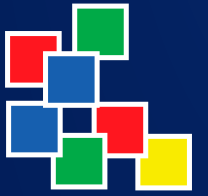

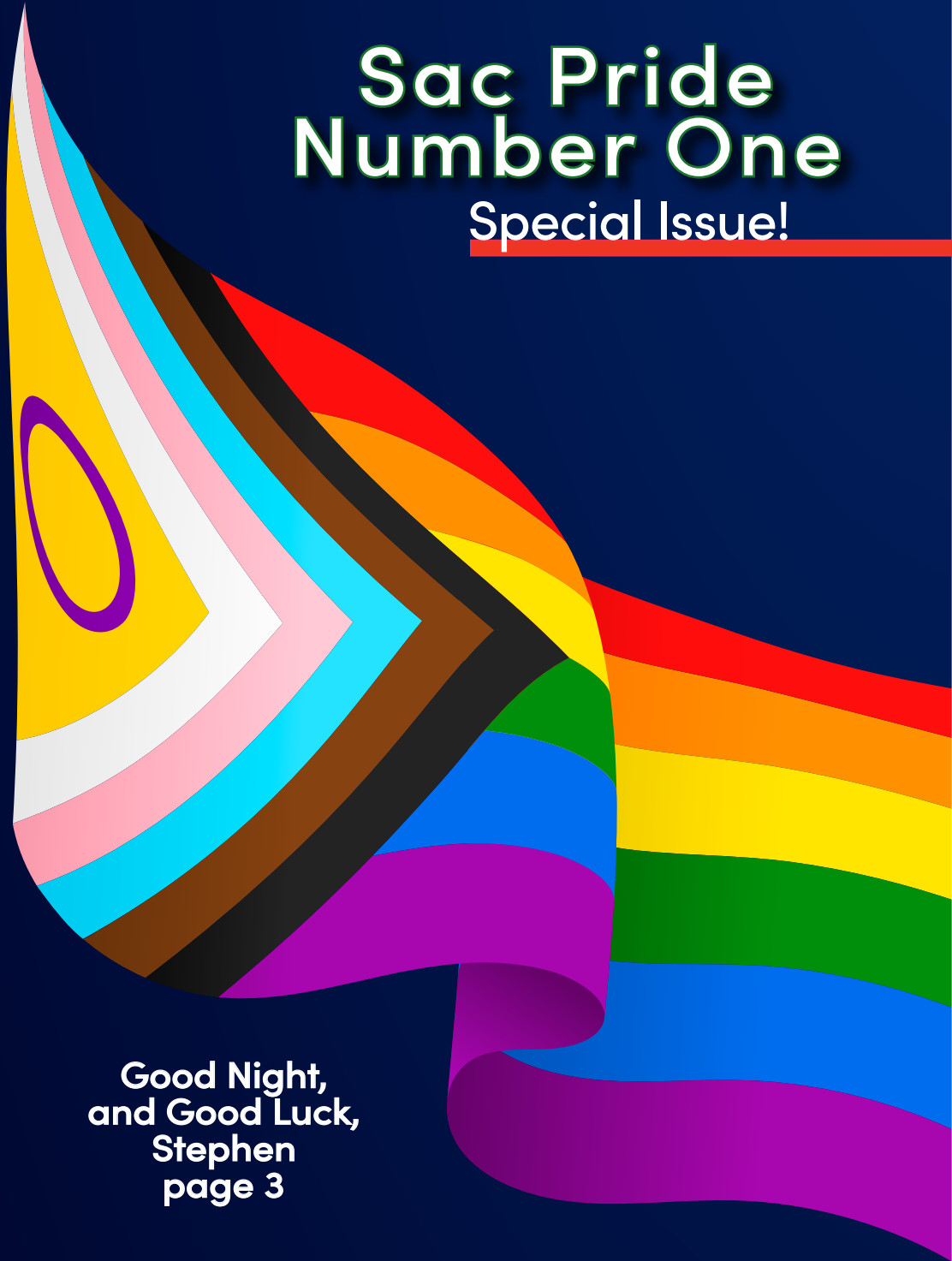

Stephen, somewhat like Graham Norton, had a way of making his guests feel comfortable enough to connect with him and answer his questions with honesty and wit.

The canceling of The Late Show comes off more as a payout for services rendered than any kind of financial necessity. I have hope that things will right themselves, but I have little hope that it will happen fast enough for me to benefit from it.

