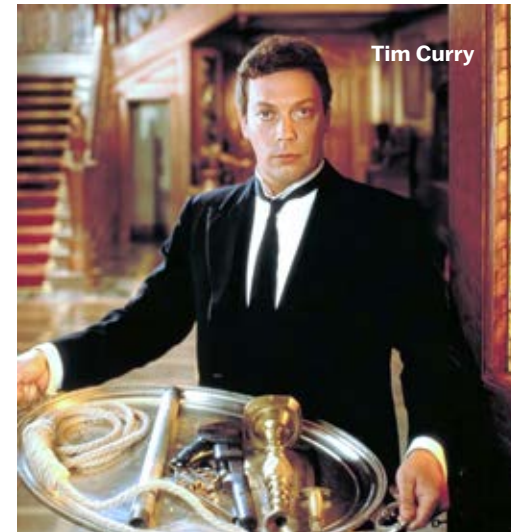

“Espejos: Clean” Hits the Bullseye at CapStage

Sacramento’s Capital Stage notches another win with “Espejos: Clean,” a powerful play by Christine Quintana that uses two languages to tell its riveting tale of female suffering and survival.

Told in Spanish and English, with respective supertitles like they have at the opera, this bold drama finds the humor and heart (and heartbreak) in a story about two women – and two worlds – that collide at a high-end hotel in Mexico.

Despite their different languages, backgrounds, and economic realities, the two women are revealed to have similar traumatic experiences that they have worked hard to suppress. Adriana is the housekeeping manager, who at first sees Sarah as just another entitled, wealthy White woman staying at the Cancun resort where she works.

By the end of the play, Adriana (Sarita Ocon) and Sarah (Stephanie Altholz) will come clean about their shared secrets, and two superb actresses will have moved us with their compelling performances.

The two women deal with their traumatic pasts in different ways – one is a workaholic, the other is an alcoholic – and the play touches on several fascinating issues, including white savior complex and PTSD.

Dena Martinez directs with a sure hand, and the entire production team succeeds in bringing this wonderful work to life.

Every once in a while, I like to take myself out for what I call an “alone lunch.” No project, no meeting – just me alone.

Piatti is one of those places I go to from time to time. They have some wonderful seasonal meals on the menu, and a few weeks ago they offered Mafaldine Carbonara. It was so fresh and wonderful, made with simple ingredients and something I neither make at home nor really know how to make.

Carbonara is one of those dishes that has to be done correctly, and although the ingredients are simple, it's not easy to pull off. The one I had was a perfect blend of pancetta, English peas, pecorino, and cured egg yolk.

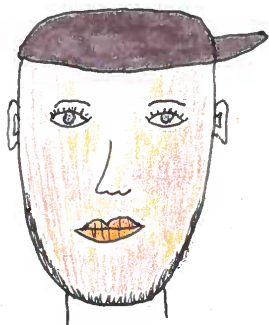