Farewell, Stephen Colbert. I, and millions like me, will be watching for what comes next for you. Whatever it may be, it will be awesome.

Trailblazer Barney Frank Has Died

Trailblazing former congressman and longtime LGBTQ+ advocate Barney Frank has died at the age of 86. Frank, one of the first openly gay members of Congress and among the most influential lawmakers of his generation, reportedly died May 19 after entering hospice care at his home in Maine following complications from congestive heart failure.

A Democrat from Massachusetts, Frank served in the U.S. House of Representatives from 1981 to 2013. He publicly came out as gay in 1987 while still in office, a bold and career-defining move at a time when few national politicians were willing to do so openly. Over the decades that followed, his visibility helped pave the way for a new generation of LGBTQ+ elected officials.

Frank was perhaps best known nationally for his role in shaping financial reform after the 2008 economic collapse. As chair of the House Financial Services Committee, he helped craft the landmark Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act, legislation designed to strengthen oversight of banks and protect consumers after the housing and financial crisis.

But for many in the LGBTQ+ community, Frank's legacy was rooted in his willingness to speak plainly and fight publicly for equality during years when doing so carried significant political risk. Sharp-witted, intensely policy-focused, and often delightfully blunt, he became a familiar face on television and in congressional hearings, earning a reputation as one of the smartest – and quickest – voices in Washington.

In recent years, Frank occasionally found himself at odds with parts of the LGBTQ+ community over comments regarding transgender rights and political strategy. Just days before his death, he told CNN's Jake Tapper that Democrats should reconsider portions of their messaging around transgender issues, comments that sparked debate among activists and political observers alike.

Even so, tributes poured in from across the political spectrum following news of his passing. Fellow lawmakers, LGBTQ+ leaders, and longtime admirers remembered Frank as a groundbreaking public servant whose career helped reshape both American politics and LGBTQ+ representation.

Frank is survived by his husband, Jim Ready.

On Deck with Abi Liu

When one of her young swimmers confided “I’m bi” to Abi Liu, Head Coach of the Bellevue Club Swim Team, she didn’t miss a beat. “I was like, sure.” That ease is no accident. Liu, who didn’t come out herself until she was 38, has made it her mission to be the visible, welcoming presence she never had. “They’re 14, 15, 16,” she says. “I tell them, you are so brave. You are years ahead of me.”

A former Chinese national swim champ, World Cup winner, and at 50 one of the most respected club coaches in the country, Liu brings rare depth to the pool deck. She was one of the original athletes featured in USA Swimming’s inaugural LGBTQ Cultural Inclusion Resource Guide in 2016, and has quietly spent her career building a place where young LGBTQ+ swimmers feel safe.

“They’re very comfortable coming to me, talking about it, sharing their struggles...” she told Outword.

This month, Liu brought 11 Bellevue Club athletes to Sacramento’s TYR Pro Swim Series at the North Natomas Aquatic Center. There, the young squad competed alongside seasoned, international competitors.

“My goal is getting them comfortable racing the big kids, so-called,” she says. “It’s not just physicality – it’s psychological.” Being open has made her someone parents also seek out in vulnerable moments. When they are struggling with a child who has come out, her message is direct. “You have two choices. You either accept your kids and love them as they are, or you lose them.” Her own parents’ journey from rejection to acceptance – “delayed but not denied,” she says – informs every conversation.

Even as IOC Olympic restrictions around transgender athletes create ongoing challenges, Liu remains optimistic about swimming’s culture.

“In USA Swimming, we’re still very much celebrated,” she says. “But this conversation has to continue.”

At home in Washington, Liu and her wife KR – a Biden-appointed disability rights advocate, nationally recognized LGBTQ rights champion, and author working on her first book – are approaching their 11th anniversary. They married in Maui on 8/8/15 at 8:08, in Hawaii’s 808 area code, fully embracing the lucky Chinese number eight.

“I check every box,” she laughs. “Female, gay, Asian-American, immigrant – I look at those as my superpower.”

NorCal AIDS Cycle: Pedaling with Purpose

Around 90 participants, including 50 cyclists, took to our regional roadways May 14–17 for the 2026 NorCal AIDS Cycle (NCAC), Northern California’s largest HIV/AIDS fundraiser.

Riders departed Thursday from Beals Point in Folsom, heading north to a basecamp at the Yuba-Sutter Fairgrounds before the final leg Sunday. They covered more than 300 miles over four days and finished with a group ride to the West Steps of the California State Capitol at 1 p.m. By ride’s end, participants had battled 30mph winds and raised nearly \$210,000 for this year’s 13 beneficiary organizations, according to Scott

Doyle, NCAC Board Chairperson.

The recipient list reflected the wide reach of the HIV/AIDS crisis, ranging from UC Davis Children’s Hospital to Women’s Health Specialists of California. “For some of these groups, their doors wouldn’t be open if they didn’t receive allocated funds from us,” said Robbie Norris, a rider and former NCAC board member. The Sierra Foothills AIDS Foundation, for example, serves patients in

rural areas with limited access to doctors and HIV testing, making outside support essential to its survival.

Founded in 2005 by volunteers determined to keep HIV/AIDS services alive, NCAC has grown into a regional institution now in its twenty-first year. Since its founding, the organization has raised nearly \$5 million to support Sacramento Valley and Northern California nonprofits. Outward Magazine is among the event’s proud community co-sponsors.

Norris, 38, said he was diagnosed with HIV about ten years ago. It was a friend’s

enthusiasm for the ride that first drew him in, and before he even owned a bike, he signed up. This year marked his third time participating and he rode despite an injured finger. “I know 300 miles sounds like a lot,” he said, “but coming from somebody who didn’t bike, it’s very doable.” He credits NCAC’s structured training program, which gradually builds mileage, and the ride’s supported format, with rest stops every 25 miles, for making it accessible to newcomers of all abilities. “It’s a great community,” he added, “Everyone’s super accepting and very welcoming.”

Books for a Pre-Pride Celebration

You're all geared up. You've got your best parade-walking shoes, your coolest tee, your most-comfortable shorts, and a rainbow flag to carry. You're set for Pride, but before you go, try one of these great new books about LGBTQ life and history...

After the parade, where will you end up? A place to talk your experience over, to re-hash things for the next parade? Then you may need "The Lesbian Bar Chronicles: The Living History and Hopeful Future of America's Dyke Dives and Sapphic Spaces" by Rachel Karp (Beacon Press, \$29.95).

Lesbian bars, says Karp, are more than just places to drink. They're also places to find community, and to organize. For many, she says, they are "sanctuaries," as they have been for at least a century, and this book introduces you to some of the people who run the establishments, the things they do to support their patrons, and the hundred-year-plus bravery that it took to own, run, and enter a lesbian bar.

If you had to name a gay icon, there are probably quite a few who come to mind. So read "Without Prejudice: My Life as a Gay Judge" by Harvey Brownstone (ECW Press, \$21.95) and add another name to your list.

This memoir, written by Canada's first openly gay judge, takes readers from Brownstone's childhood to his life as a lawyer, then to his work within the justice system in Ontario, and beyond, to his current career. This is a surprising, informative book that gives you an idea what gay borders, then and now, but it also demands a

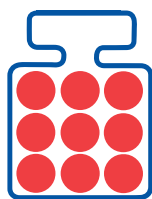
Pride is a celebration, an event, peek backwards, and in "The LGBTQ Queer Culture in American History" by Deborah G. Felder (Visible Ink Press, \$39.95), you'll get a wide look at the pioneers, allies, policy, and gay life over the course of the last five centuries. Want to know more about religion in the gay community? It's in here, along with celebrities, presidents, science, business, and more. This is the kind of book that settles bets. It's one you want to have in any room of your home because it's comprehensive and perfectly browse-able for all of its 600-plus pages.

And finally, here's a book to read and think about: "No Fats No Fems: A Guide to Queer Empathy and Unpacking Prejudice" by Max Hovey (HarperOne, \$19.99). How do you eliminate hateful, hurtful words, aimed at gay people - by gay people? What kind of stereotypes do we carry, unintentionally? This book takes those things out into the daylight by talking honestly and thoughtfully about them, as well as other issues. It's a book to have when doubts creep in, when you need a new way of thinking or a different direction, or when you just want something different to read.

And if these great books aren't enough, head to your favorite bookstore or library and ask for books that you can read before Pride or after. And Happy Pride!

The three-day event takes over the city June 5-7 with concerts, community events, marches, art, activism and plenty of high-energy fun centered around West Hollywood Park and Santa Monica Boulevard.

The weekend blends celebration with the city's long-standing LGBTQ+ advocacy roots. Visitors can expect the always-popular WeHo Pride Parade on Sunday, June 7, featuring colorful floats, marching groups, performers and celebrity guests along Santa Monica Boulevard. The parade remains one of Southern California's signature Pride events and is free to attend.

Music fans will have plenty to look forward to with the return of the [OUTLOUD Music Festival](#) at WeHo Pride. This year's lineup includes The Pussycat Dolls, Ava Max and JADE, with performances spread across the weekend at West Hollywood Park. A free Friday Night at OUTLOUD kickoff concert also returns, though advance RSVP tickets are required because of limited capacity.

Beyond the music, WeHo Pride offers a packed lineup of community-focused programming, including the free Street Fair, the Women's Freedom Festival, the annual Dyke March and the WeHo Pride Arts Festival. While Los Angeles has multiple Pride celebrations throughout June, [WeHo Pride](#) continues to stand out for its mix of activism and energy.

June 6 & 7 - Chico Pride

Pride season is heading north as Chico gears up for a week of community events, live entertainment, art, and celebration this June. From downtown festivities to late-night dance parties, there's something happening for nearly every age group and vibe.

The centerpiece of the celebration is the Chico Pride Downtown Festival on June 6 from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. at City Plaza. The free, all-ages event promises a lively afternoon filled with community organizations, entertainment, vendors, and plenty of Pride spirit in the heart of downtown Chico.

As the festival rolls into the afternoon, the celebration continues just steps away with the Plaza-Side Beer Garden Party at Allies Pub from 1 to 6 p.m. The all-ages gathering includes a \$3 cover for guests 18 and older and offers a relaxed space to cool off, socialize, and keep the party going.

Pride Drink & Draw (or Art) takes place June 10 at Argus, inviting guests to bring their own art supplies for a free evening of creativity and cocktails. On June 13, Roselle hosts a Drag Show & Dance Party, while Chico Chai House wraps up the festivities June 14 with an all-ages Craft Day and Friendship Bracelet gathering.

Stonewall National Monument is an Endangered Historic Place

The Stonewall National Monument has been named to the National Trust for Historic Preservation's 2026 list of America's 11 Most Endangered Historic Places, amid growing concerns that federal actions are erasing key parts of LGBTQ+ history.

Designated in 2016, Stonewall was the first U.S. national monument dedicated to LGBTQ+ history and remains the only unit of the National Park Service focused specifically on the LGBTQ+ rights movement. The site commemorates the 1969 Stonewall Uprising, widely recognized as a turning point in the modern fight for LGBTQ+ equality.

Advocates say recent federal actions threaten the monument's ability to tell the full story of the uprising. According to preservation groups, interpretive materials at the site were altered to remove references to transgender participants in the Stonewall rebellion, and the Pride flag was temporarily removed before being restored following legal action. Critics argue those changes undermine the monument's educational mission and diminish the contributions of transgender and queer Americans to U.S. history.

The designation comes as LGBTQ+ organizations continue pushing back against broader federal efforts they say censor

LGBTQ+ history and visibility. Those efforts include the removal of LGBTQ+ content from government websites, cuts to grant funding for LGBTQ+ projects, and the elimination of "T" and "Q" references from some official materials.

"This is about protecting the full and factual story of Stonewall," said Carol Quillen, president and CEO of the National Trust for Historic Preservation. "Today, bravery is again required to ensure the full story of the Stonewall Uprising is told at the National Monument, including the roles of transgender and gender-nonconforming people in the events of 1969."

Groups including the National Parks Conservation Association, the NYC LGBTQ Historic Sites Project, and Making Gay History say continued advocacy will be necessary as the monument approaches the 10th anniversary of its designation. Supporters argue that preserving Stonewall's full story is essential not only for New York, but for understanding LGBTQ+ history across the nation.

June 27-28 - SF Pride

San Francisco Pride returns June 27-28 with this year's theme, "Resistance in Action," bringing hundreds of thousands of people to the city's Civic Center and historic Market Street corridor.



The massive two-day festival transforms Civic Center into a colorful hub of music, community organizations, food, performances and activism. More than 20 community-run stages, hundreds of exhibitors and an endless sea of rainbow fashion help make San Francisco Pride one of the largest LGBTQ+ gatherings in the world.

The centerpiece, of course, is the legendary Pride Parade on Sunday, June 28. Beginning at Market and Embarcadero, the parade travels up Market Street toward Civic Center, featuring more than 250 contingents ranging from nonprofits and political groups to corporate allies, leather organizations, drag performers and local community groups.

Visitors can also expect a full week of surrounding events across the city, from dance parties and drag shows to the Trans March, Dyke March and nightlife celebrations stretching from the Castro to SoMa. 21st Century Disco Queens

From the late 1970s to the early part of this century, the finest female dance artists were almost all from the U.S., and I'm talking about Donna Summer, Martha Wash, Madonna, and then Lady Gaga. (Jamaica's great Grace Jones was the exception.)

Now, the opposite is true, and the women who are creating the best dance-pop music are almost all international, from Brits like Dua Lipa and Charlie XCX, to the three superb singers whose latest dance recordings I review below.



Robyn

Robyn – Sexistential

Like Zara Larsson, this 46-year-old disco queen hails from Sweden. (I don't know what's in their water, but Sweden produces some dynamite disco queens.) Robyn is the singer, songwriter, producer, and DJ known in the U.S. primarily for her massive dance hit from 2010, "Dancing On My Own," but her dance-pop props go back to at least 1995, when she had two Billboard Hot 100 singles, including "Show Me Love," while still in her teens.

Robyn's "Body Talk" trilogy of albums – which produced "Dancing On My Own" and other hits – is collectively one of the finest dance epics ever recorded, and now she is back (after an 8-year break) with highly anticipated new music. "Sexistential" is the title of her current, 9-song disc, and it was worth the long wait.

I would be hard-pressed to pick a favorite track from her new music, but the disc gets off to a trippy, hypnotic start with "Really Real" and then "Dopamine," the latter a perfect description of the addictive effect Robyn's music has on her fans. There are two or three songs I'm not totally crazy about on "Sexistential" (including that title track), but the singer comes back strong with the orgasmic, one-two punch of "Light Up" and "Into the Sun" at the end of the album.



Jessie Ware

Jessie Ware – Superbloom

This beautiful, 41-year-old dance-pop artist was born in London, and she coos and purrs her way through 12 groove-alicious tracks on "Superbloom" (plus one ballad) that cement her status as a peerless disco sex kitten. "I Could Get Used to This" gets the album off to a steamy start, and the hot song titles that follow say it all: "Sauna," "Ride," "Mon Amour," and "Mr Valentine." Ware's breathy, Marilyn Monroe-like vocals on those last two tracks are beyond sexy.

From her 2012 debut, with the pop music masterpiece "Devotion," through this, her sixth album, the singer has set the bar high and delivered time and time again. If you love Dua Lipa, then you are likely to enjoy the sultry-without-being-trashy tunes on "Superbloom." Ware sounds like a romantic, and when she declares, on track 10, "Don't you know who I am? I'm the love of your life," you believe her.




Kiesza

Kiesza – Dancing and Crying: Volume 3

This 37-year-old Canadian singer and multi-instrumentalist follows up her two previous efforts with a seven-song EP that is a triumphant return to the dancefloor. Kiesza likes to move in her videos – she can really dance – and so the celebratory single "When I'm Dancing" is the perfect track to set things in motion.

At the end of the EP, "Dancing and Crying: Volume 3" comes full circle with "Afterparty," a propulsive electro-pop number that finds Kiesza vocalizing wordlessly because, well, the music says it all. Not every lyric is a classic, but on cuts like "With You" and "Good Morning America" the singer finds a nice balance between brains and beats.

“Obsession” a Hit with Horror Fans Plus, Lovely Leo Woodall in “Tuner”

I didn't feel like driving all the way over to San Francisco for the critic's screening of the new “Star Wars” film, so I was unable to review it before our deadline, but I do plan to see it on the biggest screen in town, at the Esquire IMAX Theatre on K Street, where you can catch it through at least June 7.

In the meantime, here are four other new films that I was able to review recently.



Obsession

Horror fans are going ape for this 21st Century twist on “Fatal Attraction,” which follows a lovesick young man who learns the hard way to be careful what you wish for, because you just might get it.

Michael Johnston plays the awkward guy who cannot seem to confess his feelings to a female buddy, until he buys a “One Wish Willow,” a toy sold in a novelty shop that grants his wish for Nikki (Inde Navarrette) to love him more than anyone else. Boy, does she ever!

Johnston is good too, but Navarrette is sensational – one minute, sweet and submissive and the next, clingy and totally crazy. When Nikki starts harming herself physically, Bear (Johnston) realizes he has made a horrible mistake.

I wasn't crazy about the bummer ending, and Curry Barker's movie is more disturbing than entertaining. But for anyone who has ever obsessed over a lover (or had someone obsessed with them), this movie is a shocking reminder of how love can go horribly wrong. “Obsession” is currently in wide theatrical release.



Is God Is

This new film has been described as a violent, Southern Gothic revenge thriller, and that is a very apt description. “Is God Is” is an impressive debut feature for director Aleshea Harris, who based the movie on her own 2018 play.

The plot follows adult twin sisters who are tasked by their dying mother with killing a father they have never known, for burning and disfiguring them as children, along with their mother.

Obviously, this is difficult, disturbing subject matter, but it is also a compulsive watch, thanks to the writer/director's sympathy for her two main characters. The film also has a dynamite supporting cast that includes Vivica A. Fox as the mother and Sterling K. Brown as the devil of a dad, plus Janelle Monae, and the totally terrific Mallori Johnson and Kara Young, who play the twins.

This movie is not for the faint of heart, but for fans of challenging independent cinema, “Is God Is” is worth seeking out, if you can find a theater where it is still playing.



Tuner

Handsome Leo Woodall (“The White Lotus” Season Two) teams up with Dustin Hoffman for this suspenseful but uneven drama about a once-promising pianist (Woodall) who works with Hoffman's character as a piano tuner. The younger man suffers from hyperacusis, a condition that requires him to always wear ear protection against loud noises.

After he discovers an ability to crack safes due to his heightened hearing, Woodall's character falls in with a trio of thieves who steal valuables from wealthy homeowners, and he gets in way over his head.

Those break-ins are not very believable, for several reasons, but if you can overlook that plot hole, Woodall and Hoffman are terrific together, and Daniel Roher's movie is otherwise very well-made.

“Tuner” is scheduled to open at Sacramento's Tower Theatre, on May 29.



I Love Boosters

This wild, surreal satire is the second feature by Boots Riley, who previously directed 2018's equally bizarre “Sorry to Bother You,” which starred Tessa Thompson and LaKeith Stanfield. Mr. Stanfield returns as a handsome demon who falls for Keke Palmer's character, a scrappy shoplifter (or “booster”) who steals and resells high-end clothing in the Bay Area but dreams of designing her own fashions.

Palmer is wonderful here, as are Naomi Ackie and Tylour Paige, playing the other two women in the “Velvet Gang,” who are thorns in the side of Christie Smith, a rich-bitch fashion tycoon (hilariously played by Demi Moore).

The Velvet Gang steals from Smith's stores, and then Smith steals Palmer's designs. Moore's character vows to destroy the “low class, urban bitches” – her words, not mine – and it all comes to a head at an insane disaster of a fashion show.

I enjoyed “I Love Boosters” (despite its excesses) for its originality and its colorful, anti-corporate, anti-capitalist messaging. Both of Riley's films are their own unique creations. He doesn't make cookie-cutter movies, and I cannot wait to see what he does next. This film is currently in theatrical release only.

Federal Court Asked to Break Up Live Nation and Ticketmaster

California Attorney General Rob Bonta has joined a bipartisan coalition of 34 attorneys general in asking a federal court to break up Live Nation Entertainment and Ticketmaster, arguing the companies' merger created an illegal monopoly that has harmed artists, fans, venues, and competitors across the live entertainment industry.

The coalition filed a remedies proposal in the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of New York seeking an order that would force Live Nation to divest Ticketmaster. Attorneys general are also asking the court to require Live Nation to sell off major concert amphitheaters it owns and operates, saying the company used its control of venues to pressure artists into working with Live Nation promoters while shutting out rivals.

The filing follows a recent jury verdict that found Live Nation/Ticketmaster liable for anticompetitive conduct that harmed consumers and the live music industry. Jurors concluded Ticketmaster overcharged customers for tickets sold between May 2020 and 2024.

"A jury found Live Nation manipulated the market, hurt artists, fans, and businesses nationwide, all while getting richer — not because it is better, but because it acted illegally," Bonta said in a statement announcing the latest legal action. He added that strong structural remedies are needed to prevent the company from continuing practices that harm consumers and competition.

California joined the lawsuit in 2024 alongside the U.S. Department of Justice and a bipartisan coalition of attorneys general. The suit alleges Live Nation abused its dominance in ticketing and concert venues to maintain control over the industry through anticompetitive practices.

Although the Justice Department later announced a settlement with Live Nation, a bipartisan group of state attorneys general rejected the agreement, arguing it failed to go far enough to protect consumers and restore competition in the live entertainment marketplace.

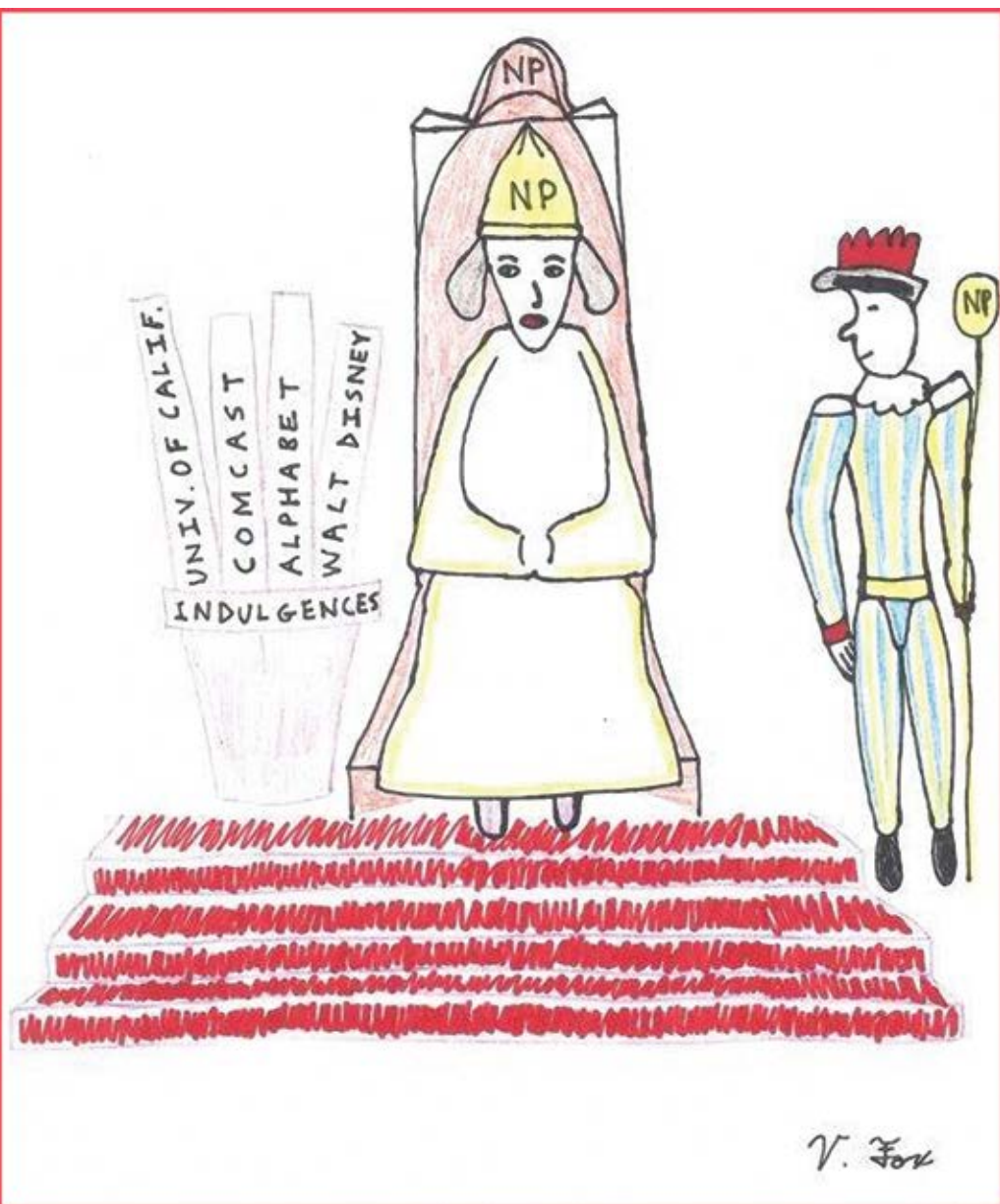

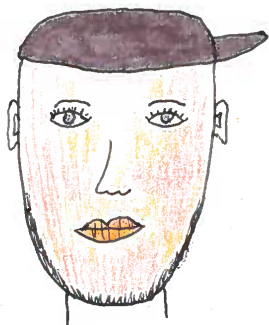
